Noreen's Kids exists to raise funds in the U.K. which are transferred to help fund the activities of a Romanian registered charity "Fundatia Cuvioasa Paraschiva" (The foundation of St Paraschiva) – FCP. The money raised in the U.K. helps to pay some of the running costs of this charity, which is entirely staffed by Romanian personnel except for the director, Noreen O’Gorman, a retired district nurse from the UK.

FCP

- 1) We visit families in a wide area around Slobozia providing support for families caring for sick children and young adults in their own homes often living in conditions of considerable poverty.

The support given depends on their needs – everything from supplementing food and Winter fuel (wood usually) to providing nursing care, sometimes involving help with domiciliary palliative care.

Most importantly we provide advice and advocacy to make sure these very vulnerable families are getting the grants and support to which they are entitled from the Romanian government. We also facilitate access to appropriate medical care from the Romanian health services when this is needed and often help with transport to medical appointments. We arrange for children to attend a holiday camp organised by FCP.

Additional details of objectives and activities (Optional information)

We continue to encourage local Romanian involvement in the work of the charity. Local schools donate shoe boxes with Christmas presents for poor families.

We are well supported by the Orthodox church which regularly make donations in kind of food etc.

We owe a huge debt of gratitude to Noreen's Kids loyal supporters and volunteers in the UK, without whose fundraising activities none of FCP's work would be possible.

FCP relies on funding from the UK , but it is not the only source of income which has also been supported , by funds from Ireland through Caring Hearts and Hands – a charity based in Eire. and from an American Charity from whom FCP received a considerable grant. We also get help from LDS church who have supported some of our projects for which we are very grateful.

Noreen's Kids regularly transfers funds for the operations of FCP and receives detailed income and expenditure reports from FCP. Funds are provided only for activities which comply with the aims and objectives of Noreen's Kids.

FCP has help from local teenagers in running the Summer camps. Previous carers of our residential children continue to visit "our" children and young adults on a voluntary basis in their new local government run homes, where they are making good progress.

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

We continue to visit regularly over 50 vulnerable families in the area around Slobozia and throughout Ialomita county. We also visit many families when they contact us providing help and support depending on their needs. We have been working in this area for over 25 years and these families have often been in contact during previous crises . There are a large number of families who rely on us to a greater or lesser extent .

The help varies but we have helped with medical problems by simple nursing and signposting to appropriate help. We help organise transport which can be a real issue for poor families in remote villages.

We have often helped improve housing - everything from helping a young family's father rebuild his house after a fire to installing a new stove in houses with no other means of cooking or heating.

As part of our advocacy work, we help ensure all the families we visit are receiving the financial help from government sources to which they are entitled .

This year has seen the running of FCP increasingly in the hands of the Romanian staff, they are now making the decisions about the future for the charity and this will help ensure the longevity of the vital work FCP does.

FCP has 2 elements

- 1) We cared for around 10 severely disabled children and young adults in a residential setting providing pretty much one to one care for many of the most disabled children.
- 2) We visit families in a wide area around Slobozia providing support for families caring for sick children and young adults in their own homes often living in conditions of considerable poverty.

The support given depends on their needs – everything from supplementing food and Winter fuel (wood usually) to providing nursing care, sometimes involving help with domiciliary palliative care.

Most importantly we provide advice and advocacy to make sure these very vulnerable families are getting the grants and support to which they are entitled from the Romanian government. We also facilitate access to appropriate medical care from the Romanian health services when this is needed and often help with transport to medical appointments

We continue to encourage local Romanian involvement in the work of the charity. Local schools donate shoe boxes with Christmas presents for poor families.

We are well supported by the Orthodox church which regularly make donations in kind of food etc.

We owe a huge debt of gratitude to Noreen's Kids loyal supporters and volunteers in the UK, without whose fundraising activities none of FCP's work would be possible.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

It became clear during the year:

- 1) That the unit in which the residential children were housed would not in the long term be available to us.
- 2) In order to comply with Romanian law, we needed to provide separate accommodation for the children once they became adults, if we were to continue to care for them.

