Summary of the purposes of the charity as set out in its governing document	Para 1.17	The main objective of the charity is to continue to practise and further advance the Roman Catholic faith of parish communities run by Missionaries of La Salette, promote religious harmony, justice and peace.
Summary of the main activities in relation to those purposes for the public benefit, in particular, the activities, projects or services identified in the accounts.	Para 1.17 and 1.19	<p>The charity provides priests to 5 catholic parish communities, chaplaincy to 4 hospitals, 7 catholic schools and 1 prison.</p> <p>Chaplaincy is the provision of religious and pastoral services to people within local communities who may have specific needs due to their state of life, who face unique challenges, or who are vulnerable and therefore require special accommodations to be made. Continued operation of individual chaplaincies reflects not only the changing needs of people in their local communities, particularly in relation to social integration and community cohesion. The charity is involved in chaplaincies connected with secular institutions, such as hospitals, prisons.</p> <p>The Youth chaplaincy is responsible for nurturing the character of tomorrow's adults, forming them into active, capable citizens with the confidence required to thrive in modern society. The youth ministry has a paramount importance to the Missionaries of La Salette and is provided on the parish level as well as in the secondary schools connected with our parishes and beyond. Some young people from our parishes went on a Brentwood Diocesan Pilgrimage to Lourdes in July 2025 organised by Brentwood Catholic Youth Service. One of our priests went to Lourdes with the youth. Our priests provide pastoral provision for the needs of Polish communities in Brentwood and East Anglia diocese.</p>

		The Trustees have held a high regard to the guidance issued by Charity Commission on public benefit and wish to record their recognition to the people who support the Congregation of Missionaries of Our Lady of La Salette. Their dedication and positive attitude are greatly appreciated in furtherance of the aims and activities of the Charity.

"Religion helps to provide a moral and ethical framework for people to live by and can play an important part in building social capital and community cohesion". The adherence to, and advancing of, the Catholic faith to the public our parish communities provides an ethical and moral code for parishioners and visitors; it provides services of public worship, including baptisms, weddings and funerals; it contributes to the spiritual well-being of the public; it contributes to the spiritual and moral education of children; it promotes social understanding and cohesion, and contributes to practical ways of addressing social needs such as visiting the sick and housebound, and furthering other charitable purposes. The above is demonstrated by 5000 people attending mass each Sunday together with masses also being said each day in our parishes. The Charity although it's a small organisation has clear aims, a simple structure and short chains of command. Systems for assessing and insuring against all risks to the Charity are in place to ensure that the Charity complies fully with Charity Commission legislation. Para 1.20	<p>Parish life is supported through the provision of clergy and buildings as a result of which many parishioners provide support to the local and national community in improving social cohesion and in many other ways. While the celebration of Mass is mainly in churches owned by the Diocese through its parishes and supported by the curial departments, parishes also reach out to the local community through their activities and support their parishioners through home visits, hospital chaplaincy and a range of courses and other programs.</p> <p><u>Belonging Group</u> is an outreach programme that is currently held monthly on the first Saturday of every month in one of our parishes. Belonging sessions provide hot food, companionship and a warm safe space for anyone in need. Anyone is welcome who may benefit from these sessions or would like to be part of the Belonging outreach programme.</p> <p>The facilitation and nourishment of spiritual life is the principal aim of the charity and while weekly attendance figures and the number of baptisms, confirmations, marriages, etc are indications of the success of the work, performance can also be measured by the continuing strength of our parish communities and the individual journeys of faith of our parishioners. Sick and elderly parishioners received the Eucharist and Sacrament of the Sick, the dying and their relatives received comfort and support. We believe that aiding the grieving process for relatives involves providing consistent, practical, and emotional support that acknowledges the unique nature of their loss. Effective support often focuses on "being there," listening without judgment, and helping with daily tasks, rather than trying to "fix" the pain.</p> <p>The Charity supports various missionary activities run by Missionaries of La Salette in Ukraine and Madagascar.</p>



Review of the Finances of The Congregation of Our Lady of La Salette

Background

I, Andrew Dunn am a tax practitioner and Managing Director of Rodings Tax & Accounting Ltd. I have been producing clergy financial Returns to the Diocese of Brentwood for over 15 years and also act as tax adviser to over 500 ministers of religion.

I was asked by Father Mariusz Fura in February 2026 to review the finances of The Congregation prior to submission of the annual return to the Charity Commissioners.

Brief

I was requested by Father Mariusz Fura in February 2026 to review the financial data of Dagenham, Goodmayes, Harlow, Rainham, and Peterborough and to ensure that the financial data declared by them and subsequently shown within 'the schedule' to be sent to the Charity Commissioners, reflects a true and fair statement of The Congregation.

Objectives

To analyse each bank account and compare the activity of the data declared within the schedule provided and to study the activity of the Restricted Funds and to select one community for detailed examination.

Findings

Goodmayes - I reviewed the file and the bank account statements. The information on the Receipts and Payments Schedule were correctly recorded as were the Restricted Funds.

Rainham – I reviewed the file and the bank account statements. The information on the Receipts and Payments Schedule were correctly recorded as were the Restricted Funds.

Harlow - I reviewed the file and the bank account statements. The information on the Receipts and Payments Schedule were correctly recorded as were the Restricted Funds.

Dagenham - I reviewed the file and the bank account statements. The information on the Receipts and Payments Schedule were correctly recorded as were the Restricted Funds



Peterborough - I reviewed the file and the bank account statements. The information on the Receipts and Payments Schedule were correctly recorded and the Restricted Funds were correctly recorded.

Conclusions

The schedules passed to me do accurately reflect the financial position of the affairs of The Congregation of the Missionaries of Our Lady of La Salette. The recording of data remains at a high standard.

Recommendations

I have no new recommendations to make this year.
