TRUSTEES' ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2024

The trustees are pleased to present their annual directors' report together with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2024 which are also prepared to meet the requirements for a directors' report for Companies Act purposes.

The financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2011, the Companies Act 2006, the Memorandum and Articles of Association, and Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to small charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) (effective 1 January 2015).

Objectives and Activities

Purposes and aims

The charity's objectives are to promote and protect good health and relieve sickness of people living in the Knowle West area of Bristol and the surrounding area, in particular but not exclusively by: working in partnership with the local community, service users, health care services and Bristol City Council to address health inequalities in South Bristol. Also, to deliver a range of accessible services and activities aimed at improving health and developing health related education and training opportunities that are responsive to local needs.

How our activities deliver public benefit.

Our main activities and who we try to help are described below. All our charitable activities focus on the promotion of health and wellbeing and are undertaken to further our charitable purposes for the public benefit.

Who used and benefitted from our services?

The activities of and services offered by Knowle West Health Park Company are available to people living in Knowle West (otherwise known as Filwood Ward) and the surrounding areas of health inequality across South Bristol. Services are offered to all members of the community, including children and young people, adults and older people.

The residents of Filwood Ward and some other wards in South Bristol experience significant health inequalities compared to citywide averages. 'Health inequalities' is the term used to describe the impact that social and economic disadvantage has on health. It is often measured by the gap in life expectancy between poorer and more affluent people, or similarly the gap between the onset of life limiting illness or disability. In Bristol, the BCC ward profile details the difference between different wards of the city, and in these statistics, South Bristol is shown as having significant health needs compared to other parts of the city.

Of the 28 areas within Bristol (2019) that are in the 10% most deprived deciles 14 are in South Bristol. The 7 domains of deprivation are income, employment, education, health, crime, barriers to housing and services and living environment.

As an example we are based in the Filwood Ward which is one of the most deprived wards in Bristol and has a population of 14,262 and this includes a significantly high percentage of 0-15 year olds in comparison to Bristol. Both male and female life expectancy is below the Bristol average, overall. This premature mortality is caused by cancer, cardiovascular disease and respiratory disease, all of which is preventable.

In terms of lifestyle behaviour, Filwood is significantly worse than the Bristol average in the following areas; health conditions that limit day to day activities, households where someone smokes, physically inactive, overweight or obese, and children who have excess weight. The number of people who feel they belong to their neighbourhood continues to increase and is now 54%, 39.3% of people help out their neighbours and in this digital age the number who have access to the internet at home has increased to 97%. As the cost of living crisis impacts the community the number of children who live in low income families has increased to 33.2%.

As one of the founding members of Knowle West Alliance we have worked in partnership to increase the voice and skills of the community.

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Knowle West Health Park Company's activities fall into four main categories, as follows:

1 The provision of services and activities, which are likely to improve health and wellbeing.

General health promotion and illness prevention are the foundations for all of KWHPC's work. The focus of our services is on reducing the likelihood of ill health to individuals and the broader community, as well as enabling people to recover better after periods of ill health. The promotion of health and wellbeing informs every activity in which KWHPC is engaged and remains an ethical imperative in every interaction with service users, focusing as it does on the individual as well as their local networks and neighbours.

A summary of services delivered by Knowle West Health Park to meet local needs would include:

- Exercise groups for adults including walking groups, strength and balance, Tai Chi and other physical exercise groups during the year
- One to one support / goal setting to improve wellbeing
- Support for community groups
- Supporting the Somali Womens Group
- Lifeskills classes
- Social support groups
- Educational groups
- Art on referral groups for people with mental health needs
- Lip-reading classes
- Healthy Eating
- Community engagement and development
- Social prescribing
- Community connectors
- Community events - including Celebrating Age, International Womens day, Dog Show and Summer fun day

2 Facilitating, commissioning and supporting the delivery of specialist services likely to improve health and wellbeing.

In addition to the services directly provided by KWHPC, a major element of the Company's work is to bring onto the Health Park other specialist services with the specific expertise and resources to address key health issues in South Bristol. Fundraising to commission such services remain a key part of the Company's work and continues to sustain the effective partnership approach built up over the last 22

A summary of services the Charity has brought onto the Health Park to meet local needs in the last year would include:

- One to one counselling for adults & children
- Play therapy
- Activities sessions
- Peer support groups around specific long-term conditions
- Peer education training for parents
- Educational groups
- Women's group
- Music therapy
- Health Interventions
- Housing advice
- Mental health advice

3 Involving and promoting the opinions, needs and aspirations of local people in the development and delivery of health and social services in South Bristol.

