**Annual Report of the Directors
For the year ended 31 December 2023**

The Directors of NESsT UK Limited (“the Charity”) submit their annual report and the financial statements of the Charity for the year ended 31 December 2023. The financial statements have been prepared in the format prescribed by the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities (SORP2019 (FRS102)) and the Financial Reporting Standard 102. The legal and administrative information set out earlier in this document forms part of this report.

1. Structure, Governance & Management

1.1 Directors

The Board of Directors, who meet two to four times per year, are responsible for the strategic direction and policy of the Charity. At present the Board is made up of 5 Directors from a variety of professional backgrounds relevant to the work of the Charity.

New Directors are appointed by resolution during regular or special board meetings. In selecting individuals for appointment, the existing Directors must have regard to the skills, knowledge and experience needed for the effective administration of the Charity. New Directors are provided with copies of the governing document together with a copy of the Charity's latest financial statements and minutes of the two most recent board meetings. When instructing new Directors, the Board makes good use of the Charity Commission publications concerning the role and duties of charity Directors.

None of the Directors has any beneficial interest in the company. All of the Directors are members of the company and guarantee to contribute no more than £100 in the event of a winding up.

The Charity is affiliated to NESsT Inc. (a non-profit organisation incorporated in 1997 in Maryland USA), which invests in social enterprises that provide dignified jobs for people most in need. NESsT Inc. pursues its mission in emerging economies such as Latin America and Central Europe. An agreement is in place with NESsT Inc. to provide a simple protocol for the working together of the two organisations. Loic Comolli and Lord Mervyn Davies, both Directors of the Charity were also members of the Board of NESsT Inc. in 2023.

1.2 Risk Management

The Directors acknowledge that they have a responsibility for the identification and proper management of risks faced by the Charity in achieving its primary aims. The Directors have therefore assessed the major risks to which the Charity is exposed, in particular those relating to the specific operational areas of the Charity and its finances. The Directors believe that, by monitoring reserve levels, by ensuring that controls exist over key financial systems, and by examining the operational risks faced by the Charity, they have established effective systems and procedures to mitigate those risks.

2. Activities & Objectives

The Charity’s vision is to empower social entrepreneurs to generate dignified employment for low-income individuals in emerging economies. The Charity carries out its vision by supporting NESsT Inc.’s vision and charitable aims through a UK-based program of awareness, fundraising and grant-making.

Specifically, the Charity’s approach consists of:

- *Connection:* with a variety of stakeholders in the UK including partners, donors and experts to advance social entrepreneurship;
- *Integration:* with the NESsT Inc. network to bring its expertise to UK audiences; and
- *Transparency:* diligent in the operations of the charity and in maintaining high standards of compliance, with stakeholders both internally and externally, and transparent in the way money is raised, managed, deployed, and reported

The Directors remain committed to provide funding to those NESsT Inc. projects in parts of the world that meet the Charity’s objectives and criteria and are considered charitable under English Law.

The Directors confirm that they have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the Charity's aims and objectives and in planning future activities and in the setting of the grant-making policy. In order to carry out these objectives the Charity has established a framework through which efficient fundraising opportunities could be pursued to fund future grants.

3. Achievements and Performance

In 2023, the charity trustees agreed to identify donors that could support the Refugee Employment Initiative which would invest in 15 social enterprises creating 3,000 jobs for refugees from Ukraine in Poland and Romania.

They also planned and had an event in May 2023 that took place in London, UK.

In 2023 the charity resumed its grant making activities and issued a grant of £50,410 as a restricted donation to support NESsT fellowship position for minority students in the U.S.

The charity was presented with the UK audit which made recommendations that the charity: 1) Disburse grants; 2. Claim past Gift Aid; 3) Document individual donation on an ongoing basis; 4) clear up grant payable carried on the books for the last year. The charity is working to address these recommendations.

