We believe that our Christian faith should be seen in action serving others. The church is fully involved with the Disabled People's Contact to help the elderly and disabled by having a day centre on its premises. The church encourages other agencies that are in sympathy with our general aims to use our building and help others. As part of the Southwark and Deptford Circuit it is committed to the wider work of the church in the world. As a Mission we take seriously John Wesley's words 'The world is my parish'. The church represents in its membership many different countries of the world, particularly from Africa, and so our service takes on a global significance. Deptford Methodist Church/Mission welcomes all by opening its doors to everyone whatever their situation.

The church congregation has returned in smaller numbers as the restrictions of the pandemic lifted. It has taken time for people to regain confidence and re-establish patterns of church going. Our work with young people continues, though similarly affected by changed habits due to the pandemic.

The Disabled People's Contact Centre has returned in person and continues to meet the needs of those who otherwise would be isolated. It provides a programme of food and activities; the church offers a weekly service of worship that enables people to attend church while at the centre.

The church provides office and counselling space for various organisations; it continues the long term relationship with Second Wave that works with young people in the borough. Along with the shop that raises money for the Disabled People's Contact Centre, the space at Deptford Mission is available for other community organisations (e.g. Karate classes) and the church collaborates with other churches in responding to the needs of poverty with donations to local foodbanks and gifts for children and adults at Christmas.

The church aims to hold about six months' worth of expenses in reserves, with a small surplus to pay for emergency repairs. The church is still recovering from the effects of the pandemic and our bad debt provision is now about £47k for rent receivable.

examiner's statement**



Notes to the Accounts

1 Basis of accounting

These accounts have been prepared on the basis of historic cost (except that investments are shown at market value) in accordance with Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP 2005) and the Charities Act 1993. There has been no change to the accounting policies since last year. The format of the SOFA balance sheet takes advantage of the small charity concessions set out in the SORP.

2 Funds

The funds held constitute: General Funds held for any purpose of the charity which are Unrestricted, Restricted funds which are held for a narrower purpose and Endowment funds which represent gifts, the capital normally being unavailable for spending, and the income from which is either Restricted or Unrestricted. Details of each material fund are disclosed in the final note to these accounts. Any fund may be held in ways other than in cash.

3 Accounting policies

Incoming Resources

These are included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SOFA) when the church becomes entitled to the resources; the trustees are virtually certain they will receive the resources and the monetary value can be measured with sufficient reliability.

Resources Expended

Expenditure is recognised when a liability is incurred, or a constructive obligation arises that results in the payment being unavoidable.

Liability recognition

Liabilities are recognised as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the church to pay out resources. Future income must not be anticipated (SORP 2005).

Tangible fixed assets for use by church

Tangible fixed assets are capitalised if they can be used for more than one year, and cost at least (say) £1000. They are valued at cost or a reasonable value on receipt. Where cost is not available, the Church Council may provide a reasonable estimate of cost or of the buildings' current value to the church. An estimate based on insurance value should take account of the fact that cover will be based on demolition and reinstating the current building and not the original cost less accumulated depreciation. A professional valuation is not required, but if available use that figure. Provision is made for depreciation where appropriate.

Investment properties

Investment properties - Properties not used for the purposes of the charity (and never used for that purpose). A professional valuation is not required, but if available use that figure. The insured value may be used.

Investments

Investments are valued in the balance sheet at market value at the year end. Investment income is included in the accounts when receivable and any gains or losses on revaluation at the year end are shown in the SOFA.

Include investments held with the Central Finance Board. Do not include Deposit Funds, such as TIF (Trustees Interest Fund) held via Trustees for Methodist Church Purposes. These latter funds should be shown separately.

Debtors and Prepayments

Show amounts owing to the Church or prepayments made.

Creditors

Show amounts owing by the Church and any amounts accrued as due in the following year.

Loans

If the Church has borrowed any money, please give the information in the designated section. Loans made to Churches may be confidential and may be free of interest. It is not necessary to breach confidentiality in recording sources: use the word 'Individuals' if appropriate.

Endowment Funds

Where the Church holds money which cannot be spent but must be retained (as capital) to generate an income the money or assets to be retained are known as an Endowment Fund. The capital should be shown in the appropriate column in the Balance Sheet. The income generated may be restricted or unrestricted depending upon the terms of the endowment.

Net current assets/liabilities

Deduct Creditors from Total current assets.

Deduct net current assets/liabilities from the total of fixed and current assets.

Net assets totals must agree with Total Funds held.

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
