

We also help people engage with local services and navigate systems that may otherwise be difficult to access. All our work is delivered fairly and consistently, with a strong commitment to equality, diversity, and inclusion, ensuring everyone has the opportunity to learn, grow, and						
			During the year ending 31 March 2025, Community Education Forum delivered free, community-based programmes that promoted educational progress and improved access to essential services. The Community Response Education Project, our core initiative, offered Homework Club and GCSE tuition, developed in partnership with local schools and families. These sessions supported academic improvement and strengthened links between home and school. We also held awareness workshops on issues such as knife crime and exploitation, helping participants recognise early warning signs and access help. Alongside this, residents received advice, advocacy, and language support to resolve practical challenges, particularly around housing and benefits. Stronger collaboration with schools and local partners improved referrals and ensured services remained responsive. Trustees confirm they have had due regard to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit when planning and delivering activities.
