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**STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT**

**Governing document**

Holloway Hall Community Association is governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association dated 24 September 2007, a deed of trust, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006. It is registered as a charity with the Charity Commission.

**Risk management**

The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error.

**OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES, ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE**

**Object of the Charity and Public Benefit Statement:**

The objects for which Holloway Hall Community Association is established are to:

- To foster a good fellowship and good citizenship among all residents on the Ley Hill estate
- To provide for members, facilities for physical and mental training and recreation and social moral and intellectual development to promote the happiness and well-being of all children resident on the estate and foster a community spirit for the achievement of these and other charitable purposes
- To maintain and manage the room within the hall for activities promoted by members in furtherance of all of the above objects.

The trustees have referred to the guidance from the charities commission on 'Charities and Public Benefit'. The trustees are confident that Holloway Hall's aims and objects outlined above are in accordance with the regulations on public benefit. The detail of activities that support these aims and objectives is provided in the next section of the report.

**Review of Activities Achievements and Performance**

HHCA are a registered Charity run by trustees and under UK Law we operate the hall as a separate "Ltd company under guarantee" and as such are registered with Companies House.

The aims of the Charity, in summary, are:

To provide, through the hall and its employees, a resource and service to the hall members of the local community, voluntary groups, and other organisations.

To maintain the hall to a high standard.

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**Trustees**

The purpose of the HHCA Trustees is to carry out the aims of the Charity and ensure that the hall is managed in such a manner that it is financially solvent, and follows the rules required by the Charity Commission and defined by the Trustees. To ensure, through the management board of the hall, that the physical fabric of the hall, the Hall user meetings, and its employees; are a proactive resource and service to the local community, voluntary, and other organisations.

The trustees met many times over the year to ensure the smooth running and maintenance of the hall, plus liaising with other groups

The hall users are in continuous contact with the hall manager to discuss any concerns or issues.

All repeat hires and the local community groups are encouraged to attend the Annual General Meeting and it is in our best interest to attend and influence the management committee.

**What's happened in 2022**

The year 2022 has brought significant improvements in health and well-being of the association compared to the challenging year 2021, which was marked by the aftermath of the COVID-19 pandemic. Most groups have successfully returned to normal and resumed their activities. However, we also acknowledge the loss and hardship faced by some groups who could not survive the disruption. We have committed to providing support and resources to those groups, as well as to fostering new and emerging groups in our community.

**Repairs and maintenance**

According to the financial records, the expenses have decreased considerably throughout the year. There have been no major demands for repairs. The costs of maintenance and redecoration have also been lowered because of the work done in the previous year.

**Community Groups and Events 2022**

One of the goals of the association is to collaborate with other groups in the Bartley Green Ward and nearby areas that share our vision and mission. This way, the association can help the local community with their needs as much as the trust allows. Another benefit of these partnerships is that the HHCA and its services get more exposure and recognition. These organisations include:

- Birmingham City Council
- Local Councillors
- Local Primary and Secondary Schools
- Community centres and groups within the ward
- Several organisations that are involved in providing and maintaining public amenities and resources, such as Library Services, Parks Department and Housing Associations.

We also appreciate the support and guidance of our Hall Manager and Trustees, who oversee the operations and finances of the hall.

**User Groups**

As previously stated, most of our long-term user groups have resumed their regular use of the hall. The hall hosts a variety of groups that offer different activities for the community. Some of these activities are Karate, Zumba, war gaming, and faith-based groups. These activities cater to the diverse interests and needs of the community members. This year, we have also added some new groups to our hall:

- Slimming World
- Caring for carers
- Wellies in the woods

The hall continues to remain open for private bookings on weekends, such as birthday parties, baby showers and other life celebrations and events.

**Financial Summary**



**Basis of the independent examiner's report**





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#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

##### Accounting convention

##### Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015) and the Companies Act 2006.

The charity constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS 102.

The trustees have considered whether in applying the accounting policies required by FRS 102 and the Charities SORP FRS 102 the restatement of comparative items was required.

They have determined that no such statement is required and there has been no change to the accounting policies since last year. The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the company. Monetary amounts in these financial statements are rounded to the nearest £.

##### Income and endowments

Income is recognised when the charity has entitlement to the funds, any performance conditions attached to the item(s) of income have been met, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Income from government and other grants, whether 'capital' grants or 'revenue' grants, is recognised when the charity has entitlement to the funds, any performance conditions attached to the grants have been met, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably and is not deferred.

##### Interest receivable

Interest on funds held on deposit is included when receivable and the amount can be measured reliably by the charity; this is normally upon notification of the interest paid or payable by the Bank.

