The trustees present their Trustees' Annual Report, combining the Directors' Report and Trustees' Report, and the unaudited financial statements for the financial year ended 28 February 2025.

MCF Life Church has had a good year having services both in Castle Bromwich and Coleshill. This year has also seen new people coming along to the services.

Our Monday morning bible study continues to be well attended as do the Tuesday evening study groups via zoom. The Wednesday evening prayer meeting is also regularly well attended.

The school assemblies in both Coleshill and Meriden continue to be very well received and are popular both with the children and the teaching staff. There has also been an addition to the team this year.

One of the big events is at Christmas where we do 'Journey to the Stable' which is the Christmas story told on a local farm with shepherds, Kings, and a grumpy innkeeper is still a joy to do and includes people from different fellowships coming together to all take part. About 200 children attending over the two days from many of the schools in the surrounding areas.

The police chaplaincy is going well with one of the chaplains retiring this year due to ill health.

We have several projects for new work both in Castle Bromwich and Coleshill which we are in the process of preparing for, and are hopefully looking to move forward with these during March/April 2025. We are also making enquiries regarding the revamp of our website.

Financial Review

The results for the financial year are set out on page 7 and additional notes are provided showing income and expenditure in greater detail.

At the end of the financial year the charity has assets of £11,467 (2024 - £8,781) and liabilities of £600 (2024 - £0.00). The net assets of the charity have increased by £2,086.

ACCOUNTING POLICIES

for the financial year ended 28 February 2025

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis under the historical cost convention, modified to include certain items at fair value. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) "Accounting and Reporting by Charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (the FRSSE) (effective 1 January 2015)", the Companies Act 2006 and "The Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2015)".

As permitted by the Companies Act 2006, the charity has varied the standard formats in that act for the Statement of Financial Activities and the Balance Sheet. Departures from the standard formats are to comply with the requirements of the Charities SORP and are in compliance with section 4.7, 10.6 and 15.2 of that SORP.

Cash flow statement

The charity has availed of the exemption in FRS 1 from the requirement to produce a cash flow statement because it is classified as a small charity.

Restricted funds

Restricted funds represent income received which can only be used for particular purposes, as specified by the donors. Such purposes are within the overall objectives of the charity.

Unrestricted designated funds

Unrestricted funds consist of General and Designated funds.

- General funds represent amounts which are expendable at the discretion of the board, in furtherance of the objectives of the charity.
- Designated funds comprise unrestricted funds that the board has, at its discretion, set aside for particular purposes. These designations have an administrative purpose only, and do not legally restrict the board's discretion to apply the fund.

Incoming Resources

Income is recognised by inclusion in the Statement of Financial Activities only when the charity is legally entitled to the income, performance conditions attached to the item(s) of income have been met, the amounts involved can be measured with sufficient reliability and it is probable that the income will be received by the charity.

Resources Expended

Expenditure is analysed between costs of charitable activities and raising funds. The costs of each activity are separately accumulated and disclosed, and analysed according to their major components. Expenditure is recognised when a legal or constructive obligation exists as a result of a past event, a transfer of economic benefits is required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be reliably measured. Support costs are those functions that assist the work of the charity but cannot be attributed to one activity. Such costs are allocated to activities in proportion to staff time spent or other suitable measure for each activity.

Taxation

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events have occurred at that date that will result in an obligation to pay more tax in the future, or a right to pay less tax in the future. Timing differences are temporary differences between the charity's taxable profits and its results as stated in the financial statements.

Deferred tax is measured on an undiscounted basis at the tax rates that are anticipated to apply in the periods in which the timing differences are expected to reverse, based on tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date.

After a difficult start to 2023, MCF Life Church has continued to move forward looking to grow spiritually deeper in the Lord.

Through the year we have alternated our Sunday meetings between Coleshill Town Hall and Southfields Farm in Coleshill, and have seen a number of new people join us over this period including some Ukrainian refugees.

We continue to reach out to the community with our 'Church at' meetings, where we have done a number of successful 'Church at the Farm' BBQ's etc during the summer months and other 'Church at' meetings in both the Town Hall and Southfields Farm during the non summer months, and have seen a number of local the community and friends attend.

The 'Open The Book' (OTB) school assemblies are continuing to go well and we are now in two schools in Coleshill and one in Meriden. Although OTB is run by MCF Life Church there are a number of volunteers from other fellowships within Coleshill on the team. We have also done a number of joint church events at St.Laurence CofE church in Meriden for the children from Meriden CofE Primary school.

Our midweek meetings include Study groups, craft groups and prayer meetings and monthly men's breakfasts which are proving very popular. We have also recently started a seeking meeting once a month on a Saturday evening with two other AOG fellowships, where we look to connect in a deeper way with the Holy Spirit.

The Prison ministry continues to go well and the team are encouraged by the number of inmates coming along to the Sunday services, with some taking a real interest in the bible and the things of the Lord.

One of the main events during the Christmas period is 'Journey to the Stable' where many classes from local schools come along to Southfields Farm in Coleshill and experience the Christmas story played out with shepherds, kings, and a grumpy innkeeper. This is always very popular with both the children and the teachers who always enjoy coming along and give really positive feedback.

This year an extra member of the fellowship has joined the Police chaplaincy team, a very important and welcomed addition to the work among the North Warwickshire Police service.

This year we felt led to stop the Sunday morning services in Castle Bromwich and bring all the congregation together to build relationships both with God and with one another, which we did in March. As a result of doing this and as directed by the Lord, MCF-Life Church is now looking to plant a new fellowship/work to reach the community in and around the Castle Bromwich area, working in partnership with other fellowships to bring together the necessary resources to achieve this, in line with God's vision and calling.

We as a fellowship continue to look to God as our guiding light in a very difficult and often dark world, and to try to make a difference wherever we can to help and support those in our community and around the world who are less fortunate than ourselves.
