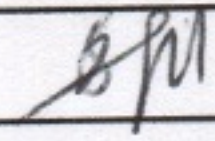

THIS RESULTED IN A SURPLUS OF £7,578 WHICH WERE ADDED TO PRIOR YEAR SURPLUSES. THE TRUSTEES HAVE A POLICY NOT TO HOLD ANY RESERVES APART FROM FUNDS THAT ARE COMMITTED FOR FUTURE CHARITABLE AND ADMINSTRATIVE EXPENDITURE.

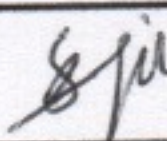
