The trustees, who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report for the year ended 31 December 2025.

Small company provisions

This report has been prepared in accordance with the provisions in Part 15 of the Companies Act 2006 applicable to companies subject to the small companies regime.

Structure, governance and management

The company took over the activities of the Haddenham Steam Rally in 2010, having obtained charitable status. Trustees are appointed by the members of the committee at the Annual General Meeting (AGM), as and when necessary.

Objectives and Activities

The charity exists to help preserve the heritage of road-going and other steam engines, historic agricultural equipment and machinery and other traditional country activities, and to educate the public in the heritage, by putting on the Rally each year for the public to visit, with exhibits, many of them working, and demonstrations of vintage machinery and techniques. The trustees confirm they have followed regulatory guidance on public benefit.

Financial Review

The trustees are pleased with the Rally and attendance for the year 2025, being its 50th anniversary. The good weather plus the additional number of exhibits helped to make the milestone anniversary a great success. The trustees confirm that the supply of gate fees qualifies for VAT exemption in accordance with Group 12, Schedule 9 of the VAT Act 1994. This had been of concern in previous years and the Trustees now have certainty on the VAT treatment following the Upper Tribunal decision in January 2025. Licences for stallholders to occupy land for the duration of the Rally is shown separately for clarity.

Directors'/trustees' responsibilities

The directors are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records that are sufficient to show and explain the company's transactions and disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and enable them to ensure that the accounts comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the provisions in Part 15 of the Companies Act 2006 and in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102).

Notes to the Accounts

for the year ended 31 December 2025

1 Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with FRS 102 and the Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities (SOFA).

Income

Income is included in the SOFA when the charity becomes entitled, and the income can be measured with sufficient reliability. Where income has related expenditure, the income and related expenditure is reported gross in the SOFA.

Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are measured at cost less accumulative depreciation and any accumulative impairment losses. Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets at rates calculated to write off the cost, less estimated residual value, of each asset evenly over its expected useful life, as follows:

Plant and machinery	over 3 years
Fixtures, fittings, tools and equipment	over 5 years

Debtors

Short term debtors are measured at transaction price (which is usually the invoice price), less any impairment losses for bad and doubtful debts.

Creditors

Short term creditors are measured at transaction price (which is usually the invoice price). Loans and other financial liabilities are initially recognised at transaction price net of any transaction costs and subsequently measured at amortised cost determined using the effective interest method.

Provisions

Provisions (ie liabilities of uncertain timing or amount) are recognised when there is an obligation at the reporting date as a result of a past event, that it is probable that economic benefit will be transferred to settle the obligation and the amount of the obligation can be estimated reliably.

6 Trustees' expenses

Independent Examiner's Report to the trustees of Haddenham Steam Rally

Period Ended 31st December 2025

I report on the company's accounts for the year ended 31st December 2025 set out on pages 1-5.
