Trustees report

for the year ended 31 March 2025

The trustees present their annual report together with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended March 31 2025 which are also prepared to meet the requirements for a directors' report and accounts for Companies act purposes.

REPORTING FRAMEWORK

The financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2011, the Companies Act 2006, the Memorandum and Articles of Association, and Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) (effective 1 January 2015), referred to as the Charities SORP (FRS 102).

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

Organisational structure

There are currently three trustees.

In the event of a trustee wishing to withdraw, the remaining trustees, with guidance from the general membership would identify and appoint a new trustee. The new trustee would be made aware of the work and responsibilities of the trust and the requirements of compliance with the formal obligations as stipulated by the Charity Commission, by the remaining trustees.

Risk management

The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error. The trustees can confirm that they have done this.

Governance Update

During the financial year 2024/25, one of our Trustees, **Mrs Karen Hill**, retired from the Board. The Trustees wish to place on record their appreciation for her valuable contribution to the Foundation.

In accordance with **Clause 3.2 of the Constitution**, the process of appointing a new trustee is underway. The appointment will be made following consultation with, and formal approval by, **Sri Sri Ravi Shankar**, ensuring alignment with the Foundation's vision and governance standards. The new trustee will be formally invited to join the Board once this process is complete.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

- The preservation of health for the public benefit by educating the public in the teachings and yoga practices of Sri Sri Ravishankar;
- Relief of poverty, distress and suffering in any part of the world for public benefit
- Any other purposes for the public benefit, at the discretion of the Trustees which are exclusively Charitable.

The Foundation means to achieve these objectives by several means being:

- promote and support of courses promulgated by Sri Sri Ravishankar and the Art of Living Organisation world wide, which fulfil the criteria of the charitable purposes and bring individuals to preserve and improve their health so that they may experience and appreciate the exercise of Human Values in their day to day life.
- The Foundation utilises the voluntary services of trained Art of Living teachers to teach breathing techniques (specifically "Sudarshan Kriya Technique" promulgated by Sri Sri Ravishankar, Yoga classes, Mediation courses for the general benefit of public.
- By making donation for relief of poverty and distress and suffering in various parts of the world for the public benefit

Public benefit

The trustees have had due regard to the Charity Commission guidance on public benefit.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

During the financial year 2024/25, the Foundation successfully expanded its fundraising activities through a greater number of events. As a result, income from charitable activities rose to £41,838, compared with £9,237 in the previous year.

In line with the strategy outlined in last year's accounts, the Trustees opened interest-bearing accounts to maximize the use of reserves. This generated £3,073 in interest income, a notable increase from £612 in 2023/24.

By contrast, donations were significantly lower than the prior year. In 2023/24, the Foundation's principal fundraising drive supported the World Cultural Festival in Washington DC, raising £108,341. No comparable campaign was undertaken in 2024/25, resulting in donations of £10,830, which includes £871 earmarked for a permanent centre. Although the centre project remains on hold, donors continue to contribute toward this initiative. Overall, total revenue for the year ending 31 March 2025 was £55,741, compared with £131,662 in the previous year.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Overview

The Foundation recorded a surplus of £12,524 in 2024/25, compared with a deficit of £744 in 2023/24. This improvement reflects careful management of expenses related to the charity's operations and its support for causes aligned with Sri Sri Ravi Shankar.

Reserves increased accordingly, closing at £99,112. The Trustees consider this a healthy position and believe the Foundation remains financially sustainable, supported by ongoing events and donation drives.

Reserves Policy

The reserves policy remains consistent with previous years, maintaining two principal funds:

- **Restricted Fund** – Donations ring-fenced for specific projects, primarily the London Centre. At 31 March 2025, the restricted fund stood at £48,669, of which £44,725 related to the London Centre and the balance to Youth Courses.
- **Unrestricted Fund** – General reserves available for day-to-day operations, advance payments for venues, and support of charitable initiatives aligned with Sri Sri Ravi Shankar. At 31 March 2025, the unrestricted fund totalled £50,443.

Summary

Despite reduced donations compared with the prior year, the Foundation achieved a surplus through event-driven fundraising and prudent financial management. With balanced reserves and a clear policy, the charity remains well-positioned to sustain its mission and future activities

- observe the methods and principles in the Charities SORP 2015 (FRS 102);
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable UK Accounting Standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charitable company will continue in operation.

The trustees are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charitable company and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charitable company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.



Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of

Art of Living Foundation

I report to the charity trustees on my examination of the accounts of the Company for the year ended 31 March 2025.

Responsibilities and basis of report

As the trustees of the Company (and also its directors for the purposes of company law) you are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the requirements of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 ('the 2005 Act'), the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended) and the Companies Act 2006 ('the 2006 Act'). You are satisfied that the accounts of the Company are not required by charity or company law to be audited and have chosen instead to have an independent examination.

