Structure, governance and management

Members of the PCC are either ex-officio or elected by the Annual Parochial Church Meeting in accordance with the Church Representation Rules.

The PCC currently meets on a monthly basis.

A management team oversees and coordinate activities, organise support and deal with operational and financial activities within the authority given it by the PCC. It also serves to advise and support the PCC on the development and implementation of its vision as well as operational and financial matters. It currently meets on a bi-weekly basis.

Members of the management team include the rector, church wardens, treasurer and the leaders of each of the three teams which have been set up to cover the key visionary activities below.

Objectives and activities

The Incumbent and PCC have the responsibility of promoting the pastoral, evangelistic, ecumenical and social mission of the church. St Mary's aims to be a growing community of Christian people who desire to know Jesus better, to share our faith confidently with those around us and to demonstrate this in giving loving service to all.

Our vision incorporates the following three key activities:

Knowing Jesus - This is about strengthening our relationship with God, empowered by the bible and enabled by individual and communal prayer.

Sharing Faith - This is about communicating our faith with our Church family, and others we meet each day.

Loving Service - This is about taking actions which demonstrate Jesus' love for us. Through these actions, we aim to make a positive difference to people's lives in our village community and beyond.

Achievements and performance

Church attendance

There are 247 (2019: 254) parishioners on the Church Electoral Roll, a few of whom are not resident within the parish.

Normal services were suspended as a result of the Covid-19 pandemic. A virtual Sunday 10a.m. service was introduced on Zoom with the average number of connections being 88.

During periods when the lockdown permitted 8am and 9am Sunday services were held in the church with an average attendance of 18 and 11 respectively.

The weekly average attendance throughout 2019 was 146 adults and 19 children and young persons.

Review of the year

The Covid-19 pandemic and resulting lockdowns have had a major impact on church activities with the closure of the church for services and the church hall.

We were able to respond rapidly to the challenge of cancelled communal worship by providing a virtual 10am Sunday service using Zoom. This involved pulling together a ministerial team, technical, musical and choral talents from within the church. This service was accessed by St Mary's and friends in the wider UK but also in Uganda, Kenya, the USA and Australia. Saturday morning prayers were also held virtually via Zoom.

When the lockdown was eased the church was opened daily for private prayer and later for limited services at 8am and 9am on Sundays. We are most thankful for the regular cleaners and the volunteers from the church for cleaning the church to meet Covid-19 cleaning requirements, enabling the church to be open.

During the year we held various other virtual services and meetings including Christingle, a Crib service, Remembrance service, Carol service, weekday morning prayers, youth meetings, family activities such as Footprints and Messy Church, Men's ministry and House Groups. We have also significantly increased our online presence, most notably via a wide range of videos to engage young people on YouTube and an increased presence on social media.

A major focus has been on providing pastoral support to our Church family and the wider community, working with a range of local charity partners. A wonderful, dedicated team has kept in touch with those at risk of isolation during the pandemic and worked to ensure our friends and neighbours have the supplies and support they need. We also offered a prayer line. During the lockdown members of the church provided support to the Leatherhead Community fridge by helping to deliver food parcels and also supported Community Coronavirus Care. We started a Bereavement Café which, when unable to meet in the hall, became a Walk & Talk. Unfortunately, this also had to be suspended during lockdown but will restart when restrictions allow.

Our Communications Team has worked hard to keep people informed. A weekly bulletin is distributed to the church community via e-mail with paper copies delivered to those not online. Our website is regularly updated and provides links to recorded virtual services. A new banner was prepared for display on the bothy and relevant posters for our notice boards.

Early in the year we received sufficient funding from donors and grants to undertake the internal planned improvements to the church hall. This covered the refurbishment of the foyer and toilets with the addition of a toilet for the disabled. The work was done during June and July, taking advantage of the lockdown.

We are delighted that Julie Partridge completed her training for Ordained Local Ministry in July and was ordained Deacon on the 11th of October.

In September 2020 we launched 'LoveFetcham', an initiative that allows us to work together with others in our community, including other churches, for the benefit of the community in which we live. Our hope is that we can demonstrate our love in as many ways as possible to as many people as possible, through the provision of both financial and practical hands-on support.

After more than five years the Reverend Andrew Smith's time as Rector ended on 15th November. St Mary's therefore entered an interregnum and is following the process to fill the vacancy. We are most grateful to Andrew and Jenny for their leadership and service while they were with us and wish them well as they settle into the next stage of life in Worthing.

The PCC met 9 times during 2020 to oversee these and other matters. The Management team, (acting as the PCC's Standing Committee) met as needed during the crisis, settling down to bi-weekly meetings to deal with the operational and financial activities within its authority, as well as developing plans and actions to support the vision.

Financial review

Income for the year was £245,300 (£198,600 – 2019). Expenditure was £250,200 (£197,500 – 2019). Overall, there was a deficit for the year of £4,900 (Surplus £1,000 – 2019).

Income

The overall income was up £46,700 on 2019. This was primarily due to successful Stewardship Campaigns which raised £43,000 with gift aid (£16,200 – 2019) in single donations. In addition, £40,100 with gift aid (£15,000 – 2019)) was received from donations and grants for the project to install a disabled toilet and refurbish the toilets and foyer in the hall. Advanced income amounting to £37,500 including gift aid was also received during the year to be made available for use in the general running of the church in 2021 and has therefore been deferred.

As a result of the Covid-19 lockdown restrictions on the church and church hall income from cash collections and hall lettings were down on 2019 £4,000 and £8,500 respectively.

