# Objectives and Activities

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The charity's objectives are to provide facilities and services for the local Muslim community in line with Islamic teachings. Our activities focus on:

- **Children's education:** Running after-hours sessions teaching good manners, morals, and religious studies. These lessons are provided free of charge to ensure accessibility for all.
- **Prayer facilities:** Maintaining the masjid as a place of worship for daily prayers, Friday prayers, and other acts of worship.
- **Community services:** Offering a space for the community to meet, discuss, and address issues of concern.

The trustees work together voluntarily to manage the day-to-day operations of the masjid. No trustee receives payment for their role. Trustees also carry out tasks directly when able, in addition to their management responsibilities.

The charity does not employ professional fundraisers, and no income is received from government grants or other external organisations.

## **Achievements and Performance**

During the year, the masjid has continued to provide:

- Free after-hours classes for children, focusing on moral and religious education.
- A safe and open place for worship and community gatherings.

No special projects or additional activities were undertaken beyond the

regular running of the masjid and its services.

## **Financial Review**

- The charity is financed through community donations and voluntary contributions.
- No government grants or external funding were received.
- No professional fundraising activities were used.
- Resources are allocated by the trustees to ensure the smooth running of the masjid and community services.

## **Structure, Governance, and Management**

The charity is governed by a board of trustees who manage activities collectively. Decisions are made as a team, and all trustees serve on a voluntary basis without financial

remuneration.

## **Plans for the Future**

The trustees intend to continue providing:

- After-school educational sessions for children.
- Prayer facilities for the community.
- A venue for community discussions and gatherings.

The focus remains on maintaining and strengthening these essential services for the benefit of the community.
