Mothers' Vision (MV)

All of the children at Mothers' Vision are now sponsored. Money was sent out for the whole year for food, basic essentials and education. Damaris the manager has now left and a social worker Hellen has taken her place. We thank Damaris for all her faithfulness and hard work over many years.

The children are all well and improving at school. The Christmas party was a great success at the local hotel, swimming, games and of course food followed by ice-cream. Yummy!!!

BBK has provided enough money to feed the widows and poorest people three times during this year. Hannah (team leader at MV) and her team buys and distributes food and essentials to two villages, Barani and Pentagon. Each food parcel worth £17 was sponsored by Acorn Project. Amini has also given out food to approximately 100 families. BBK also gave money to Lucy to feed the street children four time in 2025.

The new JHM home is perfect for the 26 children living there. This modern accommodation within its half-acre of land brings security and comfort to children who have no parents or have one parent who is very poor or sick. I am delighted to say all the children are well. Ten children have now completed their last year of secondary school and will be thinking of their futures in 2025.

Sadly, their results were disappointing Thomas passed for university, 2 children will resit the final exam again in July and the other children may go on to do college courses.

The land is producing crops and fruit trees which provide produce for themselves and for sale.

JHM is situated in a very poor area and three families desperately needed help. BBK is providing school fees, food and school uniforms for six extra children and a wheelchair for a father who has lost his legs due to diabetes .

Barani Primary School (BPS)

Betty has been an enormous help to the children at her school in Barani Village. BBK has sent her sufficient money to buy school uniforms for over 200 poor children. The children receive instant dignity for looking very smart. Food, clothes, underwear, shoes, toothpaste and brushes, soap, school equipment and fees have been paid for the poorest children. Caroline orders reuseable Sanitary wear from a company in Kenya who delivers them to Betty's home. Parcels are then given to the children with underwear and soap Using a video link Betty teaches the children how to use the reuseable towels. BBK hopes to provide more sanitary parcels for the school and encourage the production of sanitary wear in the future.

Rent is paid for two extremely poor families and many individual children are provided with food and clothes when needed.

Betty has also organised medical care for those who cannot afford to pay for their treatment in her village.



It is a pleasure to present the Annual Report of the trustees to the supporters of our charity at the end of the financial year. I am pleased to say God has provided for all our needs again and BBK have enough funds for at least one more year. Our accounts have been positively examined and show a healthy balance (see examiners sheet).

With Margaret Hall retiring as Treasurer BBK tried unsuccessfully to find a new treasurer, so BBK decided to make the post easier by sending out money only once a year to Mothers' Vision (MV) and Jesus Healing Ministry (JHM). Therefore £20,000 each was sent out to JHM and MV in May 2023. This reduced the work load considerably. In February 2024 the exchange rate went up considerably and was starting to fall so the trustees decided to send out another large sum of money so the centres would benefit before it went down any further. £20,000 was sent to Mothers' Vision and £20,000 to Jesus Healing Ministry. This should last them over 20 months with the remaining money they had from May 2024.

In October the trustees changed titles so I could move over into the treasurer's seat. Margaret Hall became secretary, Rose Elloitt chairperson.

We thank Caroline Warren for initiating and continuing the Global Giving <https://goto.gg/53201> which enables her and her family to fundraise in Singapore and all around the world. We thank her also for the up keep of the web-site and overseeing the Barani Primary School and Village Project.

The last visit to Kenya was in March /April 2023. Four adults, Maureen and Jim Nevitt, Caroline and Antony Warren with their children Alice and Matilda. The trustees received a report from the trip and a number of decisions were made. The Gates of Joy is now totally self-sufficient so it was decided to give them a lump sum of £6000 as a nest egg and say our fond farewells.

Within the money sent to MV was £3000 to feed the village 3 times in the next year at £500 for each village, Barani and Pentagon. We would like to thank Acorn Project for their continual support of £2000 towards this cost. BBK give out food parcels to the most vulnerable people in the village. Approximately 65 families receive £17.50 worth of food. Barani village has also received funds to provide, school fees for 8 very poor children, school uniforms, clothes, sanitary wear, mattresses, emergency medical needs and the rent for two families.

We would like to thank the Rotary, Soul Kitchen (Bethany City Church) and all our sponsors for their continual support, it is gratefully received. The charity would not exist without all our volunteers and I thank each and every person who dedicates their time and energy to raise funds to provide for those who need our help in Kenya. Annual Report of the Trustees 2022-2023

Chair's Report

It is a pleasure to present the Annual Report of the trustees to the supporters of our charity at the end of the financial year. Our accounts have been positively examined and show a healthy balance.

