C3 Related party transactions

No trustee received any remuneration nor reimbursed any expenses in the year under review.

During the year under review Coutts & Co, a trustee of the charity to July 2021, was paid fees for the provision of administration and investment management services amounting to £18,676 whilst a trustee. Ludlow Trust Company Limited was appointed trustee in July 2021 and paid £9,998 for administrative services between appointment and the reporting date. These fees are authorised under clause 6 of the trust deed.
