The Charity is staffed entirely by volunteers.

Para 1.20	March 2024-25 has seen another very successful year for the charity. The charity made £8,427 in charitable donations compared to £5,650 in 2023-2. Donations were made to a range of organizations, including local schools and libraries, funding for the Peter Christie Memorial Competition, and internationally, to Empower the Gambia and Books 4 Africa. Books were also provided to a local food bank. As in previous years the focus has been on both adult and children's literacy initiatives. The increase in funding available for distribution was partly due to increased sales from our bookshop but also a substantial growth in eBay activity. At the end of the period covered by this report, more than 1,000 books were listed on eBay. In terms of resourcing, we have continued to attract volunteers to our charity by advertising in the shop window and through word of mouth. We now have 13 volunteers engaged in various aspects of the charity. We also have a revamped website which attracts enquiries with respect to volunteer positions and a steady supply of donated books. New safeguarding and financial policy has been adopted and documents pertaining to these policies have been shared with all volunteers and copies of these placed under the counter in the shop.

		Our current treasurer is stepping back from her role after 10 years of service at the end of the 2024-25 financial year and we are very grateful to her for her efforts in helping us find a new treasurer and working with him for the first two months of 2025 to ensure a smooth transition.

Accounts

Book Relief UK Trustees annual report March 2023-March 2024

During the period covered by this report, Book Relief UK has continued to re-establish itself post pandemic and generated substantial funds allowing us to expand our offering of grants locally and nationally. During the period covered by the report we increased the numbers of small grants offered to local schools and the number of out of school activities run by local libraries. We also provided a grant to Read Easy North Devon and the Shannon Trust.

The increase in grants was made possible by increased sales of donated books from our bookshop at 48 Mill Street in Bideford and the establishment of an ebay site, enabling us to reach a wider audience across the UK. This expansion was achieved by an increase in the numbers of volunteers recruited to add to our dedicated and hardworking team. We also applied for and have been awarded a matched funding grant from Torridge District Town Beautification Scheme allowing us to update our shop signage and to produce a pavement board to increase visibility of our shop.

It is expected that our charity will continue to generated profits in the 2024-25 year enabling us to maintain and expand the grants offered locally and nationally as well as to turn our attention to the expansion of our international grant activity which has not yet recovered to pre-pandemic levels.

Annual report for 2020/21

What a year we had like so many other small businesses and charities. The first year of lockdowns because of Corona virus saw our small shop in Bideford closed for most of the year whilst our ongoing 'literacy projects' still continued.

We were able to take advantage of the Government grants administered through Torridge District Council and so could continue to pay the rent on our Mill Street shop whilst it was closed.

The 2 overseas projects (Project Pearls in the Phillipines and Empower the Gambia) that we help in a small way by supplying books, received several boxes of books. Project Pearls UK rep. (Daren) was able to drive down from Bristol to collect two loads of books. The Empower the Gambia rep (Gilly) lives locally so we were able to deliver them to her.

Sadly the two UK projects (helping Devon libraries in both local Hospitals and the 3 Devon Prisons) had to be put 'on hold' as their libraries were not able to receive books because of the pandemic.

Our enthusiastic,, though small band of volunteers were always supportive even though the shop had to remain closed for most of the year and so, as a Charity BRUK is in 'good health' and we look forward to reopening the shop and continuing with our 'literacy projects' in 2021/22