Expenditure

The overall expenditure was up £52,700 on 2019.

This was primarily due to the expenditure of £53,900 (£5,100 – 2019) on the project to provide new toilets and a disabled toilet in the church hall.

The PCC made donations of £22,400 to home and overseas missions which was up £6,500 on 2019. The increase largely relates to donation allocations from tithing carried forward from the last two years.

There was an increase of £1,000 in the Parish Share cost and £3,100 in Staff costs.

As a result of the Covid-19 lockdown restrictions there were savings as follows:

Other Ministry costs £2,000, Hall running costs £1,900, Administration costs £1,500.

Youth Ministry costs £ 1,000 and Church Music £1,000.

Reserves policy

Unrestricted reserves were £100,100 (£91,200 – 2019) at the year end.

The unrestricted reserves have been allocated as follows:

- £48,000 being three month's expenditures to cover cash flow requirements.
- £11,100 for major maintenance.
- £1,200 for unallocated tithed charitable giving.
- £39,800 to cover the planned deficit for 2021 and contingencies.

The restricted reserves were £3,000 (£16,700 – 2019) at the year end and were as follows:

- £1,300 for hall project (ramp)
- £1,700 for choir fund.

In addition, there is a deferred income of £39,500 of which £37,500 will be available for the general running of the church once a new rector is in place.

The ongoing costs of running the church and providing our ministry exceed the regular income. The gap has in the past been covered by single donations.

The 2020 Stewardship Campaign was very successful in increasing our reserves and has put the church in a strong position to cover future activities.

3. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

BASIS OF ACCOUNTING

The financial statements have been prepared under the Charities Act 2011 in accordance with the Church Accounting Regulations 2006 and comply with the current Charities SORP and applicable accounting standard FRS 102. They have been prepared under the historical cost convention and include all transactions, assets and liabilities for which the PCC is responsible in law. They do not include the accounts of church groups that owe their main affiliation to another body, nor those that are informal gatherings of church members.

FUNDS

Unrestricted funds are used by the PCC for general purposes.

Designated funds are used for a particular purpose but are unrestricted and may be transferred to unrestricted funds for general purposes.

Restricted funds may only be applied to the purposes for which they were set up. The PCC does not invest separately for each fund. Interest is apportioned on an equitable basis. Amounts received specifically for mission and relief are treated as restricted funds.

INCOMING RESOURCES

Collections, planned giving and donations are recognised when received unless they are given in advance when they are recognised as income in the periods they relate to. Any Income Tax recoverable on income is recognised on the same basis as the income. Legacies are accounted for when it is known that they have been made. Funds raised by church functions, sales of books and bank interest are all recognised when received. Annex letting income is allocated to the year it relates to. Car parking income is accrued. All incoming resources are accounted for gross.

RESOURCES EXPENDED

Grants and donations are generally accounted for when paid over. It is the PCC's practice to tithe 10% of the prior year's giving income and most other income to charitable causes outside of the church. Restricted income is only tithed where the donor has opted for this to be done. Where the full 10% has not been paid over a designated reserve is set aside for the balance for allocation in the future.

All other expenditure is generally recognised when incurred and is accounted for gross.

FIXED ASSETS

Consecrated and benefice property of any kind is excluded from the accounts in accordance with s.10 (2)(a) and (c) of the Charities Act 2011. No value is placed on moveable church furnishings held by the Rector and churchwardens on special trust for the PCC as they are considered to be inalienable property, listed in the church inventory. This is available for inspection. All capital expenditure incurred, whether maintenance or improvement is written off in the year of purchase, as are other fixtures, fittings and equipment.

4. INCOME

A stewardship appeal was made during September and this with other responses during the year raised £42,993 (including gift aid).

Donations of £18,572 (including gift aid) and grants of £20,200 were also received for the project to provide toilet facilities for the disabled and refurbish the toilet facilities and foyer in the church hall.

Donations of £37,500 were also received to be available for use in 2021 for the general running of the church and have therefore been accounted for as deferred income.

Fetcham Community Centre (Greenhouse).

In partnership with the Fetcham Scouts St Mary's is seeking to replace the existing Scout Hut with a new building for a community centre. This is intended to serve as a hub for a range of community partnerships which will cater for people of all ages. A range of community services is expected to be offered.

Peaceful Streams Community Interest Company has been set up to build and manage the facility and is raising the finance from donations and grants for this purpose. Our donation of £4,000 was paid to this company as a contribution towards the building costs. Two members of the PCC: Andy Black and Martin Roberts are directors of this company.

12. RESERVES

It is policy to hold reserves to cover three months expenditure (£48,000).

The unrestricted fund (£87,798) provides this cover plus additional cover for any planned shortfall between income and expenditure in future years.

The Major & Projects Fund (£11,126) covers maintenance required following the quinquennial inspection.

The Mission & Charity Giving Fund (£1,200) represents the balance still to be allocated of funds set aside from the tithing of income.

The Hall Project Fund (£1,275) represents donations received for the planned project to provide outside ramp for access by wheelchair users.

The Choir fund (£1,733) resulted from a specific donations by a church members.

**ST MARY'S FETCHAM
INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE P C C**

I report on the accounts for the year ended 31st December 2020 which are set out on pages 6 to 13.

Respective responsibilities of Trustees and Independent Examiner

Basis of Independent Examiner's Statement

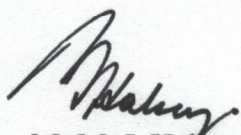
My examination was carried out in accordance with the General Directions given by the Charity Commission.
