To bring relief of poverty and sickness and to advance the education of orphans and the poor children of India through the provision of financial assistance, support, education, accommodation, food and medical treatment and to promote, further or support any similar charitable institutions at such time or times and in such a manner as the trustees may in their absolute discretion think fit.

The advancement of education
Working under the guidance of the Indian Government to provide extra tuition to approximately 80 of the poorest children in the area. Many of these come from generations of day labourers who have received no formal education at all and still sign documents by means of a thumb print.

The advancement of Citizenship or Community
Development and the advancement of health or the saving of lives Orphan Hope (India) have provided funds to build a number of community centres in the rural areas of Bhimavaram which are used as medical centres as well as meeting places for the whole community, one of these is in a leper colony where most people suffer from leprosy, HIV aids or other illnesses which cause them to be treated as outcasts. This community centre is also used as the local hospital as well as the "Soup Kitchen" to feed the very poor. This year this building has been extended to accommodate sleeping areas on the first floor.

Medical needs have been provided for using funds raised by Orphan Hope (India). Children have been vaccinated, doctors are made available and paid for, and any medicines needed are purchased and administered.

The prevention or relief of poverty
Clothes, shoes and food have been provided for all the orphans, street kids, and the poor and needy children of the area who attend the school/orphanage as well as providing food for other orphanages in the Andre Pradesh region.

A number of visits to schools in the UK have taken place to teach the children about how different life is here when compared with India.

During Trustees meetings, all things are discussed in depth and decisions are made as to what areas Orphan Hope (India) can and will help under the guidance of the Charities Commission regarding public benefit.

During our meetings we decide firstly if the funds are available for a need, then if the need is within our objectives as a charity, and then if providing the funds will be of benefit in general

On rare occasions, donations are made with specific guidelines. These donations are not used for anything other than those specified by the donor.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

Providing free education to a high standard for the poor and needy children of South Eastern India.

All children are provided with free uniforms, shoes, bags, books etc to enable them to attend local government schools full time and use our facilities for extra tuition in the evenings 6 days a week.

All children are still given health checks but no longer routinely vaccinated unless a need is flagged.

Informal education for parents and carers is also provided, along with summer school and home visits.

The Shekinah Centre has now been completed with the extension to the upper floor to include toilets and showers.

Funds have been provided for a number of other community centres to be built or at least part built where funds would not allow for total support.

Many of the community centres are being used as medical centres, drop in centres and sheltered accommodation for the homeless as well as giving extra tuition to the children of the area.

Funds have been provided to buy food and clothing for other orphans within the Andhra Pradesh region.

Within the UK, talks have taken place at local high schools, giving children an insight to what life is like for the poorer people of India.

The aims of Orphan Hope (India) is to help support widows & orphans, and the poor and needy within the Andhra Pradesh area of South East India.

How we do this:

There are a number of schemes that Orphan Hope finance in this area.

The Shekinah Centre -

This is headed up by Vijay and his wife Rita Jessi. They now have 2 children, Donna Isabella aged 8, and Nancy Grace aged 2. The family live in the centre and from it they provide before and after school lessons for the poor and needy children of the area. This year 76 children have been attending and most of them have achieved higher than average grades in their end of year exams. We feel this is remarkable when we consider that these children are from generations of uneducated people who even today sign documents with a thumb print! Many of these children are receiving scholarships for further education, and at least 75 who have gone through our system and are now grown, have good jobs and are able to support their whole families because of this.

The widow's programme is also ongoing. Food and clothing as well as emotional support is provided at the centre.

The approximate costs for this work is £8000.00 for the year! This covers the expenses for Vijay and Rita Jessi, as well as providing school uniforms, books, bags, shoes etc. for each child to be able to attend the local government schools; as well as the food and clothing for the widows, and a community meal one or two times throughout the year!

The Shekinah Centre has become a hub of the community, and Orphan Hope (India) is very happy to be able to continue this work.

Fresh Water Bore Wells -

Around 2016 Orphan Hope (India) began funding the drilling of fresh water wells in remote villages of the Andhra Pradesh area. Our aim is to have complete well number 50 by the end of December 2024. Many people have provided funds for a well for various reasons – often in

memory of a loved one who has passed. These wells provide clean fresh water for whole villages, where once the only source of water would be dirty rivers or even worse, man made water ponds – many people become ill and even die from using dirty water. At present, the cost of one bore well is £1600.00. The contractor keeps the price the same no matter how deep he has to drill – he sees that this work helps the people and so keeps the price the same – the normal policy for bore wells is that you are charged depending on how deep it needs to be drilled! We are very thankful to have a good relationship with this contractor because we always know how much we need to raise in order to finance the next well!

Leprosy & HIV –

The work we do with Syam & Vijaya who head up the work at the leprosy centre is actually quite minimal. They never ask for funding unless they are desperate. Orphan Hope (India) financed the building of their community centre, which is used as a community centre, hospital, soup kitchen and even a hostel.

There is no real budget for this work. A few people donate to this cause specifically, and so the funds are transferred whenever the need arises.

The Dumps project –

At present there are no funds for this work. Our aim is to try to raise awareness that over 75 families live on the dump 24/7. Their only income is from selling items they may find whilst searching through the rubbish dumped there.

We hope that we can raise funds to provide essentials for these poor families on a permanent basis. However we do realise that the funds may not be available, and so we may have to look at doing something less formal and on a less regular basis. We will discuss this in more detail at our next meeting!
