Governance And Management

Lifecentre Hattersley is a Charitable Incorporated Organisation governed by a CIO Constitution, based on the Foundation Model, the charitable objects and duties of the trustees are as follows. (These have been extracted from the full CIO Constitution document, sections 3 & 9)

Objects

1.1. The objects of the CIO, for the benefit of the public are:

- 1.1.1. to act as a resource for young people up to the age of 25 living in Hattersley and the surrounding area by providing advice and assistance and organising programmes of physical, educational and other activities as a means of:
 - a) advancing in life and helping young people by developing their skills, capacities and capabilities to enable them to participate in society as independent, mature and responsible individuals;
 - b) advancing education;
 - c) relieving unemployment;
 - d) providing recreational and leisure time activity in the interests of social welfare for people living in the area of benefit who have need by reason of their youth, age, infirmity or disability, poverty or social and economic circumstances with a view to improving the conditions of life of such persons.

- 1.1.2. to advance the Christian religion;
- 1.1.3. to preserve and protect good health and relieve poverty amongst people in Hattersley and the surrounding area;
- 1.1.4. to promote for the benefit of the inhabitants of Hattersley and the surrounding area, the provision of facilities for recreation or other leisure time occupation of individuals who have need of such facilities by reason of their youth, age, infirmity or disablement, financial hardship or social and economic circumstances or for the public at large in the interests of social welfare and with the object of improving the condition of life of the said inhabitants.

2. Charity trustees

2.1. Functions and duties of charity trustees

The charity trustees* shall manage the affairs of the CIO and may for that purpose exercise all the powers of the CIO. It is the duty of each charity trustee:

- 2.1.1. to exercise his or her powers and to perform his or her functions in his or her capacity as a trustee of the CIO in the way he or she decides in good faith would be most likely to further the purposes of the CIO; and
- 2.1.2. to exercise, in the performance of those functions, such care and skill as is reasonable in the circumstances having regard in particular to:
 - a) any special knowledge or experience that he or she has or holds himself or herself out as having; and,
 - b) if he or she acts as a charity trustee of the CIO in the course of a business or profession, to any special knowledge or experience that it is reasonable to expect of a person acting in the course of that kind of business or profession.

* Since the CIO Constitution is based on the Foundation Model, the only persons eligible to be members of the CIO are its charity trustees.

Reserves Policy

The Trustees have adopted a reserves policy, which they consider appropriate to enable the charity to meet its developing commitments and obligations. To this end, the charity's policy is to retain funds equivalent to approximately 1-month's staff & administration costs.

Public Benefit Statement

The Trustees confirm that, when exercising their powers and duties, they have complied with the duty in Section 17 of the Charities Act 2011 to have had due regard to guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit.

Risk Management

The Trustees continue to review and alleviate potential risks, in accordance with the guidance set out by the Charity Commission.

Review Of The Year

With the continued financial support of local churches and individuals, the additional funding from, Pinfold Primary School, Arundale Primary School, Lifecentre Hattersley continued to carry out its activities to meet its charitable objects by way of:

Forest schools – Over the last year we've been delivering four sessions a week at Pinfold and Arundale primary schools. It's a great way to meet most of our local young people. We can invite those from years 4 – 6 to our weekly Adventure Club where we can share our faith more openly.

We've secured an ongoing commitment from Pinfold for the 2023/24 academic year and have a commitment from Arundale that subject to budget they hope to use us across their year groups next summer term.

Adventure Activities

We run our weekly adventure club which is frequented by a strong core of regulars as well as a growing number of young people from school adventure sessions and forest schools. We regularly use the session as a location-based learning opportunity to share our faith in a way that's related to the activity. For example if we're abseiling we might talk about what we put our faith in, on a hike about taking the narrow road that leads to eternal life, exploring caves about our call to walk in the light and not fear the darkness. We regularly challenge people to respond in these God slots and offer various options for them to explore and grow in faith.

Discipleship & Mentoring

We've run Rock Solid for the last ten year as a group for 9-14's to grow through exploring Christianity. While we've had many encouraging times over the years, I feel it's time to stop Rock Solid for now and instead give the young people more focused seasonal opportunities to explore Christianity through youth Alpha course and similar.


Future Developments

The financial forecast for the forthcoming 12-months highlights a gap between income and expenditure, which has potential ramifications for the sustainability of the commitments and activities of Lifecentre Hattersley. The Trustees and Executive Director are identifying and pursuing means of addressing the shortfall in order to be able to continue to provide the current level of services, but have already also developed a contingency plan, in the event that further income is not available.

The current budget contains funds already secured, notably a continued commitment from Pinfold Primary School to continue to provide Forest School activities to their pupils during the current academic year.

The Trustees continue to support the utilisation of appropriate premises to ensure public accessibility to the facilities available where appropriate.

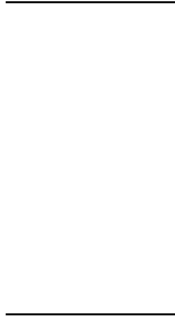