Working from an Asset Based Community Development approach, the company prioritises consultation with and the direct involvement of local people in the development and delivery of its services and activities. Continuing to promote community involvement and reflecting local opinion is a priority in enabling the local community to develop new ways of sustaining their own health and wellbeing. In the last year we have been working with Bristol City Council to embed asset based community development into our working practice. The Health Park have been working alongside other community groups within the local area to develop strategic working practices to benefit the local community. The Health Park has been developing partnerships working with other local organisations to share resources and increase the support for the local community.

4 Promoting the development and profile of the Health Park as a location for needs-led, relevant, effective and innovative health services and interventions.

The Health Park has a key part to play in changing the health profile of Knowle West and surrounding areas. Local delivery targetting local need has been proven to be an effective model and KWHPC will play an important part in ensuring this continues and this has led us to become the VCSE partner for South Bristol Locality Partnership. KWHPC works hard to ensure that the Health Park remains a key local amenity, relevant to local need and working to bring the best possible range of services to the residents of South Bristol. In the last year KWHPC have continued to engage with NHS Property Services and the BNSSG estates review to look at the continued viability of the Health Park site as a venue to deliver cost effective services.

As part of this commitment we are founding members of the Knowle West Alliance. A group of local charities and residents who are working together to strengthen our own individual organisations ability to achieve success and contribute to a thriving neighbourhood and community sector in Knowle West. We are also active steering group members of the newly formed VCSE Alliance, advocating for the VCSE across the BNSSG area.

Charity Governance Code

Good governance in charities is fundamental to their success. It enables and supports a charity's compliance with the law and relevant regulations. It also promotes a culture where everything works towards fulfilling the charity's

Community Incident

Following the murders of Max and Mason at the end of January we have been working with Bristol City Council's Community Development Team, Knowle West Alliance and Hartcliffe and Withywood Community Partnership to build trauma informed practices and increase community resilience.

Financial Review

Knowle West Health Park Company ends the year with a small surplus which has increased our reserves. Aside from our main projects we have received small pots of funding from Trusts to deliver one off projects. The Board has been robust in building its reserves to ensure that we are able to continue to deliver our own successful activities which we know improve the wellbeing of the service users but attracts little funding. The Board are committed to delivering activities that are well used and offer the opportunity for behavioral change. We are working towards activities becoming cost neutral where possible without making them inaccessible. Other organisations that rent our space have suffered funding cuts and are no longer able to deliver from the Healthy Living Centre. We are working to invite new organisations to use the centre. One of the main challenges is that we are delivering new projects whilst the funding offered is shrinking. The diversity of projects requires us to monitor outcomes and report on a high number of different projects for the turnover of the organisation. We maintain good relationships with the existing trusts and statutory organisations that fund us and continue to look for new sources of funding for new projects to meet service users' needs. The finances are reviewed regularly at an operational and governance level.

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Principal Funding Sources

In the year 2023-24 our funding sources included Bristol City Council, South Bristol Locality Partnership, SWIFT PCN, Sirona, Wesport, St Monica Trust and Voscur.

Investment Policy

KWHPC operates a policy of non-investment, other than keeping KWHPC reserves in high interest bank accounts.

Reserves Policy

KWHPC recognises the importance of maintaining an appropriate level of reserves to allow for contingency planning or action. The Board of Directors has agreed to maintain the level of reserves at three months operational costs, which would currently be £100,000 (for the year 2023-24).

Reserves are reviewed at meetings of the Board of Directors at least half yearly or more frequently if required. Decisions regarding the use of reserves are informed by the charity's Financial Risk Assessment and Risk Management Plan which is also updated twice annually or sooner if required.

Quality Assurance

KWHPC is committed to the principles of continued improvement, and ensuring that quality assurance is embedded in governance, service delivery and organisational development. Having previously held a PQASSO Quality Assurance Mark we are in the process of investigating the Improving Quality scheme managed by Community

Plans for Future Periods

Our current Strategic Plan will be reviewed in 2024/25. Our service delivery model for this Strategic Plan takes a Community Education and Engagement approach to public health and wellbeing. It prioritises making a difference to individuals and building resilience in the community. It involves several components.

