Living Kidney Donation project

The Living Kidney Donation project that started last year continued till June this year and a new project for Living Donation was initiated in April.

Promotion of Living Kidney Donation within the Jain and Hindu communities in the UK was carried out in various ways such as

- in-person gathering at Manchester,
- during various gatherings of the community,
- within the patients visiting three GP surgeries in NW London
- launching of Peer Support scheme for Kidney patients in Manchester area who are waiting for a living kidney donation,
- creating new promotional material and distributing the same within the community.

The activity has been supported by the funding from NHSBT

Befriending support to lonely and sick:

The aim of this project is to provide social contact to lonely adults within our community; spiritual and religious care to sick people and give support to and signpost mentally ill people to the appropriate agencies to provide safeguarding assistance. This activity benefits both the Jain and Hindu communities, men, and women, young as well as elderly.

Lonely adults are given friendly support by our eight volunteers.

Youth gathering:

There had been two gatherings this year of the youth from Jain and Hindu communities These were held in April and November





Living Kidney Donation project

The project is to promote Living Kidney Donation within the Jain and Hindu communities in the UK. It is supported by NHSBT. This was progressed during the year as per plan.

Facilitators are appointed to provide Peer support to the kidney patients waiting for a living kidney donation and transplant surgery at Hammersmith hospital..

A gathering of the community members was held in October, Kidney surgeon, organ donation coordinator from Hammersmith hospital and a GP gave talks. Kidney donors and recipients narrated their stories.

This project will end in June 2023.