A decision was made to transfer the children into purpose-built facilities run by the Romanian authorities, but we would continue to provide staff to help with the care of the children during a transition period and would continue to visit them on a regular basis.

The transfer took place in August of 2023 and our staff are still helping with their care.

We continue to monitor their progress and have been impressed with how well they are doing.

In the meantime, we have increasingly focussed on the community project, which is continuing to provide regular support to large numbers of families who are caring for chronically sick children and young adults in their own homes in a wide area of Ialomita Calarasi and Braiele counties. Increasingly the management of this project is being transferred to Romanian staff in line with the charity's policy to maintain the long-term viability of the vital work that they do.

The work has involved regular visits to vulnerable families, providing extra fuel during Winter months where necessary and sometimes extra food throughout the year, helping to improve housing to relieve the dreadful conditions in which some of the families live, providing medical advice and care, helping with transport particularly to hospital appointments – many sick children default from follow-up care because of the difficulty in getting to the appointments.

Above all we are an advocate for families who might otherwise have no voice.

We help to ensure that these families get the help to which they are entitled.






Noreen's Kids exists to raise funds in the U.K. which are transferred to help fund the activities of a Romanian registered charity "Fundatia Cuvioasa Paraschiva" (The foundation of St Paraschiva) – FCP. The money raised in the U.K. helps to pay some of the running costs of this charity, which is entirely staffed by Romanian personnel except for the director, Noreen O'Gorman, a retired district nurse from the UK.

FCP has 2 elements

- 1) We care for around 10 severely disabled children and young adults in a residential setting providing pretty much one to one care for the most needy children.
- 2) We visit families in a wide area around Slobozia providing support for families caring for sick children and young adults in their own homes often living in conditions of considerable poverty.

The support given depends on their needs – everything from supplementing food and Winter fuel (wood usually) to providing nursing care which sometimes involving help with domiciliary palliative care.

Most importantly we provide advice and advocacy to make sure these very vulnerable families are getting the grants and support to which they are entitled from the Romanian government. We also facilitate access to appropriate medical care from the Romanian health services when this is needed and often help with transport to medical appointments

We continue to encourage local Romanian involvement in the work of the charity.

We are well supported by the Orthodox church who regularly make donations in kind of food etc.

Because of Covid restrictions during the year we were not able to visit the charity so often and monitoring of the activities was often by Zoom meetings etc.

The Romanian staff continued to care for the residential children but we were not able to be involved as much as we would have liked in the community work.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

Conditions in Slobozia where the work of the charity is based have been extremely challenging in the year of this report. The area was affected by COVID restrictions throughout the year. In addition to this in March of last year we were suddenly given 2 weeks notice to leave the premises in which our residential unit is based.

The unit which belongs to Child protection services was to be refurbished with an EU grant – it transpired that part of the conditions of the grant excluded residential care of children in the refurbished unit.

Our Romanian team rose to the challenge negotiated a longer transition time and we eventually moved to a nearby village Slobozia Noua where we were given space in an abandoned orphanage.

The accommodation did not have adequate toilet or cooking facilities so the senior staff set to work to make this older building more suitable for our severely disabled children. A wet room toilets and a kitchen were installed and although not ideal they made the building habitable, even if this was more cramped than we were used to. There was no office space and they have managed to install a small office for the chief nurse.

The previous building was on the ground floor and located in a public park where the children could be taken. It also had a garden in which disabled play equipment was installed.

We have managed to move much of the equipment to the new site and have succeeded in getting a grant to install storage facilities in a specifically converted container unit, which we had delivered to the new site.

Despite the difficulties the community work continued even if this was not as much as we would have wished. For example firewood was delivered to families in the district around us who would otherwise not be able to heat their homes adequately during the winter. Particularly important for the families we support with disabled children.

