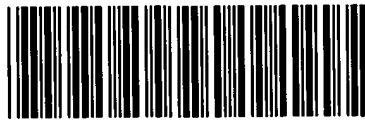

**REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES**  
**FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2025**

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The Trustees present their Annual Report and Financial Statements for the year ended 31 March 2025.

**Organisational structure**

Arise Church Ltd (formally known as Calvary Church (Kingswinford)) is a company limited by guarantee not having a share capital, operating under a Memorandum and Articles of Association. It was incorporated on 5 February 2007, company registration number 06083509. The company is also a registered charity, number 1119508.

**Governance and Management**

The board of directors (trustees) currently comprises 5 members. New directors (trustees) are appointed by the existing directors. A selection and recruitment process takes place when potential board members are selected after making careful enquiry as to their suitability and support of the objectives of the organisation. The trustee's objective is to have a broad range of skills represented, in particular - business & operational management, finance, and charity law.

The trustees meet bi-monthly. Decisions are taken by the board at meetings and formally recorded in minutes of meetings. The Senior Leadership Team (SLT), who have responsibility for the spiritual, pastoral and doctrinal oversight of the organisation, routinely meet with trustees to inform them of direction, vision and focus. The board has delegated authority to the SLT, within the terms of delegation approved by the trustees, for routine operational matters of the organisation.

**Objectives and activities**

The principle objects of the company are:

- to advance the Christian faith as a church in fellowship with Assemblies of God in Great Britain and in accordance with the Statement of Faith;
- to relieve sickness and financial hardship; and
- to advance education.

The trustees and elders follow a principle objective of the proclamation of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, and in addition provide a facility for people to meet to worship and praise God, to stand alongside people as they grow as individual Christians, and to encourage fellowship.

The church offers a safe and welcoming environment where people can come for help and support. By upholding righteous values and beliefs, it is the trustees' conviction that a positive impact into the community can be achieved for the good of all.

The main activities have been:

- Church meetings ranging from Sunday morning worship and communion services to gospel and evangelistic services, often with visiting speakers from a wide range of Christian organisations. In addition to that weddings, adult baptism and baby dedications take place. Our aim is to provide for the whole family.
- The work amongst the children and youth continued, focussing on evangelism through outreach initiatives and spiritual development.
- The building is also used by a number of groups during the week, who invite friends, family and the general public to their activities.

**Public Benefit**

The Trustees have considered this matter in conjunction with the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit, and have concluded that the aims continue to be charitable, that the aims and activities give identifiable benefits to the charitable sector, that the benefits are for the public and not unreasonably restricted in any way, and that there is no detriment or harm arising from the aims or activities.

#### **Achievements and performance**

This is the 9th year of Arise Church and the church continues to grow and impact the community year on year.

The main achievements for this year are:

1) We have taken strategic steps to increase our impact through the Shine Foundation which is the community action side of the church. We have regular connection with the local primary school and also the local hospital through which we give financially and practically to any needs that arise. Through connection with other organisations in our area we have also been able to respond to individual needs such as providing furniture and house decoration to a family that has moved into the area at short notice after fleeing domestic abuse. To increase our community impact through Shine Foundation and other ministries

2) In November 2024 we launched our second location of Arise Church in Stourbridge, West Midlands. This saw us meeting weekly on a Sunday afternoon. A team of around 30 people have committed to an initial 6 month period of support to help launch this location.

3) In May 2024 we began a feasibility study through APEC architects to ascertain the direction we need to take for the redevelopment of our Kingswinford building. Through the following 6 months we developed the plans alongside the architects to enable us to get initial costings for the project. The quotes we received were much higher than we were expecting for the benefits that project would give us. This meant that we took the decision to take a few steps back in order to develop plans that were both beneficial and financially viable. As we came to the end of the FY in March 2025 we are still in the consultation process with architects and other professionals in order to get us to the pre planning phase.

4) We have gone through a staffing restructure which has seen the introduction of 3 key roles within the staff structure. These roles will have responsibility for the oversight of the 3 strategic elements of the church of which all ministries and events come under. These 3 roles will also offer input and support to the Children's and Youth Departments. This restructure was introduced in January 2025.

