- (iii) to advance in life and relieve the needs of young people through Islamic instruction by: (a) the provision of recreational and leisure time activities provided in the interest of social welfare designed to improve their conditions of life; and (b) providing support and activities which develop their skills, capacities and capabilities to enable them to participate in society as mature and responsible individuals.
- (iv) to advance the education of the public in the Islamic religion and language and the culture and heritage of Muslims in general; and,
- (v) to further any charitable purpose consistent with the teachings of Islam according to the laws of England and Wales

The Society serves the religious, social and cultural needs of the local Muslim population living and working in the Lewsey Farm and surrounding areas of Luton in Bedfordshire. The Society is responsible for the administration of Zakariya Masjid and now also the newly established Dunstable Masjid and Madresa-e-Furqaniah and works closely with other local organisations and faith groups for improvements to facilities and services in the community.
