Report of the Board of Trustees

The board of trustees presents its report and the unaudited financial statements for the year ended 31 August 2022.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT
Governing document

The organisation is a charitable company limited by guarantee, incorporated on 22 August 2007 and registered as a charity on 28 October 2009.

The company was established under a Memorandum of Association which established the objects and powers of the charitable company and is governed under its Articles of Association.

Members of the board of trustees

Members of the board of trustees, who are directors for the purpose of company law and trustees for the purpose of charity law, who served during the period and up to the date of this report are set out on page 1.

Every member promises, if the charity is dissolved while he, she or it remains a member or within 12 months afterwards, to pay up to £1 towards the costs of dissolution and the liabilities incurred by the charity while the contributor was a member.

Organisational structure

The board of trustees has overall responsibility for the company and meets regularly, approximately every three months. In addition the sub-committees covering development, membership, finance which normally meet monthly. Two senior managers are appointed by the trustees to manage the day-to-day operations of the charity. To facility effective operations the two appointed manager have delegated authority approved by the trustees, for operational matters including finance, employment and related activity.

Risk management

The board of trustees has conducted its own review of the major risks to which the charity is exposed and systems have been established to mitigate those risks. Significant external risks to funding have led to the development of a strategic plan which will allow for the diversification of funding and activities. Internal risks are minimised by the implementation of procedures for authorisation of all transactions and projects and to ensure quality of delivery for all operational aspects of the charitable company. These procedures are periodically reviewed to ensure that they still meet the needs of the Charity.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES
Objectives and purposes

The objects of the charity are:

- Reduce and Support Gypsy, Traveller and Roma families from any form of violence to or from the community
- Promote good health, wellbeing and advance the education of the Gypsy, Traveller, Roma women, children, and young people. Also through them the men who are in conditions of need, hardship or distress caused by or associated with violence.
- Promote equality of opportunity and good relations between Gypsies, Travellers and Roma women, children, young people and through them the men and settled communities.
- Promote sustainable integration between all communities and recognition of all views and values.
- Support, enable, encourage and provide Gypsies, Travellers and Roma with educational needs and uptake of all other services.
- To encourage Gypsies, Travellers and Roma who get their broader social, support and educational needs met through signposting and referral to other service provision. Also encourage Gypsies, Travellers and Roma to make positive contributions by supporting individuals to become active community members through volunteering and community advocacy. Also provide a signposting and referral service leading to increased take up of other services.

In seeking to achieve these objectives, the trustees have taken due regard to the guidance published by the Charities Commission on public benefit.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

During the last financial year, we have undertaken some changes regarding our accounting practice and financial monitoring system. Previously our monthly bank statement included financial transactions occurring on or after the 10th day of each month and up to the 9th day of the following month. We have now changed the period for our bank statements to start on the 1st day of each month and end on the last day of each month; this is in keeping with our financial monitoring and end-of-year accounting. This has been a success in terms of the monitoring of finances.

COVID -19 has impacted severely in all aspects of life. Gypsy, Romany/Roma and travellers have been at higher risk than most communities due to the health inequalities, which were many combined with poverty and over crowding. These factors including accommodation issues, have made life difficult especially for roadside families. For all families in caravans, social distancing was impossible. We found that many of the elderly and medically vulnerable were not registered at a GP near where they were currently staying. Financial hardship increased due to those who were self-employed finding work dried up. With low literacy and the lack of digital access many struggled to access support. Being unable to follow culture actions around such cases of death in the family meant that for many, they will have to live with the fact that they could not fulfil what they consider to be their duty to family members that had died. During the lockdown, we diverted most of our resources to supporting travellers with crisis due to the Covid-19 pandemic. We were able to be fully operational throughout due to the commitment of staff and volunteers working from home.

Reserves policy

All Restricted and Unrestricted funds are invested back into the running of the Charity.

BENEFITS TO THE LOCAL COMMUNITY

One voice 4 Travellers continues to be a focal point for the local community regardless of Gypsies, Travellers and Roma families and continues to provide a full range of services that are fully inclusive. Our volunteers and staff are reflective of the local communities supporting our 'everyone is welcome' statement.

Our services this year have been well received attracting people of all ages from all Gypsies, Travellers and Roma backgrounds. Our Information, Advice and Guidance projects continues to underpin all of the work delivered by One Voice 4 Travellers.

FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

The charity continues to identify needs within the Gypsy and Traveller community and increase our community development work with the members of the Roma community. This exciting development in our work plan gives a unique position of bringing these communities together to develop a greater understanding and amalgamation of ideas. We will be looking to funding bodies to help us fulfil this fundamental need. Our work will continue to be project based, working to reduce violence to and from the Gypsy, Traveller and Roma community. We will continue to take part and speak at conferences and events where possible.

The 'cultural competency' training program developed by us in partnership with the Gypsy, Travellers and Roma community has become more fully established and is recognised as a need by service providers working within these communities. This training now includes specific topics such as DV/DA, discrimination and end of life care.

We continue our DV work across East Anglia, and in doing so, our partnership has expanded and our work with other service providers has increased. We continue to forge new working partnerships and in doing so have increased the support made available to Gypsies, Travellers and Roma's affected by or victims of abuse.

We hope to share good practice and learning from the past projects, including the first 3rd party abuse reporting centre. The projects we are running at the moment concerning family support for drugs and alcohol abuse and those ended such as the end of life care. With the production of a series of CD's developed in partnership with Gypsy, Traveller, Roma communities, Hospitals and Hospices in Suffolk which will enable the opening of communication lines and promote positive dialogue. The women and girls project aimed to encourage further community volunteers and share good practices for supporting victims of abuse and harm.

The government has recognised the Gypsy, Roma and Traveller communities are significantly worse than the general population concerning health. Very few domestic abuses cases get reported to the police by Gypsy, Travellers and Roma women and girls. In light of these injustices, we have developed our ambitious and detailed 'Vision of change' which we believe can turn the tide and help us achieve our organisations goal of ending domestic violence, abuse cohesion and control. We will continue to ensure that families affected by Covid-19 and domestic violence, abuse cohesion and control are supported to be safe and have equal access to essential services and rebuild their lives. We intensely focus on ensuring that Gypsy, Roma and Traveller people, particularly women and girls are heard and listened to during the next three years and onwards.

1 Accounting Policies

Basis of preparation:

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015) - (Charities SORP (FRS 102)), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Companies Act 2006.

One Voice 4 Travellers meets the definition of a public benefit entity under FRS 102. Assets and liabilities are initially recognised at historic cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant accounting policy note.

Income

All income is included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.
Permanent endowment grants are dealt with through the Statement of Financial Activities when receivable.

Expenditure

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered , and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates.

Taxation

Corporation tax is not provided for in these accounts. The organisation is a registered charity and is not liable to Income or Corporation Tax.

Fund Accounting

Unrestricted Funds : These can be used in accordance with charitable objects at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted Funds : These can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.