#### **Financial review and reserves**

The total net surplus for the year amounted to £9,424 (2024: net surplus £5,982). The accumulated unrestricted general funds carried forward amount to £115,809 (2024: £119,024) and £271,051 (2024: £251,500) in the fixed assets fund. The restricted fund carried forward is £214,371 (2024: £221,283).

The vast majority of the finances required to fund the activities are raised through regular giving and one-off donations from church members, supplemented by the refund of income tax from HM Revenue & Customs through the Gift Aid scheme.

#### **Reserves policy**

The policy agreed by the trustees is to aim to hold in unrestricted reserves not committed or invested in tangible fixed assets (the 'free' reserves) sufficient to cover the general overhead expenses and salary costs not specifically funded by external agencies or able to be covered by other committed income such as rents, for a period of six months. At this level, the trustees feel that they would be able to continue the current activities of the charity in the event of a significant drop in funding. It would then be necessary to consider how the funding would be replaced or activities changed. At 31 March 2025 free reserves amount to £115,809 representing 3.9 months expenditure. The trustees are considering ways to increase funds available.

Restricted reserves are disclosed in note 12b.

#### **Future developments**

1) To establish and underpin the second location in Stourbridge to ensure long term viability.

2) To progress to the tender phase of the refresh project for the Kingswinford location.

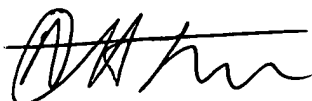
#### Trustees' responsibilities in relation to the financial statements

**INDEPENDENT EXAMINERS' REPORT  
TO THE  
MEMBERS OF ARISE CHURCH LTD**

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I report to the charity trustees on my examination of the accounts of the company for the year ended 31 March 2025 which are set out on pages 6 to 11.

**Responsibilities and basis of report**

As the charity trustees of the company (and also its directors for the purposes of company law) you are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the requirements of the Companies Act 2006.

Having satisfied myself that the accounts of the company are not required to be audited under Part 16 of the 2006 Act and are eligible for independent examination, I report in respect of my examination of your company's accounts as carried out under section 145 of the Charities Act 2011. In carrying out my examination I have followed the Directions given by the Charity Commission under section 145(5)(b) of the 2011 Act.

**Independent examiner's statement**

Since the company's gross income exceeded £250,000 your examiner must be a member of a body listed in section 145 of the 2011 Act. I confirm that I am qualified to undertake the examination because I am a member of Association Of Certified Chartered Accountants (ACCA), which is one of the listed bodies.

I have completed my examination. I confirm that no matters have come to my attention in connection with the examination giving me cause to believe that in any material respect:

1. accounting records were not kept in respect of the company as required by section 386 of the 2006 Act; or
2. the accounts do not accord with those records; or

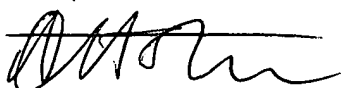

**1. Accounting Policies**

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities published on 16 July 2014, the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2015), and the Companies Act 2006.

**a) Accounting convention**

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention, and on a going concern basis.

**b) Income recognition**

Income is recognised in the period to which it relates. The value of services provided by volunteers has not been included on the basis that the value cannot reasonably be quantified.

**c) Expenditure**

Expenditure is accounted for as it becomes due and has been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

**d) Tangible fixed assets**

Tangible fixed assets are stated in the balance sheet at their acquisition cost less accumulated depreciation.

Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets with the exception of freehold land, to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each assets over its expected useful life as follows:

Freehold property	–	between 1% and 10% on reducing balance
Heating system	–	10% on reducing balance
Furniture and equipment	–	10% on reducing balance
Computer equipment	–	25% on reducing balance

**e) Taxation**

The activities of the company are exempt from corporation tax on the net incoming resources.

**f) Pension costs**

The company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable for the year are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which they relate.

**g) Funds**

Unrestricted funds are available to be used for purposes within the objects of the charity at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for specific restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. The restrictions are specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.