There are still many challenges – the accommodation is on the first floor and there are real difficulties in getting the more disabled children into the garden as there is no lift.

Once again the Romanian staff have loyally supported the charity through some tough times, but the future of the charity is dependent on being able to secure security of tenure – the current building belongs to the county council and although it may be possible to come to an arrangement with them this is not certain.

We distribute food aid, clothing, and dressings and also help with improving housing for instance help with roofing costs or replacing windows, if the household is having to cope the care of disabled and sick children or young adults. We help with transport to hospital appointments when there is no other option. We loan equipment such as specialist beds walking aids etc. when this is necessary. We normally aim to provide palliative care in the community where this is necessary but this has suffered as the result of the COVID epidemic and travel restrictions.





Noreen's Kids exists to raise funds in U.K. which are transferred to help fund the activities of a Romanian registered charity "Fundatia Cuvioasa Paraschiva" (The foundation of St Paraschiva). FCP.

The money raised here helps pay some of the running costs of this charity which is entirely staffed by Romanian personnel except for the director Noreen O'Gorman a retired district nurse from U.K.

FCP has two elements .

- 1) We care for around 10 severely disabled children in a residential setting providing pretty much one to one care for the most needy children
- 2) We visit families in the area around Slobozia providing support for, often, very poor families caring for chronically sick children and young adults in their own homes.

The support given depends on their needs – everything from supplementing food or helping with Winter fuel to nursing care which sometimes involves helping with palliative care.

We provide advice and advocacy to make sure these very vulnerable families are getting the grants and support to which they are entitled from the Romanian government. We facilitate the provision of appropriate medical care through the Romanian health service when this is needed, and help with transport.

We arrange for poor families and children with health needs to have a holiday in collaboration with another U.K. registered charity The Sunflower fellowship (Charity No. 1090120)

We arrange for the training of Staff

We continue to encourage local Romanian involvement in the work of the charity.

Local schools donate shoe boxes with Christmas presents for poor families and some visit the unit

We are well supported by the Orthodox church who regularly make donations in kind of food etc.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

This has been an exceptional and very difficult year for the charity for a number of reasons.

Most of the difficulties relate to the pandemic which for a time saw the government regulations forcing our children's carers to stay in the residential unit for 2 weeks at a time.

We have a very small space there anyway and carers had to take over one of the rooms normally occupied by our children, who were very cramped as a result.

At this time the whole country was under martial law, some of the villages were completely closed and it meant that our community work had to be severely curtailed. In the mean time in UK we were also very restricted in the fund raising events we could mount, but despite this we have managed to keep going thanks to some very generous donors.

The dedication and skill of the Romanian carers cannot be overemphasised. Noreen O'Gorman who normally oversees operations in Romania was trapped in the UK and could not travel back but the staff coped magnificently and Noreen was able to continue to give advice from the UK. Despite the pandemic which was quite bad in Slobozia, our children were protected and cared for.

Our aim has always been to facilitate the care of these severely disabled children by Romanian carers and because of the pandemic they have shown that this is now a reality.

As the country begins to open up we hope to resume our community activities visiting families with sick and disabled children and young adults in their own homes and supporting their family who care for them.

Noreen's Kids is now beginning to resume the kind of fund raising activities which have made this work possible.

We have plans to install extra storage space for equipment and an improved play area and we have successfully applied for a grant from the Toy Trust.

 Operations in Romania are also supported by funds from an Irish Charity – Caring Hearts and Hands, and also from some supporters in USA who transfer funds directly to Romania .
 Funds transferred to Romania support the running of the residential unit and the support of community families caring for chronically ill children and adults . We distribute food aid, clothing, and dressings and also help with improving housing for instance help with roofing costs or replacing windows, if the household is having to cope the care of disabled and sick children or young adults. We help with transport to hospital appointments when there is no other option. We loan equipment such as specialist beds walking aids etc. when this is necessary. We provide support to families who need community palliative care.