It is with great sadness that I report the passing away of our leader at Mothers' Vision, Susan Ngigi. We will all miss her passion and dedication to God's work at the Centre. Damaris, manager and the trustees are continuing this vital work.

The shop is closed on Tuesdays and Sundays but is still our main source of income. Mr K O'Brien kindly allowed us to use two of his empty shops for 3 months to store our excess goods.. We have been able to fundraise this year with table top sales, a fashion show and the Black Tie Event which have all been very enjoyable and successful.

We thank Caroline Warren for initiating and continuing the Global Giving <https://goto.gg/53201> which enables her to fundraise in Singapore and all around the world. We thank her also for the up keep of the web-site, Christmas cards, Gift in Kind and her gifts which provided flip flops, toothpaste and toothbrushes, soap, renewable sanitary wear for over 50 girls along with over 200 pairs of underwear at Barani Primary School.

We have continued to help the village children with school uniforms, giving out over 300 uniforms this year. 100 being provided by Emily Rowbottom who did her Silver Duke of Edinburgh Award with BBK.

With the help of Acorn Project, who we would like to thank for their continual support, we have given out food parcels to the most vulnerable people in the village on three occasions, 65 families each time were given £17.50 worth of food. This has helped the three villages along with the school uniforms, clothes, mattresses, emergency medical needs and rent.

The trustees have been able to visit Kenya twice this year and on both occasions have been glad to see the children doing so well. A number of options needs discussing at the next meeting on how BBK moves forward in God's will. One being The Gates of Joy which are now totally self-sufficient.

We would like to thank the Rotary for their continual support, it is gratefully received. The charity would not exist without all our volunteers and I thank each and every person who dedicates his/her time and energy to raise funds to provide for those who need our help in Kenya.

I personally would like to thank Margaret Hall our treasurer for all the hours of hard work she dedicates to the charity. To Maureen Holland, Moira Walker, Margaret Neatham and Rose Elloitt for their commitment and dedication as trustees.

This year BBK has managed to look after 70 children in our Centres with accommodation, food, clothes, medical assistance, education and friendship. The charity has been able to spread its wings and establish a close relationship with the villages providing, food parcels, school uniforms, a water well and medical support. Please see the 'Report of Achievements' for a more detailed account of the work of BBK. Our God has guided us through this last year with such rewarding results. We are His hands, BBK is His Charity. Thank you God for being in charge.

BBK has decided to include this following information into this report after the trip to Kenya and the resignation of the treasurer Margaret Hall.

The Trustees met on 24th April 2023 to discuss the future as Margaret Hall decided she was standing down as treasurer. She has given many years of devoted service to BBK but at 80years old believes it is time to pass this difficult job over to someone else.

At the moment we are looking for a new treasurer.

I read out the report from the Kenya Trip which had been enlightening. These suggestions were made and agreed so that the Charity could continue.

Now that the Gates of Joy were self-sufficient we will send them £6000 and say good bye to them. A letter was sent to Mr Tuva explaining BBK's position that BBK no longer needed to support them as they are now able to support themselves.

Caroline Warren has £700 and this will be used for Barani Village children and Mama Margaret over the coming year..

BBK will no longer support the clinics and hospital.

BBK therefore would only be sending money once a year to Mothers' Vision and Jesus Healing Ministry.

This will reduce the work of the treasurer and would encourage someone to join the BBK team as treasurer. If not then BBK needs to seek an alternative solution if the charity is to continue.

Finances

£6000 will be sent to The Gates of Joy.

£20,000 will be sent to Mothers' Vision to feed the two villages three times in the coming year and for the children's, education, food and clothes.

£20,000 will be sent to Jesus Healing Ministry to build shops and to cover the children's education, food and clothes.

This will leave only enough money to cover the running costs of the charity for one year.

The shop will continue and the money banked. After one year the charity will decide how the money raised in that year will be spent, thinking of the children first.

Report of Achievements 2022 -2023

Gates of Joy – Kilifi

BBK continues to support the Gates of Joy with food, medical treatment and education. The land is producing crops and pastures for the livestock. Rearing chickens is their new project with the hope of feeding themselves and the poor in the neighbouring village.

A sewing machine was bought for Mercy as she expressed an interest in becoming a seamstress. All children are doing well.

Mothers' Vision

Most of the children at Mothers' Vision are now sponsored. Money is sent out on a regular basis for food, basic essentials and education.. Damaris the manager is looking after the children at the centre and the poorest people in the villages. BBK has sent her enough money to feed the widows and poorest people this year. She buys and distributes food and essentials to two villages.

Barbed wire was used at MV on the perimeter walls for added security.

BBK helped towards paying Susan Ngigi's medical expenses

The classrooms are on hold due to government policies on orphanages in Kenya.

The trustees decided to sponsor Jumaa over the next three years at university. A total of £939, per year depending on exchange rate.



Jesus Healing Ministry (JHM)

The new JHM home is perfect for the 22 children living there. This modern accommodation within its half acre of land brings security and comfort to children who have no parents or have one parent who is very poor or sick. All children are doing well.

The land is producing crops and fruit trees for sale and for themselves.

Security lights are now in place.



Barani Primary School (BPS)

Betty has been an enormous help to the children at her school in Barani Village. BBK has sent her sufficient money to buy school uniforms for over 300 poor children. The children receive instant dignity for looking very smart. Food, school equipment and fees have been paid for the poorest of children. Exam fees were paid for 50 children who couldn't afford to sit their exams.



Gladys has had her hospital treatment and is doing well .



Betty has also organised medical care for those who couldn't pay for their treatment. They have clothed the poor, bought mattresses, shoes and toiletries for those in desperate need. Damaris and her team have also helped the needy in Pentagon Village with rent, food, clothes and medical assistance.

University Students

BBK has two university student, Moses from JHM who is working hard for his degree. George at JHM is doing a 2 year course to become an Electrician and Hatson is in his second year doing a BA degree in Education at St. Paul's University.

Annual Report of the Trustees 2020-2021

Chair's Report

The Annual Report of the trustees to the supporters of our charity at the end of the financial year.

Sadly on the 21st March the shop had to close because of the Corona Virus. This was very hard to do as the shop is our main source of income. However, the lives of our volunteers and families are more important. We did have enough money in reserve to feed the children in Kenya over the next 12 weeks but then the funds would have been very low indeed. We trust in God for all things including the money we need for the future to continue His work. Thy will be done God not ours.

The new building, JHM orphanage, 'The Power House' continued to completion and the children moved in on 1st April 2020. It was disappointing that no one from BBK could be there to enjoy the moment it opened but all trips had to be cancelled because of the pandemic. After the children had moved into the house an additional separate two bedroom building was built for the boys, solar panels were installed and water from the mains was connected.

Three of our older children qualified to be teachers and moved away to start new teaching jobs.

The schools in Kenya closed in lockdown for only a few months so education continued for most of our children.

The lockdown did cause serious problems for the three poor villages which we support so BBK decided to increase our food parcels from three times a year to six times.

BBK was unable to predict how long the lockdown would last and therefore restricted spending to basic essentials after the new building was completed.

We had to cancel The Fashion Show, The 1950's Tea Party, all Presentations and Stalls. The only fundraisers were the Online Auction, Gift in Kind and the 71mile Sponsored Walk.

With the shop closed donations were becoming a problem. Keith O'Brien was asked if he had any free storage space BBK could use, after consideration we were allowed to use 156b Front St. at no extra cost. Goods had to be stored for 72hours before sorting so this was extremely beneficial.

During the year when the shop has been opened BBK has managed to increase the funds. The council through a government grant scheme has helped BBK enormously through this difficult time with financial aid. Individuals also have generously donated to the work of BBK.

I am pleased to say the charity has survived this bad year and on 12th April 2021 the shop is due to reopen.

Thank you God for your faithfulness in providing all our needs.

The charity would like to thank Sheila Beale and family for the David Beale memorial fund, Acorn Project, Rotary, Caroline Warren, all our sponsors and volunteers for your generous support.

I personally would like to thank Margaret Hall our treasurer for all the extra hard work she has done during the building of the new orphanage JHM, her dedication and her constant daily upkeep of the accounts. To Maureen Holland and Moira Walker for all their commitment and dedication as trustees over many years.

Gates of Joy – Kilifi

BBK continues to support the Gates of Joy with food, medical treatments and education. Money is sent to Mr Tuva on a regular basis and receipts received.

The polytunnel has been damaged and new covering is needed to replace it. They have 25 goats, 25 sheep, 3 cows, many chickens and ducks. The fruit trees and crops are doing well and BBK is very proud of the way Mr Tuva and his team are running the centre to become self sufficient.

Sadly a water well was not possible after reseach proved insufficient water at 200 meters. Money raised would now be spent on buying mains water.

BBK intend to provide the centre with a Tuk Tuk vehicle so they can have transport to Kilifi Town.

Sadly this year Susan has been very ill and is still needing medical attention but her team has continued the work.. The Gift in Kind fundraiser was very successful and allowed BBK to purchase 43 uniforms for the poorest children at Barani School and can continue to purchase another 40 in the coming year.


