**Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year**

Actively fundraised throughout the year.  
 We received funding from the following:  
 The Friends of Bath Cats and Dogs home  
 Legacies  
 Supported 50 dogs in foster care at any time.  
 Spent £134,363.14 on veterinary treatment in this period.  
 In this period we took in a further 48 dogs and 1 cat. 35 dogs and 1 cat were rehomed. 8 became permanent sponsor dogs. 15 passed away. The rest being still available for adoption at that point.  
 Continued to seek volunteer help to continue our work – fosterers, homecheckers, transporters, rehoming co-ordination assistance, fostering co-ordination assistance.  
 Spread awareness of issues concerning dog welfare and our own organisation by use of social media, internet and attending events throughout the UK.  
 Continued to help other rescues to find homes for their dogs by producing information free of charge on our website.

We limit the number of dogs supported in foster homes based on funds available to us at any given time. This ensures there is a healthy reserve available to cover any potential costs incurred by the dogs in our care.
