Trustees are chosen based on the Christian faith and integrity.

The annual HAT Word and Prayer Retreat took place in January 2025 at Ashburnham Place, Battle, UK. Approximately 76 adults and 25 children attended. The retreat was a spiritually impactful gathering, providing an opportunity for fellowship, teaching, and prayer. Attendees testified to experiencing a strong sense of God's presence and personal encouragement.

The annual HAT Mission Outreach to Nigeria was held from 14th to 18th April 2025. The medical outreach was conducted at the HAT Hospital in Idofian. The following services were provided free of charge:

General surgeries: 9

Eye surgeries: 10

Eye outpatient consultations: 120

General outpatient consultations: 261

All medications were provided free of charge to patients, ensuring access to essential healthcare for underserved members of the community.

The HAT Vocational Skills Support and Forum (VSS&F) programme was delivered across two locations, with attendance of approximately 211 participants at one location and 245 at the second. As part of this initiative:

Two students were awarded scholarships for university education

Two individuals received interest-free small business loans

One participant received access to online skills training

The annual Charity Walk took place on 17th May 2025. The event was well attended, with participation from both returning and new supporters, contributing to increased awareness of the charity's work.

The HAT Charity Dinner was held on 11th October 2025. The event provided an opportunity to engage with supporters, celebrate the charity's impact, and strengthen community relationships.

In December 2025, HAT members visited an elderly care home in Chatham to share Christmas joy with residents and staff. The visit included singing, prayers, and the distribution of Christmas gifts, creating a warm and uplifting atmosphere for all involved.

Monthly prayer meetings were held consistently throughout the year at the usual venue in Chatham. These gatherings provided a platform for fellowship and collective prayer, covering personal, community, church, and global matters.

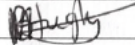

The annual HAT word and prayer retreat took place as usual in High Leigh Christian Conference Centre, Hoddesdon, Hertfordshire UK in January 2024. There was an attendance of approx. 75 adults and 35 children. It was as a meeting with a difference, as God honoured His people with his presence and met needs.

The annual HAT mission outreach Nigeria took place from 25th to 29th of April 2024. The HAT medical outreach took place at the HAT hospital, Idofian. The following services were provided for free: General surgery 8, Eye surgery 9, Eye out patients 113, General out patients 243. Medication was provided free of charge for patients.

The HAT VSS&F programme took place at two locations, with an attendance of approx 200 and 250 youths at each location. 2 students were granted scholarships for university education, 2 non-interest bearing small business loans, 1 online skills training, 17 exam application payments.

The annual charity walk was organised and took place on the 27th of May 2024. The turnout was impressive, with new faces, everyone had fun!

HAT family picnic was also organised and took place on 24th August 2024. Even though the event couldn't take place in the park because it rained, it took place in one of the Trustees' home. It was a lovely time!

HAT members took Christmas joy to the old people's home in Chatham in December 2024 and shared the message of joy and peace of the season with residents and staff, through singing, prayers, and Christmas gifts. It was indeed a joyous time.

The regular monthly prayer meetings were held throughout the year at the usual venue in Chatham. This enabled the group to fellowship together and pray over various issues, including personal, church and global.

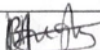

Also, ten general medical surgeries and eight eye surgeries were performed free of charge.

The annual charity walk was organised and took place on the 02nd June 2022. It had a very good turn out.

Again for Christmas 2021, instead of the usual visit to the elderly home in Chatham by HAT members, Christmas gifts were delivered to their door, to avoid contact because of the covid-19 pandemic.

Food donation was also made to Medway food bank during the Christmas 2021 season.

The regular monthly prayer meetings were held throughout the year, which enabled the group to fellowship together and pray over issues. This was however held virtually because of covid restriction rules in place.

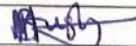