The charity also performed a review of the NESsT UK Risk Register which contains five categories of risk. The trustees agreed that the major risks to the charity remain largely the same, noting a few areas of improvement, and approving the register.

4. Going Concern Review

Each year it is the Trustees' responsibility to state whether or not the annual accounts have been drawn up on a going concern basis (see the accounting policy note on page 10). Going concern is the assumption that an entity, in this case the Charity, has the resources (financial or otherwise) needed to continue operating for the foreseeable future and, in particular, for at least 12 months from the date of approval by the Trustees of these annual accounts. If the going concern principle did not apply then the accounts would be drawn up on an insolvent basis.

The Trustees consider that the Charity has sufficient reserves and ongoing income to maintain its activities for the foreseeable future.

5. Financial Review

5.1 Financial Activity and Financial Position

The Statement of Financial Activities and Balance Sheet can be found on pages 7 and 8 respectively. The Charity's reserves increased by £107,760 during the year (2022: decreased by £5,863). The balance sheet shows total net assets of £233,055 (2022: £125,295).

5.2 Reserves Policy

The Directors have examined the requirements for free reserves. The Directors consider that free reserves should be equivalent to approximately 12 months' general fund expenditure plus committed future expenditure on other projects, where funds permit. This amounts to about £2,000. The Directors are of the opinion that this provides sufficient flexibility to cover temporary shortfalls in incoming resources and will allow the Charity to cope and respond to unforeseen emergencies whilst specific action plans are implemented. At 31 December 2023 the Charity had net free reserves of £227,755 (2022: £74,885) as follows:

The directors are aware that free reserves are in excess of the free reserves requirement. The level of free reserves is dictated by the timing of donations received and charitable grants made. The expectation is that, in 2023, charitable grants will be made to reduce free reserves.

6. Plans for Future Periods

In 2025 the Charity plans to host a private event to raise the visibility of NESsT Inc in the UK, leveraging more support and funding for its work. The Charity also plans to continue to provide grants to social enterprises in Latin America and Central Europe supporting them to grow their impact.

7. Responsibilities of Directors for the Financial Statements

The Directors are responsible for preparing the report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice. Charity law in England and Wales requires the Directors to prepare financial statements for each financial period which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Charity and of the incoming resources and application of resources of the Charity for that period.

In preparing those financial statements, the Directors are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently;
- observe the methods and principles of the Charities SORP;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, subject to any departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements; and
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the activities of the Charity will continue.

The Directors are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the Charity and enables them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2011, the Charity (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 and the provisions of the governing document. The Directors are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities. The Directors are responsible for the maintenance and integrity of the Charity and financial information included in the Charity's website.

**Report of the Independent Examiner to the Directors of

I report on the accounts of the NESsT UK Limited for the year ended 31 December 2023, set out on pages 7 to 12.

Respective responsibilities of Directors and Examiner



1. Accounting Policies

The principal accounting policies adopted, judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty in the preparation of the financial statements are as follows:

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the Charities Act 2011, the Companies Act 2006 and in accordance with the Charities Statement of Recommended Practice (Charities SORP (FRS 102)) and Financial Reporting Standard 102 (FRS 102). The financial statements are drawn up on the historical cost basis of accounting.

The Charity meets the definition of a public benefit entity under FRS 102.

Going Concern

There are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue and accordingly the accounts have been drawn up on a going concern basis.

Income recognition

Voluntary income and donations (including legacies) are accounted for once the Charity has entitlement to the income, it is probable the income will be received and the amount of income receivable can be reliably measured. Income from the recovery of tax on gift aided donations is accounted for in the period to which the relevant donation is received. Grant income is recognised on a receivable basis.

Interest on funds held on deposit is included when receivable and the amount can be measured reliably by the Charity; this is normally upon notification of the interest paid or payable by the bank.

Expenditure recognition

Expenditure is accrued as soon as a liability is considered probable, and the amount of obligation can be measured reliably. The Charity is not registered for VAT and accordingly expenditure includes VAT where appropriate.

