Section C Objectives and activities

Summary of the objects of the charity set out in its governing document

The charity is established to advance education and appreciation; of the public in the art of brass band music in all its aspects by provision of public concerts and training of persons in the study and playing of brass band instruments.

We are a Brass Band society which provides brass and percussion instrument tuition and performance opportunities to members of all ages and abilities. Members are provided with an opportunity to participate in musical activities including concerts, contests and community events. We rehearse weekly. Instruments are provided on loan free-of-charge to members who do not have their own instrument.

Following the Covid-19 pandemic, music making activities ceased for the majority of the year. We had been lucky enough to qualify in March 2020, for the Brass Band National Finals due to take place September 2020. Unfortunately, to the Bands disappointment this was postponed. Various other engagements were also cancelled to keep everyone safe.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

The coronavirus restrictions forced our organisation to look for new and different ways to engage with members as we could no longer meet in person.

Some of our members started arranging Quiz Nights online via Zoom. This helped to keep everyone together. We managed to arrange our Committee Meetings via Zoom to keep on top of the ongoing situation.

Some of our officers were able to start getting our bandroom back to a usable state, following the unfortunate flooding that took place in February 2020 when Storm Dennis hit.

During July 2020, the Band discussed entering an online contest which was being organised by Cory Band for September 2020. Entries had to be recorded individually by Band members at home during August 2020 and then these videos were collated to produce our final entry. We were lucky enough to win a prize for "Best Regional Music". All 67 entries were broadcast live on Cory Bands YouTube Channel.

The committee also planned to have an outside rehearsal in September 2020, but this was cancelled due to new restrictions. Instead, we started having our rehearsals online via Zoom in October 2020. This continued on a monthly basis and although wasn't perfect, it assisted in keeping the members interested and playing.

A further online contest was organised by Kapitool and Cory Band and took place March 2021. Again, this meant recording individually and our collated video was entered. Out of the 107 entries we again were successful in winning a further prize for "Best Regional Music".

Although a difficult year due to things outside our control, the Band were able to keep afloat.

As coronavirus halted band operations in late March 2020, it was agreed that band members could opt-out of paying subscriptions until further notice. This policy to be reviewed when the Covid regulations allow us to return to normal. However, we are lucky to have supportive members of the organisation who have continued to pay subscriptions.

As we could not generate income from concerts during this financial year, we looked for new methods of fundraising, such as Amazon Smile which we successfully set up in October 2020. The first payment of this was received in February 2021.

We have also been grateful for the Covid grants that have been allocated to us to assist with the running of the Band, whilst we were unable to carry out our usual fundraising e.g. concerts / carol playing.



Delays getting this year's accounts audited were unfortunately out of our hands and were caused by a mixture of Covid ill health and restrictions.
