We have had sessions of getting together to help people who were isolated to connect with other people in the community.

We have been encouraging our young people to go around in their neighbourhood to seek for elderly people who needed their lawn done and the reports we received were very encouraging.

We run sessions on household income to encourage family to budget and make sure they lived within their means and the sessions were well attended and we have received testimonies from people who are now debt free because of budget orthodoxy.

We have held sessions for young people and gave them sexual education teaching them to play safe and avoid STDs.

As a church we also shared the love of God with the neighbourhood by providing tea and coffees during cold weather.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES

The trustees are pleased to present their annual report together with the financial statements of the charity of the year ending 31st March 2022. The financial statements comply with the charities Act 2011, and Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) (effective 1 January 2015)

Trustees

The trustees named on page 2 have served throughout the year except Brian Niblock who resigned on the 3rd January 2023. Appointment of trustees is governed by Trust Deed of the Charity. The Board of Trustees is authorised to appoint new trustees to fill vacancies arising through resignation or death of existing trustee. New trustees undergo an orientation day to brief them on: their legal obligations under charity Law, the Charity Commission guidance on Public benefit, and inform them of the content of the governing document and decision-making processes, the business plan and recent financial performance of the charity.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

The governing document is the Declaration of Trust dated 14/11/2007

OBJECTS OF THE CHARITY

The object of the charity is the advancement of the Christian faith and the extension of the Kingdom of God and other charitable purposes such as to relieve poverty, sickness and financial hardship and to promote and preserve good health by the provision of funds, goods or services of any kind in such parts of the United Kingdom and other part of the world as the trustees from time to time may think fit to fulfil such other purposes which are exclusively charitable according to the law of England and Wales and are connected with the Charitable work of the charity.

To advance education in accordance with Christian principles by such means as the trustees may consider appropriate, including by means of establishing and operating any educational establishment or establishments in the United Kingdom and other parts of the world as the trustees from time to time think fit

ACHIEVEMENTs AND PERFORMANCE

Relief of Poverty

With the help of the Lottery Community Fund and a Geary Bakery in Leicester, we commenced a foodbank in January 2022 that is still ongoing. Every Sunday we distribute free bread to people in the community. The breads are donated every week by Geary's Bakery Leicester. We have distributed for some months free food with the help of the funds we received from the Lottery Funds

Educational

We started an after school homework Club help with the funds received from the Lottery Community Fund and it was a great success as we could see the users improve their grades at school.

Grant making Policy

We received a grant from the Lottery Community Funds of £9994 that was used to commence our foodbank and supply computer equipment for our after school classes.

Gift Aid, on offerings given by church members was received during the year for an amount of £8821

Grants were distributed to 3 churches in Tanzania, Uganda and India. These churches are known to us.

Reserve Policy

It is the policy of the trustees to maintain unrestricted funds, which are the free reserves of the charity, at a level sufficient to at least :

- a) Cover management, administration and support cost for three months (£3000) three thousand pounds.

Activities in the Year

The charity depends on offerings and gifts made by individuals of the church. Two gifts were made during this year

Risk Management

The trustees have identified and reviewed the major risks to which the charity is exposed and have established processes and control to mitigate those risks.

Trustees's responsibilities in relation to the accounts

Law applicable to charities in England and Wales require the trustees to prepare accounts for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the charity financial activities during the year and of its financial position at the end of the year.

In preparing these accounts, the trustees are required to

- Select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently.
- Make judgements and estimates that reasonable and prudent.
- State whether applicable accounting standards and statements of recommended practices have been followed subject to any departures disclosed and explained in the accounts: and
- Prepare the accounts on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume the charity will continue in business.

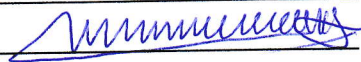

REPORT OF THE INDEPENDENT EXAMINER

I report on the accounts for the year ended 31st March 2022 which are set out on a separate sheet.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

As members of the Source of Life Church in Fellowship of Assemblies of God Charity you are responsible for the preparation of the accounts and you consider that an audit is not required for this year under section 144(2) of the charities Acts 2011 (the 2011 Act) and that an Independent examination is required.

- to follow the procedures laid down in the general Directions given by the charity Commission (under section 145(5)(b) of the charities Act, and

BASIS OF THE INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S STATEMENT

My examination was carried out in accordance with the general Directions given by the charity commission

An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records.