##### Expenditure

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

##### Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Fixtures and fittings	- 15% on reducing balance
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##### Taxation

The charity is an exempt charity within the meaning of schedule 3 of the Charities Act 2011 and is considered to pass the tests set out in Paragraph 1 Schedule 6 Finance Act 2010 and therefore it meets the definition of a charitable company for UK corporation tax purposes.

Planning did commence for VE Day celebrations, which involve many different organisation, however this had to cease due to further Government restrictions due to Co-vid.

No major repairs was required, however during lockdown it was decided the opportunity would be taken to continue with outstanding maintenance and redecorating and make the closures have a Positive outcome. The main/small rooms, hallway, exterior walls and toilets where repainted. The uneven slabs around the building where re-laid and made safe. The building was made Co-vid secure with additional signage, risk assessments, hand sanitizer's and hand dispensers placed in the toilets.





### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Accounting convention

#### Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015) and the Companies Act 2006.

The charity constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS 102.

The trustees have considered whether in applying the accounting policies required by FRS 102 and the Charities SORP FRS 102 the restatement of comparative items was required.

They have determined that no such statement is required and there has been no change to the accounting policies since last year. The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the company. Monetary amounts in these financial statements are rounded to the nearest £.

#### Income and endowments

Income is recognised when the charity has entitlement to the funds, any performance conditions attached to the item(s) of income have been met, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Income from government and other grants, whether 'capital' grants or 'revenue' grants, is recognised when the charity has entitlement to the funds, any performance conditions attached to the grants have been met, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably and is not deferred.

#### Interest receivable

Interest on funds held on deposit is included when receivable and the amount can be measured reliably by the charity; this is normally upon notification of the interest paid or payable by the Bank.

#### Expenditure

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

#### Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Fixtures and fittings

- 15% on reducing balance

#### Taxation

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**Trustees**

The purpose of the HHCA Trustees is to carry out the aims of the Charity and ensure that the hall is managed in such a manner that it is financially solvent, and follows the rules required by the Charity Commission and defined by the Trustees. To ensure, through the management board of the hall, the Hall user meetings, and its employees; a proactive resource and service to the local community, voluntary, and other organisations.

The trustees met many times over the year to ensure the smooth running and maintenance of the hall, plus liaising with other groups

The hall users are in continuous contact with the hall manager to discuss any concerns or issues.

All repeat hires and the local community groups are encouraged to attend the Annual General Meeting and it is in our best interest to attend and influence the management committee.

**What's happened in 2020**

**Community Groups and Events 2020**

The first 3 months of 2020 started off very positive with all groups returning and new ones starting. Planning was underway to organise a VE Day celebrations, which involved many different agencies working together. But sadly, on March 21st we had no option but to close Holloway Hall due to the coronavirus, all groups, private bookings and celebrations were cancelled.

We decided to make the closure a positive one by completing all outstanding repair work on the building, when restrictions allowed us too, work carried out:

- Main room, small room, toilets, and entrance ways all redecorated.
- All uneven slabs around the building were re laid to prevent trip hazards
- The outside of the building was repainted
- The outside wall was repointed, and the main front wall was also repaired
- General repairs and maintenance were also completed.
- The building was also made covid secure with, addition signage, risk assessments, hand sanitizer points, hand towel dispensers placed in the toilets.

We did reopen in August for a few weeks for those groups who were able to follow government guidelines and restrictions. At the start of November, we had to completely close the building again.

It was a very testing and worrying period time, not just for the whole but for the community, we stayed in contact with our user groups offering advice, reassurance, and support. In December King Edwards School Five Ways kindly donated a very large supply of food items, which we were able to distribute to many of older and vulnerable members of the community





### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Accounting convention

#### Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015) and the Companies Act 2006.

The charity constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS 102.

The trustees have considered whether in applying the accounting policies required by FRS 102 and the Charities SORP FRS 102 the restatement of comparative items was required.

They have determined that no such statement is required and there has been no change to the accounting policies since last year. The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the company. Monetary amounts in these financial statements are rounded to the nearest £.

#### Income and endowments

Income is recognised when the charity has entitlement to the funds, any performance conditions attached to the item(s) of income have been met, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Income from government and other grants, whether 'capital' grants or 'revenue' grants, is recognised when the charity has entitlement to the funds, any performance conditions attached to the grants have been met, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably and is not deferred.

#### Interest receivable

Interest on funds held on deposit is included when receivable and the amount can be measured reliably by the charity; this is normally upon notification of the interest paid or payable by the Bank.

#### Expenditure

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

#### Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Fixtures and fittings

- 15% on reducing balance

#### Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on income and gains falling within section 505 of the Taxes Act 1988 or section 256 of the Taxation of Chargeable Gains Act 1992 to the extent that these are applied to its charitable objects.
