The property contains a Church that was built in the last century, parish hall and approximately 0.25 hectares of land at the rear side of the parish hall. This accomplishment, the focus of our efforts in the past years, removes the limitations previously faced in our charitable activities. The new building provides a permanent home for all our programs and allows us to expand our outreach and engagement within the wider community. This dedicated space will enable us to conduct our activities regularly and more effectively serve those we seek to reach. A significant investment was made in refurbishing the existing church building, including extensive work on both the interior and exterior, as well as the separate hall, ensuring a welcoming and functional space for the community.

Despite the significant resources dedicated to the building acquisition and refurbishment, LPF was still able to carry out important charitable work both in the UK and in India. Our international outreach focused on Kerala, India, where we provided vital financial assistance to two individuals struggling with the costs of medical treatment for acute illnesses. These interventions aimed to alleviate immediate suffering and provide access to necessary healthcare.

Closer to home, LPF extended its support within the UK, recognizing the needs within our own community. We provided direct assistance to a family facing hardship, offering a helping hand during a challenging time. Furthermore, LPF contributed to several prominent charitable organizations, including the British Red Cross, whose work provides crucial aid in times of crisis; Woodlands Hospice, which offers compassionate care for those facing life-limiting illnesses; and the Salvation Army, known for its extensive community outreach and support for vulnerable populations. These combined donations, totalling £1,915.43 for the year, reflect LPF's commitment to making a tangible difference in the lives of others, both near and far.

Recognizing the importance of nurturing the next generation, the Liverpool Prayer Fellowship (LPF) made youth engagement a priority in 2024 by hosting multiple impactful one-day conferences. These events, designed specifically for young people, provided a dedicated space for connection, learning, and spiritual growth. Held at our newly acquired and refurbished church building on Longmoor Lane, Walton Vale, Liverpool, the conferences offered a welcoming and inspiring environment for young attendees. A key element of these events was the involvement of youth leaders from other local churches, fostering collaboration and broadening the network of support for the young people.

The conferences were structured to empower young attendees, providing a platform for them to openly discuss the unique challenges they face in today's world. Through interactive sessions, group discussions, and engaging activities, participants explored practical solutions and engaged in meaningful conversations, all grounded in biblical principles. This approach not only encouraged active participation and leadership development among the youth but also fostered a strong sense of community and belonging. In Kerala, India, LPF provided assistance to two individuals who were unable to afford the costs of their medical treatment for acute illnesses. Additionally, we extended our support locally by contributing to the North West Air Ambulance and the Salvation Army, amounting to a total of £604.33 in charitable donations for the year 2023.

In November 2023, LPF organized a Christian Conference tailored specifically for the youth, targeting children aged 9 and above. This empowering event took place at the Parish Church of St. Giles Hall in Aintree, Liverpool, and was led by Pastor Jinu John, a dedicated Christian missionary. During the conference, young attendees were given a platform to articulate the challenges they face and engage in meaningful discussions about practical solutions, all within the framework of biblical teachings. This unique opportunity not only encouraged youth participation but also fostered a sense of community and spiritual growth among the younger generation.

#### **Objectives and Activities**

Liverpool Prayer Fellowship is a full gospel Christian Missionary Church, preciously holding the Pentecostal faith. The purpose of The Liverpool Prayer Fellowship is to give every man, woman and child the opportunity to understand the gospel and to provide an environment where they can develop, grow and to be a useful vessel for the glory of God.

#### **Achievements**

In the year 2022 our Charitable activities were limited due to the aim of purchasing our own building to perform all the activities on a regular basis. In the midst this, LPF still managed provide an amount of £1250 for Funeral support to families in the UK.

After 3 years of lockdown (due to covid), in 2022 March 5th our church was able to conduct youth anniversary for Sunday School students attended by other from the community.

A family conference led by Dr V J Samkutty · Vice-Principal (Academic) at All Nations Christian College. It was a blessing to share views, discussions and debates to everyone. A youth seminar (for children 11 and above) was also conducted on the 26th of November at Lifestream church in Prescott lead by Rev Blessen Mathew, Executive Pastor at New Life Church, Derby. The youth had an opportunity to share their ideas of challenges faced by young children, and the practical solutions shown in a biblical way.