Charitable expenditure includes those costs in fulfilling the Charity's principal objects, as outlined in the Report of the Directors. These include grants payable and governance costs.

Grants payable are payments made to third parties in the furtherance of the charitable objects of the Charity. In the case of an unconditional grant offer this is accrued once the recipient has been notified of the grant award. The notification gives the recipient a reasonable expectation that they will receive the one-year or multi-year grant. Grants awards that are subject to the recipient fulfilling performance conditions are only accrued when the recipient has been notified of the grant and any remaining unfulfilled condition attaching to that grant is outside of the control of the Charity.

Provisions for grants are made when the intention to make a grant has been communicated to the recipient but there is uncertainty as to the timing of the grant or the amount of grant payable.

Governance costs comprise all costs involving the public accountability of the charity and its compliance with regulation and good practice. These costs include costs related to statutory independent examination and legal fees.

Debtors

Debtors are included at the settlement amount due. Prepayments are valued at the amount prepaid.

Cash at bank and in hand

Cash at bank and in hand includes cash and short term highly liquid investments with a short maturity of three months or less from the date of opening of the deposit.

Creditors and provisions

Creditors and provisions are recognised where the charity has a present obligation arising from a past event that will probably result in the transfer of funds to a third party and the amount due to settle the obligation can be measured or estimated reliably. Creditors and provisions are recognised at their settlement amount.

1. Accounting Policies (continued)

Fund accounting

The funds held by the charity are either:

- Unrestricted general funds - these are funds which can be used in accordance with the charitable objects at the discretion of the Directors.
- Restricted funds - these are funds that can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

An agreement is in place with NESsT Inc. to provide a simple protocol for the working together of the two organisations. Loic Comolli and Lord Mervyn Davies, both Directors of the Charity were also members of the Board of NESsT Inc. in 2022.

1.2 Risk Management

The Directors acknowledge that they have a responsibility for the identification and proper management of risks faced by the Charity in achieving its primary aims. The Directors have therefore assessed the major risks to which the Charity is exposed, in particular those relating to the specific operational areas of the Charity and its finances. The Directors believe that, by monitoring reserve levels, by ensuring that controls exist over key financial systems, and by examining the operational risks faced by the Charity, they have established effective systems and procedures to mitigate those risks.

2. Activities & Objectives

The Charity's vision is to empower social entrepreneurs to generate dignified employment for low-income individuals in emerging economies. The Charity carries out its vision by supporting NESsT Inc.'s vision and charitable aims through a UK-based program of awareness, fundraising and grant-making.

Specifically, the Charity's approach consists of:

- *Connection:* with a variety of stakeholders in the UK including partners, donors and experts to advance social entrepreneurship;
- *Integration:* with the NESsT Inc. network to bring its expertise to UK audiences; and
- *Transparency:* diligent in the operations of the charity and in maintaining high standards of compliance, with stakeholders both internally and externally, and transparent in the way money is raised, managed, deployed, and reported

The Directors remain committed to provide funding to those NESsT Inc. projects in parts of the world that meet the Charity's objectives and criteria and are considered charitable under English Law.

The Directors confirm that they have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the Charity's aims and objectives and in planning future activities and in the setting of the

grant-making policy. In order to carry out these objectives the Charity has established a framework through which efficient fundraising opportunities could be pursued to fund future grants.

3. Achievements and Performance

In 2022, the charity trustees agreed to identify donors that could support the Refugee Employment Initiative which would invest in 15 social enterprises creating 3,000 jobs for refugees from Ukraine in Poland and Romania.

They also planned to hold an event in September of the year which was later postponed to 2023 with the goal of having more time to plan a larger event.

