In addition, the all-weather sports pitch which was constructed in the summer of 2010 required a replacement carpet which was completed during August 2021.



Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of the Tunbridge Wells Grammar School for Boys School Fund (the 'charity') for the year ended 31 August 2021, which comprise the Statement of Financial Activities, Balance Sheet, and Notes to the Financial Statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is United Kingdom Accounting Standards, comprising Charities SORP - FRS 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and applicable law (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

In our opinion the financial statements:
