Other – New Centre		<p>In 2015 the Centre was granted planning permission to build a new centre.</p> <p>Phase 1 was completed in 2018 which was to build a pontoon to give easy access to the water for all, especially those with disabilities.</p> <p>Phase 2 was to build a compound by the pontoon for the storage of our boats and equipment. This is currently provided by way of temporary containers/cabins.</p> <p>Phase 3 was to complete the new build but this was interrupted by a larger development planned by the local authority.</p> <p>The local elections of 4th May 2023 saw changes to the make-up of the LA and the planned developments are still pending.</p>

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