In 2022 the charity resumed its grant making activities. The first grant went to support the Peru programme to grow its impact on inclusive entrepreneurship and job creation in the country. The grant allowed the program to grow in the following ways: 1) Research, analyse and select six new social enterprises in the NESsT Loan Programme; 2) Benefit rural areas in Peru by engaging in regenerative agriculture involving 1,200 smallholder farming families; 3) Increase the visibility of NESsT in the country by organizing events for social enterprises and partner to share lessons learned about impact investing.

The second grant went toward supporting NESsT Inc to grow as an organization addressing six key gaps: 1) Programs- Hire a Program Director, implement a Knowledge Management System and a Amazonia Programme Manager; 2) Development- Hire a Development Director, increase board outreach and fundraising capacity and strengthen CRM for donor management; 3) Finance- Hire an Accounting Associate, transition to accrual based accounting and strengthen the procurement process; 4) Communications- Hire a PR agenda, hire a design agency and increase marketing content with two new hires; 5) Operations- Increase IT support to maintain online systems, hire knowledge management consultant and develop a DEI policy.

The charity was presented with the UK audit which made recommendations that the charity: 1) Disburse grants; 2. Claim past Gift Aid; 3) Document individual donation on an ongoing basis; 4) clear up grant payable carried on the books for the last year. The charity is working to address these recommendations.

The charity also performed a review of the NESsT UK Risk Register which contains five categories of risk. The trustees agreed that the major risks to the charity remain largely the same, noting a few areas of improvement, and approving the register.

4. Going Concern Review

Each year it is the Trustees' responsibility to state whether or not the annual accounts have been drawn up on a going concern basis (see the accounting policy note on page 10). Going concern is the assumption that an entity, in this case the Charity, has the resources (financial or otherwise) needed to continue operating for the foreseeable future and, in particular, for at least 12 months from the date of approval by the Trustees of these annual accounts. If the going concern principle did not apply then the accounts would be drawn up on an insolvent basis.

The Trustees consider that the Charity has sufficient reserves and ongoing income to maintain its activities for the foreseeable future.

5. Financial Review

5.1 Financial Activity and Financial Position

The Statement of Financial Activities and Balance Sheet can be found on pages 7 and 8 respectively. The Charity's reserves decreased by £5,863 during the year (2021: Increased by £105,442). The balance sheet shows total net assets of £125,295 (2021: £131,158).

The Directors have examined the requirements for free reserves. The Directors consider that free reserves should be equivalent to approximately 12 months' general fund expenditure plus committed future expenditure on other projects, where funds permit. This amounts to about £2,000. The Directors are of the opinion that this provides sufficient flexibility to cover temporary shortfalls in incoming resources and will allow the Charity to cope and respond to unforeseen emergencies whilst specific action plans are implemented. At 31 December 2022 the Charity had net free reserves of £74,885 (2021: £90,985) as follows:



3. Achievements and Performance

In 2021, the Covid-19 pandemic continued to impact the activities of the charity. In the UK, the Charity did not hold its annual gala because the pandemic made large social gatherings inadvisable. In emerging economies, social enterprises recovered from lockdowns and business disruptions experienced the prior year. In reviewing grant-making opportunities in the NESsT Inc. social enterprise network, the Charity evaluated that social enterprises needed predominantly technical assistance to navigate new business opportunities and challenges presented by the pandemic. Therefore, the Charity made the decision to put grant-making activities on hold until it could be further established that social enterprises could use new grants to the maximum of their ability.

The Trustees took advantage of the reduction in event planning and grant-making to engage in communications activities. The Charity hosted an online event featuring Dalba, a grantee of the Charity and award-winning Polish craft beer brewery giving employment to people with disabilities who might otherwise be excluded from the job market. The event exposed the Charity's network of supporters in the UK to the social entrepreneurs the Charity impacts around the world.

The Charity promoted its mission and raised awareness of social enterprises through the publication of the NESsTing Upon the Thames blog. Started in 2020, the blog series highlights walks by one of the Trustees along the river Thames to examine London and its history, entrepreneurial businesses, and thoughts about how to cope when things go wrong.

