I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 30 April 2021, which are set out on pages 6 to 7.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. The charity's trustees consider that an audit is not required for this year under section 144(2) of the Charities Act 2011 (the 2011 Act) and that an independent examination is needed.

It is my responsibility to:

- examine the accounts under section 145 of the Charities Act,
- to follow the procedures laid down in the general Directions given by the Charity Commission (under section 145 (5)(b) of the 2011 Act, and
- to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of independent examiner's statement

My examination was carried out in accordance with general Directions given by the Charity Commission. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeking explanations from the trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently no opinion is given as to whether the accounts present a 'true and fair' view and the report is limited to those matters set out in the statement below.

Promoting Research • The Fanconi Hope-funded Long Term Effects of Fanconi Anaemia Study is a long term Registry project which now holds data on more than 60% of the known patients in the UK. • Fanconi Hope has now been able to 100% fund a research project into the use of Proton Beam Therapy for treatment of cancers in patients with FA. • Fanconi Hope is now part of a Fanconi Anemia Global Network set up to discuss development of greater family support and research networks across the world. • We continue with the development of the FA Europe network, which we helped to initiate in 2019, to help with common approaches to research amongst a scarce set of European medical experts

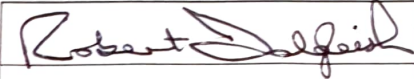
