Charity Aims and Objectives

The principal aims & objectives of the charity are:

- The advancement of the Christian Faith
- Employing diverse ways of teaching and educating members with the knowledge of God
- To give Christian care and welfare To all members of the community as it deems necessary.
- To organise children and youth activities to promote family values and unity in the course of developing deeper spiritual growth
- To provide hospitality to visiting ministers and proponents of the gospel
- Work in co-operation with other Christian organisations and support events with similar Christian aims and objectives
- The relief of poverty

Summary of Activities during the Year

We had tremendous success in our 2022 annual programs for the church to the glory of God. Members increased during the year. In January 2022, we visited few care homes in the Wigan community and shelters like the Bricks with gifts and donations. We are now official partnership with Bricks with quarterly support.

The men's wing of the church held their annual conference in April 2022, by inviting believers and non-believers to free health checks on Blood Pressure, sugar level and urine test organised by the doctors in the church. The role of men in enhancing and preserving family value was discussed.

In the month of July, we co-hosted with other churches in Wigan, the South Koreans who came to Wigan on a 2-week missionary visit. Our church bus served as a means of transportation within the community and beyond.

Our church organised Wigan youths for Christ and Community social development 2019 in November. An event that creates opportunity to talk to youths who are into drugs, alcohol and pre-marital sex. Social media challenges were deliberated.

The Annual Community Conference was held in October 2019 with the theme "THE ROLE OF WOMEN IN TRANSFORMING OUR COMMUNITY" It was an event for women to know their relevance and responsibilities in transforming our community.

In spite of the Covid-19 challenges, we continue during the current year with our charitable activities virtually and physically in line with the Covid-19 protocol. We launched a Covid-19 relief support based on funds received from community funds (UK). We were able to cater for about 100-plus within our community who are of African, Asian, Caribbean descent and homeless individual in our community.

Trustees Responsibility for Financial Statements

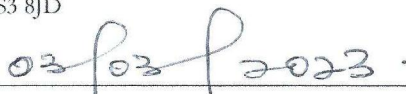
