The trustees present their report and financial statements for the year ended 31 October 2024
This report also constitutes a directors' report for the purposes of company law.

Charitable Objectives

The charity's objectives are:

- 1) To relieve the mental and physical distress of drug and alcohol dependents by providing accommodation with links to treatment provision in a supportive environment.
- 2) To assist in the relief of emotional distress of relatives, carers and friends of drug and alcohol dependents by providing family support groups and links to other providers of care services.

The Trustees consider that these objectives, and the activities summarised below, further the company's charitable purposes for the public benefit. In planning our activities for the period, we kept in mind the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit at our Trustees' meetings.

St Anthony's Project for Homeless Addicts is a company limited by guarantee (number 6710412) incorporated on 29 September 2008 and it obtained charity status on 3 March 2009 (number 1128362). Its Memorandum and Articles of Association form its governing document.

Review of Activities

It is a pleasure and an honour to be writing our end of year report as we enter our seventeenth year of existence. Once again, I can report on a successful year with many of our clients turning their lives around from drug/alcohol dependency; after spending many years in the cycle of addiction and the devastating consequences this has had on them and their families.

We continue to work in partnership with other agencies in Calderdale and Bradford to provide the best possible care and outcomes for our clients. Many of them coming to us with dual diagnosis including mental and physical health needs so it is vital we can engage them with the correct services for their individual needs which we are able to do through working closely with these agencies.

It's been fantastic to see our clients taking part in accredited courses at their day care and receiving qualifications in learning about Addiction, Anxiety, Dealing with Depression and other mental health related issues. The pride on their faces speaks for itself when they receive the certificated qualifications. This is no easy task for someone recovering from addiction and their commitment and perseverance is commendable, we are so very proud of these guys. It's also been amazing to see some of our guys extend this to further their education by enrolling at local colleges for part-time courses in social care, mental health and psychology. Several of our guys through this have also been able to gain part-time volunteering roles with other agencies being able to share their own experiences to help others struggling with addiction. Moving on to independent living working towards and gaining employment to live fulfilled lives.

It goes without saying that none of this would be possible without our amazing staff team and volunteers and the commitment to the project. Some of our staff have been with us from the projects inception and we are so thankful for their dedication and care. Through gaining funding this year we have been able to engage a family worker to help our clients with learning about the complexities of relationships and rebuilding relationships with their family members after spending years estranged from family, caused by the devastation of addiction. This means some of our clients are now able to have meaningful connections with parents, children and other family members, helping them reconnect with society and preventing loneliness and isolation when returning to independent living. It's such a delight seeing families brought back together some after years of being apart.

Funding continues to be challenging and competitive as so many agencies compete for the same funding. We do offer great value for money though and have a high rate of success in helping people turn their life's around and become successful members of society and no price can be put on the value of this. This also reduces the cost on public spending as it prevents the revolving door created by addiction causing, offending, homelessness and other devastating consequences. We are extremely grateful to funders this year including The Awards for All community fund, The Albert hunt trust and The Charles and Elsie Sykes trust.

A very big thankyou to our trustees also who are truly committed to the project we are grateful to you all for your service, care and dedication.

Financial Review and Reserves Policy

The net deficit for the year was £167 all of which was in respect of unrestricted funds

The charity's total reserves at 31 October 2024 were £32,448 compared to £32,615 at 31 October 2023, all of which were unrestricted funds and the trustees consider that this is an adequate level of reserves to support both the ongoing work of the charity and its future development

Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 October 2024 which are set out on pages 6 to 11.

1 Accounting policies

1.1 Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard Applicable in the UK and Republic Of Ireland (FRS 102), the Financial Reporting Standard Applicable in the UK and Republic Of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Companies Act 2006.

Assets and liabilities are initially recognised at historical cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant accounting policy notes.

1.2 Fund accounting policy

Unrestricted income funds are general funds that are available for use at the trustees' discretion in furtherance of the objective of the charity. Restricted income funds are available for use only in accordance with the donors' conditions under which the income was received.

1.3 Incoming resources

Voluntary income including donations and grants is recognised where there is entitlement, certainty of receipt and the amount can be measured with sufficient reliability.

1.4 Resources expended

Liabilities are recognised as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to the expenditure. All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to that category.

1.5 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life as follows:
