Financial Review

<p>Review of the charity's financial position at the end of the period</p>	<p>Para 1.21</p>	<p>For the year ended 31st August 2023 the Circuit prepared receipts and payments accounts. They are not a consolidation of the accounts of churches in the Circuit.</p> <p>The Circuit budget is prepared by first anticipating the expenditure for the forthcoming year and then determining how that sum will be raised.</p> <p>About 92% of the income for the year 2022-2023 came from the individual churches within the Circuit.</p> <p>Standing Orders require the Circuit to pay the District Assessment before any other commitments and then to pay the stipends and support costs, including the provision of a manse, telephone and travel expenses, for ministers stationed in the Circuit. The Circuit also employs a part-time administrator. The cost of these commitments in the year to 31st August 2023 was £138,135. In addition there were other costs totalling £5,862.</p> <p>The Circuit is committed to purchasing a manse at a cost of £135,000, which will leave less than £50,000 in Reserves. It will therefore be necessary for the Circuit to consider means whereby it can raise funds from Churches to retain sufficient funds in hand to meet its commitments.</p> <p>Reserves not tied up in fixed assets were approximately £217k at the year end but £135k has been designated for the purchase of a second manse. At no time during the year was the Circuit insolvent either in terms of its assets or in terms of its ability to pay its debts as they became due. All funds are unrestricted with the exception of the Lees Legacy restricted funds of £1,011 and endowment fund of £4,867, plus funds held by the Circuit for the Kirton Family Worker. The income from the Lees Legacy fund is administered by the Lees Legacy Committee which is appointed by the Circuit Meeting and serves as a benevolent fund for those in need.</p>
<p>Statement explaining the policy for holding reserves stating why they are held</p>	<p>Para 1.22</p>	<p>The Circuit seeks to use its financial resources wisely and to predict future needs for capital expenditure on churches, manses and projects.</p>

		<p>Capital Assets</p> <p>The proceeds of sale of the premises of any Methodist Church or manse within the Circuit is generally credited to the Circuit. There is, however, a substantial levy paid to the Connexion (the Methodist Church in Great Britain) so not all the proceeds are received by the Circuit. During the year none have been sold. The Circuit has one manse but it will be seeking to purchase another one in the near future.</p> <p>Existing Commitments</p> <p>The Circuit has committed the following grants out of its Reserves:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> RoadHog Youth Mission: £1,000 as a one off grant payable in May 2024. <p>Annual Costs</p> <p>The Circuit believes that it should ensure that it has reserves sufficient to cover the stipends of its Presbyters for the full ensuing year but not to meet any redundancy pay should this be payable. At 31 August 2023, this sum is estimated at £42,000. A part time Circuit Administrator is employed by the circuit, with an associated annual cost of £15,000.</p> <p>Other costs of the Circuit are estimated at £47,000 for a full year. The Circuit deems it prudent to hold sufficient to cover these costs for six months, i.e. £24,000. The total of these projected costs is £81,000. After deducting the commitment to purchase the manse which is currently being rented, current reserves are able to meet this expenditure.</p> <p>The Circuit recognises its responsibility to provide adequate accommodation for its staff. A decision was made to rent a property in the town to house a Presbyterian from 1 September 2018. To assist in cash flow the decision was taken to buy a property to house the Presbyterian and this will be achieved with the purchase of a suitable property, but for a variety of reasons the completion of the purchase has been delayed. It is hoped it will be achieved during the year ended 31st August 2024.</p>

We anticipate that in the budget for 2023/2024 offers will cover expenditure.</p>

A description of the principal risks facing the charity	Para 1.46	<p>Through its Trustees, risks faced by the Circuit have been considered. Where appropriate, risks have been covered by insurance. Security and safety of our churches is largely for individual churches to determine and to mitigate following advice from Trustees.</p> <p>All churches and manses are the subject of quinquennial building inspections and the reports on each are reviewed by the Circuit as well as the local Trustees. Action is taken to reduce the risks of injury to all who have a legitimate purpose on those premises.</p> <p>We have considered the resilience of churches and the risk that they will not meet their assessments.</p> <p>The Circuit operates within a statutory framework of regulation and seeks to ensure that it follows Methodist standing orders. It relies on the Connexional Office to provide guidance on changes that could affect the Circuit.</p>

Note on Safeguarding		<p>The Circuit and each individual church have adopted and abide by all Connexional and District safeguarding policies in relation to children and adults who may be vulnerable. These include policies regarding Safer Recruitment, Risk Assessments and Responding Well, when there are concerns. Trained Safeguarding Officers ensure compliance, deliver training, and champion safeguarding in all the circuit and its churches. We follow Connexional guidelines on obtaining DBS checks where these are necessary, and ensure they are renewed every five years. In line with Connexional policy, Safeguarding training at an appropriate level is delivered to church and circuit officers every four years, including advanced training for Presbyters, lay preachers and others in a leadership role.</p>