The Charity took several steps to strengthen its organizational capacity. Trustees elected Lord Mervyn Davies as Board Chair to increase the visibility and networks of the Charity. Furthermore, the Trustees undertook a strategic review of the Charity's financial and administrative processes to improve efficiency.

In 2021 the Charity raised its funds from U.K. based individual donors. Charity Directors engaged in selective fundraising activities in an effort to raise funds to benefit social enterprises around the world.

4. Going Concern Review

Each year it is the Trustees' responsibility to state whether or not the annual accounts have been drawn up on a going concern basis (see the accounting policy note on page 10). Going concern is the assumption that an entity, in this case the Charity, has the resources (financial or otherwise) needed to continue operating for the foreseeable future and, in particular, for at least 12 months from the date of approval by the Trustees of these annual accounts. If the going concern principle did not apply then the accounts would be drawn up on an insolvent basis.

The Trustees consider that the Charity has sufficient reserves and ongoing income to maintain its activities for the foreseeable future.

5. Financial Review

5.1 Financial Activity and Financial Position

The Statement of Financial Activities and Balance Sheet can be found on pages 7 and 8 respectively. The Charity's reserves increased by £105,442 during the year (2020: Increased by £16,498). The balance sheet shows total net assets of £131,158 (2020: £25,716).

5.2 Reserves Policy

The Directors have examined the requirements for free reserves. The Directors consider that free reserves should be equivalent to approximately 12 months' general fund expenditure plus committed future expenditure on other projects, where funds permit. This amounts to about £2,000. The Directors are of the opinion that this provides sufficient flexibility to cover temporary shortfalls in incoming resources and will allow the Charity to cope and respond to unforeseen emergencies whilst specific action plans are implemented. At 31 December 2021 the Charity had net free reserves of £90,985 (2020: £16,903) as follows:

The directors are aware that free reserves are in excess of the free reserves requirement. The level of free reserves is dictated by the timing of donations received and charitable grants made. The expectation is that, in 2022, charitable grants will be made to reduce free reserves.

6. Plans for Future Periods

In 2022 the Charity plans to maintain its strategy of empowering social entrepreneurs in emerging economies. A renewed effort will be made to resume grant making activities to social enterprises in Latin America and Central Europe. If it is safe to do so, the Charity will evaluate hosting its annual reception to continue growing its network of supporters in the U.K., and to educate business professionals on how impact investing can shape development at the grassroots level.

7. Responsibilities of Directors for the Financial Statements

The Directors are responsible for preparing the report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice. Charity law in England and Wales requires the Directors to prepare financial statements for each financial period which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Charity and of the incoming resources and application of resources of the Charity for that period.


In preparing those financial statements, the Directors are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently;
- observe the methods and principles of the Charities SORP;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, subject to any departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements; and
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the activities of the Charity will continue.

The Directors are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the Charity and enables them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2011, the Charity (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 and the provisions of the governing document. The Directors are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities. The Directors are responsible for the maintenance and integrity of the Charity and financial information included in the Charity's website.



I. Accounting Policies

The principal accounting policies adopted, judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty in the preparation of the financial statements are as follows:

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the Charities Act 2011, the Companies Act 2006 and in accordance with the Charities Statement of Recommended Practice (Charities SORP (FRS 102)) and Financial Reporting Standard 102 (FRS 102). The financial statements are drawn up on the historical cost basis of accounting.

The Charity meets the definition of a public benefit entity under FRS 102.

Going Concern

There are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue and accordingly the accounts have been drawn up on a going concern basis.

Income recognition

Voluntary income and donations (including legacies) are accounted for once the Charity has entitlement to the income, it is probable the income will be received and the amount of income receivable can be reliably measured. Income from the recovery of tax on gift aided donations is accounted for in the period to which the relevant donation is received. Grant income is recognised on a receivable basis.

Interest on funds held on deposit is included when receivable and the amount can be measured reliably by the Charity; this is normally upon notification of the interest paid or payable by the bank.

