Trustees' Report

The trustees present the annual report together with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2021.

Objectives and activities

Objects and aims

Our objects as set out in the constitution of the charity are to advance for the public benefit:

(i) the prevention or relief of poverty or financial hardship anywhere in the world by funding the provision (to those in need) of education, training, healthcare projects and all the necessary support designed to enable unemployed individuals to earn their own living.

(ii) the education of both children and adults at the Dhaka project, Bangladesh and at such other locations throughout the world as Trustees may at their discretion determine, by funding the provision of courses, facilities and such other educational needs as the Trustees may identify.

Objectives, strategies and activities

We are advancing the education of children and adults in Bangladesh, by funding the provision of courses, facilities and other education needs as the Trustees have identified.

Public benefit

The funding of education and training for young people in Bangladesh, enabling them to earn their own living as they progress into adulthood with the aim of preventing and relieving poverty in the area.

The trustees confirm that they have complied with the requirements of section 17 of the Charities Act 2011 to have due regard to the public benefit guidance published by the Charity Commission for England and Wales.

Use of volunteers

Volunteers have been used in the form of visitors to the projects in Bangladesh, as well as by connecting remotely to help students with additional development classes.

Achievements and performance

In 2021, 44 children were supported financially to receive education at a school of decent quality. The schools are carefully scrutinised by the trustees in order that they provide a high enough quality level education program to place the children in situation where they may compete for employment or further education.

The overall result and achievement is that these children have opportunities that would never be available in their societal circumstances, without the support of the Maria Cristina Foundation.

2021 also saw the third full year of University in Portugal for MCFs Bangladesh students with 25 students enrolled. It has had its challenges but overall has been a success.

Fundraising was challenging, with limited opportunity to engage with sponsors and donors due to COVID19, and also the general economic situation worldwide.

Financial review

Fundraising has been challenging due to COVID19 and there was a deficit of £24,960 this year however the charity still held a total of £202,054 in reserves.

Policy on reserves

We aim to raise and hold enough funds to cover the following year school fee costs (because the school year starts in January in Bangladesh). This was reached in full, with a designated fund for this specific purpose created in the prior year holding a year's school fees in advance. At the year end the designated fund held £65,000.

Principal funding sources

Individual donors or corporate donors either as general donations or individuals sponsoring education for specific children.

COVID-19

We have considered the impact of COVID-19, we expected some economic and social impact for our beneficiaries in Bangladesh and it has been the case, educational difficulties due to COVID lockdowns and extra support required. We have also experienced limitations on fundraising opportunities however we have maintained sufficient working capital to continue to operate for the foreseeable future.

Structure, governance and management

Nature of governing document

The Maria Cristina Foundation is an unincorporated charity governed by a Trust Deed dated 31 December 2010.

Recruitment and appointment of trustees

Trustees are identified specifically for their experience with charity management and/or business management experience and qualifications. Trustees shall be appointed in writing by the Settlor and Maria Conceicao or the survivor of them during their lifetimes and thereafter by a resolution of the Trustees. If for any reason trustees cannot be appointed in this way, the statutory powers of appointing new or additional trustees shall be exercisable.

Organisational structure

The charity is small and managed by the three trustees.

Major risks and management of those risks

Fundraising

There is the risk of not raising enough funds to cover all the education expenses. In this event, fundraising would continue but it may mean the number of students supported would have to be reduced.

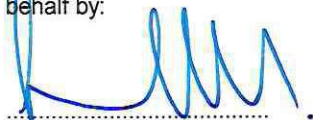

Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities

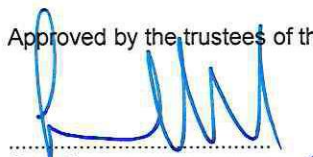

The trustees are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

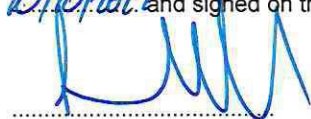

1 Accounting policies

Statement of compliance

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019) - (Charities SORP (FRS 102)), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Charities Act 2011.

Basis of preparation

Maria Cristina Foundation meets the definition of a public benefit entity under FRS 102. The accounts (financial statements) have been prepared under the historical cost convention with items recognised at cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant note(s) to these accounts.

Going concern

The trustees consider that there are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue as a going concern.

COVID-19

The trustees of the charity have considered the impact of COVID-19. In the opinion of the trustees, the charity has sufficient working capital within existing facilities to continue to operate for the foreseeable future, and therefore the financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis. For more information about the impact of COVID-19, please see the Trustees' Report.

Income and endowments

Voluntary income including donations, gifts, legacies and grants that provide core funding or are of a general nature is recognised when the charity has entitlement to the income, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured with sufficient reliability.

Donations and legacies

Donations and legacies are recognised on a receivable basis when receipt is probable and the amount can be reliably measured.

Expenditure

All expenditure is recognised once there is a legal or constructive obligation to that expenditure, it is probable settlement is required and the amount can be measured reliably. All costs are allocated to the applicable expenditure heading that aggregate similar costs to that category.

Educational fees expenditure is stated net of any donations made by third parties directly to the school in Bangladesh. Such direct donations reduce the fees payable by the charity.

Raising funds

These are costs incurred in attracting voluntary income and those incurred in trading activities that raise funds.

Charitable activities

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

Taxation

The charity is considered to pass the tests set out in Paragraph 1 Schedule 6 of the Finance Act 2010 and therefore it meets the definition of a charity for UK corporation tax purposes. Accordingly, the charity is potentially exempt from taxation in respect of income or capital gains received within categories covered by Chapter 3 Part 11 of the Corporation Tax Act 2010 or Section 256 of the Taxation of Chargeable Gains Act 1992, to the extent that such income or gains are applied exclusively to charitable purposes.

Foreign exchange

Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded at the rate of exchange at the date of the transaction. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies at the balance sheet date are reported at the rates of exchange prevailing at that date.

Fund structure

Unrestricted income funds are general funds that are available for use at the trustees discretion in furtherance of the objectives of the charity.

Designated funds are unrestricted funds set aside for specific purposes at the discretion of the trustees.
