Objectives and Activities.

CIO constitution objectives are:

- To improve animal welfare for the public benefit by providing free education on issues relating to resistance bacteria, hand hygiene and infection control
- To advance education for veterinary practices in good hygiene for the public benefits
- The charity is totally reliant on volunteers with no paid staff.

Achievement and performance

A new board has been appointed to facilitate and develop free education for vets and pet owners, such as leaflets in vet waiting rooms and digital campaigns on safe use of antibiotic and infection control. All education is related to antimicrobial resistance and the prevention of the spread of diseases between humans and animals.

Incoming And outgoing resources.

Incoming and outgoing resources from 1st May 2024 – 30th April 2025

- Owing to the low level of donations the charity received income of £2,725.00
- Expenditure totalled £2,10.00
- Mainly on website management and hosting leaving a balance of £715.27

Reserves

The charity does not believe it necessary to maintain anything apart from a small team of volunteers and currently there are no long-term projects that can't be funded by targeted sponsorship. All future projects will be underpinned by grant and sponsorship support.

Risks

Cash flow is always a risk as the charity relies on support from sponsors and receives little in donations.

Public Benefit

The trustees consider the activities listed comply with the charity commissions guidance on providing public health.

Plans for the future

The educational material for vets and the public are being developed to be more user friendly and up to date with research. In line with the charity new branding. We will continue to work with collaborators such as Royal College of Veterinary surgeons who recommend our resources to vets, and federation of European vets who share our information globally. The new education material allows veterinary professionals to improve hygiene in practice and helps public understand about antimicrobial resistance and preventing the spread of diseases between humans and animals. These leaflets and online materials will be promoted to our target audiences on a regular basis, and our volunteers will respond to inquiries through our website.

Potential corporate sponsors are being approached with a view to collaboration with new projects.

Incoming and Outgoing Resources

Owing to the low level of activity the charity received income of £230.58. Expenditure totalled just £901.52 which was mainly on website administration and hosting leaving us with a working balance of £11655.53

Reserves

The charity does not believe it necessary to maintain anything apart from a small operating reserve as currently there are no major long term projects that can't be funded by targeted sponsorship. As projects are set up in future they will be underpinned by grant income and sponsors so this is unlikely to change.

Risks

Identified in the previous year: The real risk to the charity is that the low level of activity will result in it becoming ignored. The Charity has reached out and begun to re-establish some of the links that contributed to its previous success and some new programs and collaborations are being discussed, so this is no longer seen as a major threat.

Cashflow is always a risk, however with few outgoings and developing relationships we see this as an opportunity.

PUBLIC BENEFIT

The trustees consider that the activity undertaken, albeit at a low level, comply with Charity Commission guidance on providing public benefit.

PLANS FOR THE FUTURE

The hygiene advice sheets (The Guidance sheets) are being completely overhauled with current scientific evidence and will be made more user friendly and all follow the new look and feel running through the whole charity and branding.

The hygiene practice audit APP remains functional and is being used more and is now ready for further modification and upgrade to make it even more useful.

We will continue work with RCVS, BSAVA and FECAVA to encourage the use of the Guidelines with possible adoption and translation by FECAVA.

To introduce a pro-active program to allow veterinary professionals to measure their effectiveness at cleaning and infection control.

They reflect the previous Objects.

As a result of the pandemic it has been difficult to achieve a significant level of activity. However we have taken the opportunity to review the website and set up a more simplified and clearer version. This has taken considerable effort because of all the work having to be done remotely.

The charity is entirely reliant on volunteers to undertake all activity. A very small core has continued to work to keep the charity running.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

Apart from setting up the new website and dealing with incoming queries there has been no opportunity to undertake other work. We have started to liaise with another charity (Editors for Impact) that is able to produce educational animated video and we have designed an initial film to educate on the most important hygiene process – hand washing.

Incoming and Outgoing Resources

Owing to the low level of activity the only income in the year was a small donation of £14.46. Expenditure totalled £389.31, mostly on governance and IT.

Reserves

The charity does not believe it necessary to maintain anything apart from a small operating reserve as currently there are no long term projects. As project are set up in future they will be underpinned by grant income and so this is unlikely to change.

Risks

The real risk to the charity is that the low level of activity will result in it becoming ignored. There has been some good PR after the year end and a much higher level of activity that we are satisfied will prevent this.

PUBLIC BENEFIT

The trustees consider that the activity undertaken, albeit at a low level, complies with Charity Commission guidance on providing public benefit.

PLANS FOR THE FUTURE

In addition to the aspiration to change the charity's governance structure to a CIO, the trustees will resurrect the relationship with the hygiene aspects of the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons' Practice Standards Scheme. The hygiene practice audit APP remains functional and is being used. The new website includes the provision of the hygiene advice sheets and we will work with RCVS Knowledge to encourage their use.

To ensure all the material is current and accurate the website material will be reviewed. Once complete the website will be more easy to navigate and the content will be more user-friendly.

We will also finish the hand hygiene video and consider what other public-facing short films might be made using our existing contacts. We consider that the current pandemic will continue to highlight the importance of hygiene and we believe we can build on that to improve hygiene with regard to pets.
