As in previous years, we have delivered a range of teacher training programmes both in the United Kingdom and internationally, with a particular focus on educators working in rural and underserved areas. In Birmingham, raising academic attainment among students with English as an Additional Language (EAL) remains a key priority. The impact of providing a few additional hours of targeted learning support has been remarkable, and we are committed to building upon these successes.

In closing, we respectfully invite you to continue working closely with us so that together we may enable more girls to pursue higher education and support EAL learners and students from disadvantaged backgrounds in achieving their full potential.

Welcome address

Respected members, volunteers, parents and guardians,

We are very pleased to see you all again and profusely thank you for your continued, unwavering generous support to our projects. We wish and pray that you all are rewarded back abundantly and that you are safe from all sorts of health-related issues.

Like previous years, this year again we offered a number of teachers training courses here in the UK and abroad, in particular to the teachers in rural areas. This year we have been offering regular intensive CPDs to teachers in rural areas where, with all sorts of deprivation, education isn't their priorities.

The concept of Bite-Sized teaching and teaching every lesson at least 2-4 new words from English into local languages has proven very successful. Here, in Birmingham the children and young people have improved considerably and show increasingly greater confidence in 'Reding, Retaining, Recalling and Writing.'

However, while evaluating our work in rural areas, it became clearer to us that most of the boys are able to move on to pursue their education whereas the girls and young women are left behind. Therefore, for the next few years we will be focussing on catering for the needs of the girls' education.

In many parts of the rural areas, men go to work, and they stay away for at least two years and women stay at home. Therefore, when women aren't educated at least to the standard to help their children, the children lag behind and with all talents and intelligence they struggle to reach their full potentials. Similarly, here in Birmingham those fathers who work in restaurants, they do not get the opportunity of communicating with their children on a regular basis especially during the school days. Generally, children return from school around half past three and by that time fathers leave for the work in restaurants and in the morning when children leave for schools fathers are asleep.

Therefore, we urge you all to continue working closely with us so that we are able to help more and more girls in going for higher education. There is a very popular saying that 'teaching a girl is like teaching the whole family.'

As mentioned before in our communications, we are pursuing to expand the activities where the needs of children and young people are met.

Finally, we thank you once again for your time today and seek your continued generous participation in the work that you all have been closely involved in. As always, we are all ears for your suggestions and questions.

Blue Ink Supplementary School

We are ecstatic to share with you that many of those children who had started attending our classes in 2012, have moved on to universities. They have got places in medicine, optometry, business studies and accounting and other courses.

This is truly a great achievement. A few hours quality support in small groups certainly brings about life changing transformations especially for families which aren't exposed to higher educations.

Our lessons on weekends and during the week is tailored to individuals needs where they are taught new skills, helped in any units where they need support as well as we offer help and encourage students to learn other skills, too, such as Verbal and Non-verbal reasoning. Furthermore, we motivate them to understand their social responsibilities from a young age.

Reaching out to unreachable – Education Project

AS you all are aware and graciously have been supporting the education of over 650 children and young people from very deprived remote areas. Many of these pupils are from families where they can't afford to buy a pair of trousers and shirts. With the help of you all, these children and young people are able to attend the school and they are trying their best to make most of the opportunities provided.

We are thrilled to share with you that this year again, like previous years, all the pupils entering the High School exam have passed their examinations exceptionally well in all subjects.

It's noteworthy that the language of the area isn't a written one; overcoming the language barriers and deprivations all students are delivered English Medium curriculum which is truly an astounding

achievement! We are extremely pleased to share with you the numbers of girls entering for education has reached almost 50% in all classes.

For your continued support in this regard is highly commended and we thank you all profusely.

Gratitude

The distribution of uniforms, books, expenses to the teachers, staff members and the distribution of food and live stocks among the families of students would not have been possible without the generous continued support from you all.

Let me begin thanking you for your presence here today and for all your continued support during the last year and all the years in the past. Without your continued support and without the support of our funders we would have not been able to deliver our mission of Propagating, Promoting and Advancing Education here in the UK and abroad which are backbone in eradicating all ills from the society.

Blue Ink Weekend School

We have begun running the classes every Saturday from 9:00 – 12:30 where a number of children and young people attend it regularly. Along with Literacy, Numeracy, GCSE and A – Level subjects we impart knowledge about all the topics and subjects that concerns them and which are essential for the success. On 4th of March we will hold our Award Giving Ceremony where all the hardworking pupils will be awarded which is vital in encouraging all participants for a better outcome in all subjects.

Blue Ink Evening School

Since COVID – 19 restrictions were removed, we have restarted our evening school where a sizeable pupils attend regularly.

Keeping in mind the homework which our pupils get from their schools and to encourage independence in learning, we are running these classes on Mondays – Wednesdays.

Youth Empowerment Programme

Like before our Youth Team has restarted holding meetings with our youths in the community where social and educational issues are discussed. Youths love talking and discussing matters of their interests.

Education for All and Relief

Like before, with the generous help from all of you, in particular the support which we received towards education of ‘very poor ones’ and supporting them to carry on the education by providing boarding, which is a new initiative, we were able to provide life changing support. Similarly, we were able to distribute Sewing Machines, Goats and buffalos as per the instructions of sponsors.

We will carry on helping as effectively as we can and we request you all to engage with families and encourage them to increase the participation as learning is the only way to break the cycle of deprivation and marginalisation.

Food package distribution

Those who had donated for meal distribution and food packages we did so and passed the photos and other details onto them. The volunteers were every pleased to see the appreciative and smiling faces of the benefices.
