- NEWLIFE TRUST maintains modest finances compared to project ambitions but shows a positive trend over previous years.
- In 2024, the charity achieved a financial increase of approximately 35%.
- Currently, the charity does not have a reserve policy.
- The charity does have a reserve value of £10000.
- Funds are primarily sourced from social events, charitable programs, donations, and approved grants.
- The principal financial risk is inflation, which increases running costs.
- The charity continues to address ongoing financial challenges to meet community demands.