Expenditure recognition

Expenditure is accrued as soon as a liability is considered probable, and the amount of obligation can be measured reliably. The Charity is not registered for VAT and accordingly expenditure includes VAT where appropriate.

Charitable expenditure includes those costs in fulfilling the Charity's principal objects, as outlined in the Report of the Directors. These include grants payable and governance costs.

Grants payable are payments made to third parties in the furtherance of the charitable objects of the Charity. In the case of an unconditional grant offer this is accrued once the recipient has been notified of the grant award. The notification gives the recipient a reasonable expectation that they will receive the one-year or multi-year grant. Grants awards that are subject to the recipient fulfilling performance conditions are only accrued when the recipient has been notified of the grant and any remaining unfulfilled condition attaching to that grant is outside of the control of the Charity.

Provisions for grants are made when the intention to make a grant has been communicated to the recipient but there is uncertainty as to the timing of the grant or the amount of grant payable.

Governance costs comprise all costs involving the public accountability of the charity and its compliance with regulation and good practice. These costs include costs related to statutory independent examination and legal fees.

Debtors

Debtors are included at the settlement amount due. Prepayments are valued at the amount prepaid.

Cash at bank and in hand

Cash at bank and in hand includes cash and short term highly liquid investments with a short maturity of three months or less from the date of opening of the deposit.

Creditors and provisions

Creditors and provisions are recognised where the charity has a present obligation arising from a past event that will probably result in the transfer of funds to a third party and the amount due to settle the obligation can be measured or estimated reliably. Creditors and provisions are recognised at their settlement amount.

Fund accounting

The funds held by the charity are either:

- Unrestricted general funds - these are funds which can be used in accordance with the charitable objects at the discretion of the Directors.
- Restricted funds - these are funds that can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Annual Report of the Directors For the year ended 31 December 2020

The Directors of NESsT UK Limited (“the Charity”) submit their annual report and the financial statements of the Charity for the year ended 31 December 2020. The financial statements have been prepared in the format prescribed by the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities (SORP2015 (FRS102)) and the Financial Reporting Standard 102. The legal and administrative information set out earlier in this document forms part of this report.

I. Structure, Governance & Management

1.1 Directors

The Board of Directors, who meet two to four times per year, are responsible for the strategic direction and policy of the Charity. At present the Board is made up of 6 Directors from a variety of professional backgrounds relevant to the work of the Charity.

New Directors are appointed by resolution during regular or special board meetings. In selecting individuals for appointment, the existing Directors must have regard to the skills, knowledge and experience needed for the effective administration of the Charity. New Directors are provided with copies of the governing document together with a copy of the Charity's latest financial statements and minutes of the two most recent board meetings. When instructing new Directors, the Board makes good use of the Charity Commission publications concerning the role and duties of charity Directors.

None of the Directors has any beneficial interest in the company. All of the Directors are members of the company and guarantee to contribute no more than £100 in the event of a winding up.

The Charity is affiliated to NESsT Inc. (a non-profit organisation incorporated in 1997 in Maryland USA), which invests in social enterprises that provide dignified jobs for people most in need. NESsT Inc. pursues its mission in emerging economies such as Latin America and Central Europe. An agreement is in place with NESsT Inc. to provide a simple protocol for the working together of the two organisations. Two Directors of the Charity are also members of the Board of NESsT Inc.

1.2 Risk Management

The Directors acknowledge that they have a responsibility for the identification and proper management of risks faced by the Charity in achieving its primary aims. The Directors have therefore assessed the major risks to which the Charity is exposed, in particular those relating to the specific operational areas of the Charity and its finances. The Directors believe that, by monitoring reserve levels, by ensuring that controls exist over key financial systems, and by examining the operational risks faced by the Charity, they have established effective systems and procedures to mitigate those risks.

