Manchester Taoist Centre trustees have had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit when devising all activities. In line with the objective of the charity, Manchester Taoist Centre has promoted and delivered community classes, workshops and classes where the traditional Chinese performing arts of Lishi were taught for public benefit.

This year hasn't resulted in the "bounce back" the charity was hoping for. Recruitment has been lower than expected, and previous participants have not come back to live, in-person classes in the numbers expected. The government restrictions were largely lifted, in relation to groups of people participating in exercise classes, in July 2021.

Online classes have continued to be popular, and have been established as a robust alternative to normal delivery.

Manchester Taoist Centre has continued to seek grants and funds to supplement donations received from participants in order to provide a safe and quality learning environment for effective practice.

Manchester Taoist Centre has continued to invest in, develop, and improve strategies for attracting interest and participation in classes and courses run by the charity, using social media, email and banners outside venues.

Manchester Taoist Centre is extremely grateful to the volunteers who give their time and expertise free of charge.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

Manchester Taoist Centre has gratefully received donations from the public.

With the lifting of government restrictions on group indoor activities in July 2021, Manchester Taoist Centre has been able to continue with its core activities again.

New venues were arranged, as the old arrangements had expired. Relationships with new venues were established. Marketing activities were undertaken to help restart classes, courses and workshops. Previous beneficiaries were contacted to inform them of the restart dates and arrangements. There was some reticence on the part of some people overcoming all the fear people had experienced over the previous two years.

Early success stories were shared on social media and via email to raise the profile of the charity and to encourage people to return to classes.

Online classes continued to be popular for beneficiaries, and some even preferred this way of training and learning to live classes.

So this year has not seen the level of recovery that was hoped for, but things are steadily building in terms of participant numbers, and the charity hopes to continue this progress in the coming year..

Manchester Taoist Centre does not charge a membership fee. We do not want to exclude people from joining classes and benefiting from its activities. Manchester Taoist Centre encourages those people who can afford to make donations depending on the value they place on the work of the charity. In this way, we raised funds through the classes, workshops and courses run by Manchester Taoist Centre. The charity is grateful for the support of all its donors, and will also seek alternative funding streams from grant awarding bodies. All volunteers give their time for free and do not gain financially from the work they do.




