This is awarded annually, prior to graduation, and announced at graduation, to the student who has the highest combined mark across the assessments within stage 3 HCS329 Haematology/ Transfusion module. It has been supported by BGS Transfusion for 3 years. The module has a substantial percentage of blood transfusion science content which makes it attractive to students who are leaning towards a Biomedical Science career in blood sciences.</p>