2. Activities & Objectives

The Charity's vision is to empower social entrepreneurs to generate dignified employment for low-income individuals in emerging economies. The Charity carries out its vision by supporting NESsT Inc.'s vision and charitable aims through a UK-based program of awareness, fundraising and grant-making.

Specifically, the Charity's approach consists of:

- *Connection:* with a variety of stakeholders in the UK including partners, donors and experts to advance social entrepreneurship
- *Integration:* with the NESsT Inc. network to bring its expertise to UK audiences
- *Transparency:* diligent in the operations of the charity and in maintaining high standards of compliance, with stakeholders both internally and externally, and transparent in the way money is raised, managed, deployed, and reported

The Directors remain committed to provide funding to those NESsT Inc. projects in parts of the world that meet the Charity's objectives and criteria and are considered charitable under English Law.

The Directors confirm that they have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the Charity's aims and objectives and in planning future activities and in the setting of the grant-making policy. In order to carry out these objectives the Charity has established a framework through which efficient fundraising opportunities could be pursued to fund future grants.

3. Achievements and Performance

The Covid-19 pandemic severely impacted the activities of the charity. With a primary mission of awareness-raising, carried out through a variety of event formats, the pandemic did not allow for the charity's normal course of activities.

In April 2020, the Trustees made the decision to cancel the Charity's annual gala. In previous years, the gala had represented the Charity's main awareness-raising event in the U.K., drawing audiences from the financial services and philanthropic sectors interested in impact investing in emerging economies. The cancellation of the event reduced the Charity's income and its grant-making activities for the year.

The Trustees took advantage of the reduction in event planning and grantmaking to revise the Charity's internal policies and controls. The Trustees adopted four policies on Anti-Money Laundering, Anti-Bribery and Corruption (ABC), Grantmaking, and Financial Controls. These revised policies have placed the Charity on solid footing to resume its ongoing activities when the pandemic has receded.

In 2020 the Charity raised its funds from a variety of U.K. based sources that included corporations with corporate citizenship programs in emerging market economies, and individuals. Charity Directors engaged in selective fundraising activities in an effort to raise funds to benefit social enterprises around the world.

4. Going Concern Review

Prior to the signing of these accounts, the UK and many of the countries where NESsT works continue to be affected by the Covid-19 pandemic. No overseas travel and no conferences have taken place since the beginning of the pandemic in March 2020, and none are planned for the foreseeable future.

Each year it is the trustees' responsibility to state whether or not the annual accounts have been drawn up on a going concern basis (see the accounting policy note on page 10). Going concern is the assumption that an entity, in this case the charity, has the resources (financial or otherwise) needed to continue operating for the foreseeable future and, in particular, for at least 12 months from the date of approval by the trustees of these annual accounts. If the going concern principle did not apply then the accounts would be drawn up on an insolvent basis.

The trustees have had to consider the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic on NESsT's operations. Although income is likely to reduce because of the economic impact of the pandemic, expenditure will also reduce because conferences are not able to be held. Reserves and ongoing income are sufficient to maintain the reduced activities of NESsT.

5. Financial Review

5.1 Financial Activity and Financial Position

The Statement of Financial Activities and Balance Sheet can be found on pages 7 and 8 respectively. The Charity's reserves increased by £16,498 during the year (2019: decreased by £22,321). The balance sheet shows total net assets of £25,716 (2019: £9,218).

The Directors have examined the requirements for free reserves. The Directors consider that free reserves should be equivalent to approximately 12 months' general fund expenditure plus committed future expenditure on other projects, where funds permit. This amounts to about £2,000. The Directors are of the opinion that this provides sufficient flexibility to cover temporary shortfalls in incoming resources and will allow the Charity to cope and respond to unforeseen emergencies whilst specific action plans are implemented. At 31 December 2020 the Charity had net free reserves of £16,903 (2019: £8,643) as follows:

The directors are aware that free reserves are in excess of the free reserves requirement. The level of free reserves is dictated by the timing of donations received and charitable grants made. The expectation is that, in 2021, charitable grants will be made to reduce free reserves.

6. Plans for Future Periods

In 2021 the Charity plans to maintain its strategy of empowering social entrepreneurs in emerging economies by carrying out awareness raising events in the United Kingdom. These are likely to be hosted online, rather than in person, depending on how the pandemic progresses. If it is safe to do so, the Charity will evaluate hosting its annual reception to continue growing its network of supporters in the U.K., and to educate business professionals on how impact investing can shape development at the grassroots level.

7. Responsibilities of Directors for the Financial Statements

The Directors are responsible for preparing the report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice. Charity law in England and Wales requires the Directors to prepare financial statements for each financial period which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Charity and of the incoming resources and application of resources of the Charity for that period.

In preparing those financial statements, the Directors are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently;
- observe the methods and principles of the Charities SORP;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, subject to any departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements; and
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the activities of the Charity will continue.

The Directors are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the Charity and enables them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2011, the Charity (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 and the provisions of the governing document. The Directors are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities. The Directors are responsible for the maintenance and integrity of the Charity and financial information included in the Charity's website.



I. Accounting Policies

The principal accounting policies adopted, judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty in the preparation of the financial statements are as follows:

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the Charities Act 2011, the Companies Act 2006 and in accordance with the Charities Statement of Recommended Practice (Charities SORP (FRS 102)) and Financial Reporting Standard 102 (FRS 102). The financial statements are drawn up on the historical cost basis of accounting.

The Charity meets the definition of a public benefit entity under FRS 102.

Going Concern

There are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue and accordingly the accounts have been drawn up on a going concern basis.

Income recognition

Voluntary income and donations (including legacies) are accounted for once the Charity has entitlement to the income, it is probable the income will be received and the amount of income receivable can be reliably measured. Income from the recovery of tax on gift aided donations is accounted for in the period to which the relevant donation is received. Grant income is recognised on a receivable basis.

Interest on funds held on deposit is included when receivable and the amount can be measured reliably by the Charity; this is normally upon notification of the interest paid or payable by the bank.

Expenditure recognition

Expenditure is accrued as soon as a liability is considered probable, and the amount of obligation can be measured reliably. The Charity is not registered for VAT and accordingly expenditure includes VAT where appropriate.

Charitable expenditure includes those costs in fulfilling the Charity's principal objects, as outlined in the Report of the Directors. These include grants payable and governance costs.

Grants payable are payments made to third parties in the furtherance of the charitable objects of the Charity. In the case of an unconditional grant offer this is accrued once the recipient has been notified of the grant award. The notification gives the recipient a reasonable expectation that they will receive the one-year or multi-year grant. Grants awards that are subject to the recipient fulfilling performance conditions are only accrued when the recipient has been notified of the grant and any remaining unfulfilled condition attaching to that grant is outside of the control of the Charity.

Provisions for grants are made when the intention to make a grant has been communicated to the recipient but there is uncertainty as to the timing of the grant or the amount of grant payable.

Governance costs comprise all costs involving the public accountability of the charity and its compliance with regulation and good practice. These costs include costs related to statutory independent examination and legal fees.

Debtors

Debtors are included at the settlement amount due. Prepayments are valued at the amount prepaid.

Cash at bank and in hand

Cash at bank and in hand includes cash and short term highly liquid investments with a short maturity of three months or less from the date of opening of the deposit.

I. Accounting Policies (continued)

Creditors and provisions

Creditors and provisions are recognised where the charity has a present obligation arising from a past event that will probably result in the transfer of funds to a third party and the amount due to settle the obligation can be measured or estimated reliably. Creditors and provisions are recognised at their settlement amount.

Fund accounting

The funds held by the charity are either:

- Unrestricted general funds - these are funds which can be used in accordance with the charitable objects at the discretion of the Directors.
- Restricted funds - these are funds that can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.