The key aims and activities of this Strategic Plan:

- To know who is using our services and identify under-served groups in the community
- To work together to build a strong, healthy community that supports everyone to achieve wellness.
- To broaden and deepen the activities in the Healthy Living Centre to ensure its continued relevance to the needs of people living in South Bristol.
- To ensure sustainability of the Healthy Living Centre and maintain high standards of quality assurance in all of our activities and services when meeting current and future demand.

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Risk Management

Risk is used to describe the uncertainty surrounding events and their outcomes, which may have a significant effect (whether enhancing or inhibiting) on the following:

- Operational performance
- Achievements of aims and objectives
- Meeting expectations of stakeholders

The Chief Executive performs a bi-annual risk assessment using a Risk Assessment Matrix. The outcome of that process is reported to the Board of Directors who then agree the risk management plan. The risk assessment procedure is completed at least bi-annually, but at any time during the year a further assessment can be implemented as circumstances change. Risk is graded on two scales of 1-5 indicating the impact and likelihood of such risk occurring, and those risks scoring highest are managed most urgently and proactively. The agreed risk management plan is implemented by the KWHPC Staff Team with reports on progress being presented to the Board or Financial Sub Group as required.

Structure, Governance and Management

Governing Document

The organisation is a charitable company limited by guarantee incorporated on 18 July 2006 and registered as a charity on 7 July 2010. The company was established under a Memorandum of Association which established the objects and powers of the charitable company and is governed under its Articles of Association. In the event of the company being wound up members are required to contribute an amount not exceeding £1.00.

Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees

At Board level we would like the majority of places to be occupied by residents of Knowle West and South Bristol. There has been fairly consistent membership of the Board since the company was first created, meaning that members have developed a degree of expertise on the running of the Company. However, since COVID some of the Trustees have decided to reevaluate their volunteering and step down. We are currently running a recruitment campaign in the community to refresh the Board and build the skills.

Trustee Induction and Training

New trustees are provided with a full induction to the organisation, covering the roles and responsibilities of Board members, operational, financial and health and safety policies, services and activities, and the Strategic Plans of the Charity.

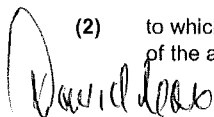

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2024

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The principal accounting policies are summarised below. The accounting policies have been applied consistently throughout the year and in the preceding year.

1.1 Basis of preparation of accounts

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015) - (Charities SORP (FRS 102)), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Companies Act 2006.

Knowle West Health Park Company meets the definition of a public benefit entity under FRS102. Assets and liabilities are initially recognised at historical cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant accounting policy notes.

1.2 Pensions

The company pension scheme is with Aegon, the company follows government guidelines and currently contributes 4% into employees pensions.

1.3 Fund Accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity.

Designated funds are unrestricted funds earmarked by the Trustees for particular purposes.

Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure imposed by the donor or through the terms of an appeal.

1.4 Income

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

Voluntary income is received by way of grants, donations and gifts and is included in full in the Statement of Financial Activities when receivable. Grants, where entitlement is not conditional on the delivery of a specific performance by the charity, are recognised when the charity becomes unconditionally entitled to the grant.

Investment income is included when receivable.

Incoming resources from charitable trading activity are accounted for when earned.

Incoming resources from grants, where related to performance and specific deliverables, are accounted for as the charity earns the right to consideration by its performance.

1.5 Expenditure

Expenditure is recognised on a accrual basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates:

Costs of generating funds comprise the costs associated with attracting voluntary income and the costs of trading for fundraising purposes.

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

All costs are allocated between the expenditure categories of the SoFA on a basis designed to reflect the use of the resource. Costs relating to a particular activity are allocated directly, others are apportioned on an appropriate basis.

1.6 Charitable Activities

Costs of charitable activities include governance costs and are disclosed in note 5 of the statutory

Voscur VCSE - Working in partnership with Voscur to increase the delivery in the local community.

Wesport - This project delivers a physical activity programme for people who are inactive throughout South Bristol
