

To promote the study of Islamic faith and culture. To advance religious education with the doctrines and practices of the Islamic faith by means of evening and weekend schools, classes, seminars and to advance the education of children in accordance with the Islamic faith. To alleviate the suffering caused by poverty of individuals of the Islamic faith anywhere in the world or individuals in any country of the world where the majority of the population are followers of the Islamic faith.

Summary of the main activities undertaken for the public benefit in relation to these objects (include within this section the statutory declaration that trustees have had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit)

Provides daily Islamic education classes for children. Children from within the community, aged 6-15years, are given afterschool classes in general Islamic education and in the Qur'an from Monday to Friday.

Provides Islamic education classes for women. Women from within the community of any age are given morning classes from Tuesday to Thursday for general Islamic education and in the Qur'an, where otherwise the opportunity to learn aspects about the Islamic faith are sparse.

Provides daily gatherings of learning, weekly lectures for men and monthly programmes for women. Men from around the area and from nearby areas have the opportunity to sit in daily gatherings from Monday to Friday, as well as weekly lectures given by scholars.

Runs numerous charity drives to support victims of natural disasters and war-torn countries around the world. Events, such as paintballing and mountain hiking, regularly take place to unite Muslims from the local community in getting together, trying to place an emphasis on engaging the youth, in order to raise money for worthy causes.

Charity drives, including efforts to hand in old computers, make boxes of food/clothing/blankets, give in old clothes and donate food parcels and money, were initiated to support victims of natural disasters such as floods in Pakistan and India and the earthquake in Afghanistan, amongst other causes.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

The Handsworth Wood Youth Forum continued to work in collaboration with the As-Suffa Outreach programme in helping to provide hot food and shelter for Birmingham's homeless population. Working from a unit in Birmingham City Centre, homeless people from the city - Muslims and non-Muslims alike - are invited to partake of hot meals every evening, as well as being able to stay overnight in the heated unit during the winter months, with clean and warm blankets and sleeping bags provided.

As a result of the pandemic, this collaboration between Anjumane Isha-Atul Islam and As-Suffa was extended to provide food parcels for those elderly, disabled, people who were shielding due to health conditions and people who could not afford basic essentials due to not being able to work and not receiving furlough support. People from the community donated foodstuffs and basic hygiene essentials which were then packed into parcels by volunteers who also distributed the parcels to those in need.

Our annual program was held for the local community, for both Muslims and non-Muslims alike, where lectures were given and dinner was served. This proved to be a resounding success, with many members of the community giving great feedback about how the event helped to bring different parts of the community together.

Regular fund raising activities took place, with activities including a Snowden climb and sponsored paintballing, raising thousands of pounds in charity to help disadvantaged people from famine- and war-torn areas of the world.