Having satisfied myself that the accounts of the Company are not required to be audited under Part 16 of the 2006 Act and are eligible for independent examination, I report in respect of my examination of the Company's accounts carried out under section 44 (1) (c) of the 2005 Act and section 145 of the Charities Act 2011 ('the 2011 Act'). In carrying out my examination I have followed the requirements of Regulation 11 of the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended) and the Directions given by the Charity Commission under section 145(5)(b) of the 2011 Act.

Independent examiner's statement

Since the Company is required by company law to prepare its accounts on an accruals basis and is registered as a charity in Scotland your examiner must be a member of a body listed in Regulation 11(2) of the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended). I can confirm that I am qualified to undertake the examination because I am a registered member of the Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales which is one of the listed bodies.

I have completed my examination. I confirm that no matters have come to my attention in connection with the examination giving me cause to believe:

1. accounting records were not kept as required by section 386 of the 2006 Act and Regulation 4 of the 2006 Accounts Regulations; or
2. the accounts do not accord with those records with the accounting requirements of Regulation 8 of the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006; or
3. the accounts do not comply with the accounting requirements of section 396 of the 2006 Act other than any requirement that the accounts give a 'true and fair view which is not a matter considered as part of an independent examination; or



Notes to the accounts for the year ended 31 March 2025

1 Accounting policies

The principal accounting policies adopted, judgments and key sources of estimation uncertainty in the preparation of the financial statements are as follows:

a Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015) - (Charities SORP (FRS 102)), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Companies

The charity has applied Update Bulletin 1 as published on 2 February 2016 and does not include a cash flow statement on the grounds that it is applying FRS 102 section 1A.

Art of Living Foundation (Uk) meets the definition of a public benefit entity under FRS102. Assets and liabilities are initially recognised at historical cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant accounting policy note.

b Reconciliation with previous Generally Accepted Accounting Practice

In preparing the accounts, the trustees have considered whether in applying the accounting policies required by FRS 102 and the Charities SORP FRS 102 the restatement of comparative items was required. No such restatement was required.

c Preparation of the accounts on a going concern basis

The trustees consider that there are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue as a going concern.

There are no key judgments which the trustees have made which have a significant effect on the accounts.

The trustees do not consider that there are any sources of estimation uncertainty at the reporting date that have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying amount of assets and liabilities within the next reporting period.

d Income

Income is recognised when the charity has entitlement to the funds, any performance conditions attached to the item(s) of income have been met, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Income from government and other grants, whether 'capital' grants or 'revenue' grants, is recognised when the charity has entitlement to the funds, any performance conditions attached to the grants have been met, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably and is not deferred.

Income received in advance of a provision of a specified service is deferred until the criteria for income recognition are met.

e Donated services and facilities

Donated professional services and donated facilities are recognised as income when the charity has control over the item, any conditions associated with the donated item have been met, the receipt of economic benefit from the use by the charity of the item is probable and that economic benefit can be measured reliably. In accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102), general volunteer time is not recognised; refer to the trustees' annual report for more information about their contribution.

On receipt, donated professional services and donated facilities are recognised on the basis of the value of the gift to the charity which is the amount the charity would have been willing to pay to obtain services or facilities of equivalent economic benefit on the open market; a corresponding amount is then recognised in expenditure in the period of receipt.

f Interest receivable

Interest on funds held on deposit is included when receivable and the amount can be measured reliably by the charity; this is normally upon notification of the interest paid or payable by the Bank.

g Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are available to spend on activities that further any of the purposes of charity.

Designated funds are unrestricted funds of the charity which the trustees have decided at their discretion to set aside to use for a specific purpose.

Restricted funds are donations which the donor has specified are to be solely used for particular areas of the charity's work or for specific projects being undertaken by the charity.

h Expenditure and irrecoverable VAT

Expenditure is recognised once there is a legal or constructive obligation to make a payment to a third party, it is probable that settlement will be required and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably.

Irrecoverable VAT is charged as a cost against the activity for which the expenditure was incurred.

i Tangible fixed assets

Fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Individual items costing less than £100 are not capitalised.

l Debtors

Trade and other debtors are recognised at the settlement amount due after any trade discount offered. Prepayments are valued at the amount prepaid net of any trade discounts due.

m Cash at bank and in hand

Cash at bank and cash in hand includes cash and short term highly liquid investments with a short maturity of three months or less from the date of acquisition or opening of the deposit or similar account.

n Creditors and provisions

Creditors and provisions are recognised where the charity has a present obligation resulting from a past event that will probably result in the transfer of funds to a third party and the amount due to settle the obligation can be measured or estimated reliably. Creditors and provisions are normally recognised at their settlement amount after allowing for any trade discounts due.

o Financial instruments

The charity only has financial assets and financial liabilities of a kind that qualify as basic financial instruments. Basic financial instruments are initially recognised at transaction value and subsequently measured at their settlement value with the exception of bank loans which are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

p Pensions

The charity does not currently operate a pension scheme.
