FRIENDS OF THE DARTMOOR HILL PONY – CHAIRMAN'S REPORT FOR 2025

Our main news for this year must be the improvements made to our barn HQ. We owe the owners a massive thank you to for the restoration of the barn floor drainage which is amazing to support our efforts towards the future of the ponies on Dartmoor. These restoration works to the barn, originally built in 1996, mean that we can:

- Manage water ingress from land run-off, the reduction of brown water leaving the barn, so protecting the health of nearby streams/rivers/watercourses.
- Improve the standard of basic facilities for volunteers working in the barn.
- Improve animal welfare for ponies in the barn.
- Encourage volunteering and improve volunteer working comfort, which in turn helps us help the ponies.
- Educate volunteers and followers in the land management of Dartmoor commons and benefit of the ponies.
- Improve the opportunity for the volunteering public to understand and appreciate the importance of drifting and pounding unmarked ponies.
- Support well-being projects for children and adults, whether physically or mentally, through interaction with the ponies and other people involved in the projects to secure and enhance the lives of ponies on and off the commons of Dartmoor.

The work to ensure the genetic mapping of the breeding stock on the commons continues, we have an amazing team to thank this year for their part in this work specifically, our main aim this coming year will be to get the DNA of those animals mapped.

Website changes are thanks to Jo Druett and also to Alan Davies who has been editing our website for a long time.

This has been a hard year for us to help with preparation for the pony sales as, due to a change in policy taken up by Rendells, the ponies had to have a microchip implanted and silhouette completed prior to the sale. The vet came with us to ID each pony going to the sale and provide correct paperwork which was five days work in all and a few evenings alongside.

At The Grange, the breeders' sale was an improvement on last year and as ever, Kivells must be thanked for supporting this event. We enjoyed an interesting talk at the start of sale about taming ponies.

An outbreak of strangles from one pony herd made for a very tense time post sale, but all seems to be ok in the end.

Pony homing from HQ was 35 ponies. We castrated 42 ponies since April.

The big plan now is to get the herd records to be digital and a follow through once homed onto a Dartmoor Hill Pony record held at Pet ID for ponies who have left the moor.

Conservation grazing ponies are proving their value and we hope will be recognized with in the LUMG plans for evidence gathering on grazing numbers. This is because, although DHPs are now on an even footing for payments with cattle and other recognized rare breeds, their future is not secure if payment only happens when incentivised by heavily reduced stocking numbers.



Chairmans report for year ending March 2024.

This has not been an easy year for us, we were at the top end of our number of ponies we can care for through out the winter, which means the feed bills and then the gelding /vets bills are large.

We have worked with Dartmoor Hill Farmers using their ancient grazing rights to common pony herds on the moor since 1995. We have worked with members of the DEFRA Equine ID team since 2003 and was one of the team who designed the first and subsequent passport derogations which means we understand what we need for the benefit of our last semi wild pony herds of England.

Complying to regulation about the identification of semi-wild Dartmoor Hill Ponies in different situations is an on going task.


These projects include:-

- Supplying support to pony keepers in order to keep within agri-environment scheme number limits.
- The Dartmoor Hill Pony Association holds the traditional annual Pony Drift Sale, supported by the Friends Charity promotion and after care for ponies and new owners.
- The Drift Sale is staffed by Friends of the Dartmoor Hill Pony volunteers, producing temporary id documents and applying for passports in new owners names to enable traceability of ponies once they leave Dartmoor.
- We find a domesticated future for approximately 450 ponies from Dartmoor herds each year (that's more than half of the annual foal crop). All of which must be passported.
- The charity continues to resource genetic analysis of the pony herds on Dartmoor, working with members of the Dartmoor Hill Pony Association, Aberystwyth University, Neogen, Weatherbys Scientific and the Rare Breed Survival Trust, this genetic mapping is very important to ensure a payment for the Dartmoor Hill pony to compete with other grazing animals for a place to stand on Dartmoor as valued.
- In discussion with Natural England on low grazing numbers as part of HLS agreements and what this means to DHP numbers.

It is therefore our role in the Friends of the Dartmoor Hill Pony to continue to work closely with DEFRA Equine ID regarding the identification and passporting of ponies sold at that agricultural sale and the impact of changes in regulation.

In these roles and projects, we work closely with other areas which common pony herds – particularly the New Forest – and other DEFRA departments such as the FSA, the VMD, AHVLA and Trading Standards.

This charity undertakes numerous projects which support members of the Dartmoor Hill Pony Association to ensure that they can continue keeping a pony herd. This includes year-round Sales, Taming ponies to be a domesticated pet, getting colts castrated so that they can become a domesticated gelding, promoting and marketing all of Dartmoor's pony herds.

The charity has worked very hard to achieve its aims and seems to be on track with supporting the pony keeper to ensure the ponies will be found on Dartmoor for generations to come. Our work supporting the ponies that have to leave Dartmoor and find a future elsewhere has also gone very well in the past year with our taming training and gelding of ponies to add value.

Our Lobbying supporting the Dartmoor Hill Pony Association to get the Dartmoor Hill Pony recognised for its true value has taken great leaps forward with

The Dartmoor Hill Pony being recognised by Defra as one distinct type of equine

The Dartmoor Hill Pony Association is recognised by Defra as the Breeders' Association.

Then Friends support of The Dartmoor Hill Pony Association in building its Register of Dartmoor Hill Ponies on the commons of Dartmoor - two thirds have already been registered, microchipped and hair pulled for genetic testing. We hope to complete the task at Drift 2024.

Defra has announced that in ELM, Ponies will be included in the grazing supplement, which now known as the Cattle and Pony Supplement.

Recognised internationally as one of only a handful of equines with no 'improvement' by adding Arab blood (findings published in the internationally respected Natural journal). The Dartmoor Hill Pony is recognised as a genetically archetypically British Pony, as published in the internationally respected Science Journal: this research has been awarded the prestigious AAAS Award.

Defra now recognises Native Semi-wild equally to Native Breed.

The Dartmoor Hill Pony has been added to the 'At Risk' list. Recent ELM scheme design announcements confirm that At Risk payments will be payable on Dartmoor commons.

Overall the charity has achieved everything and more it planned for the past year and those who support us by giving of their time and money cannot be thanked enough.


