The principal activity of the E.Y.E charity in the year under review was workshops for the unemployed 18 year old plus group supported by fundraising in collaboration with other organisations and groups.

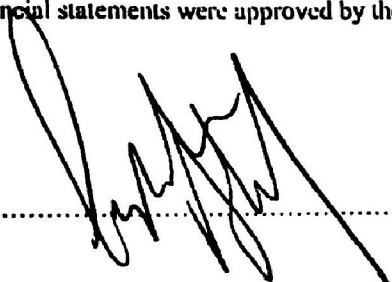

TRUSTEE'S REPORT AUGUST 2022-23

Brief Summary

2022-2023 the most difficult year so far for the charity. With very little funding from funders the charity had to rely mostly on self-generated funding. With many funders focusing their efforts on global issues such as the Ukraine War and the fact of the cost of living crisis, it is understandable to see that there has been a greater demand for support putting pressure on funders who have the difficult decision of directing funding to projects that best suit their criteria. This has resulted in the charity needing to learn, improve and adapt to the needs of their target audience.

Although the year has been challenging for EYE, the charity has still managed to deliver support to the best of its ability, whether through partnership work or through current and new in house projects.

Second-Hand Furniture Store

In-House Project

In line with EYE's environmental policy the charity has continued to deliver recycling/ up-cycling program where used furniture which had been destined for landfill is refurbish.

- Although EYE has not received support this year for this project, the charity has continued this work at a much smaller scale working with local organisation who sign post and direct learners to the charity.

Free Meals Projects

Working with Shri Guru Ravidass Gurdwara Luton the charity supported this project to distribute around 21000 hot meals to support faith & community organisations around county.

In-House Project

EYE's on going in -house workshops on Basic IT,, Budgeting your finances, Social Media, Exploring Self-employment, Personal Development, 3D printing, CV writing and interviewing courses. The project(s) aim to engage with the unemployed that are facing multiple deprivations because of their age, ethnicity, gender and economic situation. To encourage the idea of being self-employed enterprise is the key focus of many of these workshops.

Uncle Vees

Following on from success of the Free Meals Project with the Shri Guru Ravidass Gurdwara Luton. EYE has decided to set up it's own project to help sustain the charity and the same time provide provisions to support local community through food preparation workshops and free meals to those from low income families. The charity has setup an arm called Uncle Vees with an aim of providing healthy vegan meals which can be enjoyed by everyone. So far EYE has received grants from the following organisations:-

**REPORT OF THE ACCOUNTANTS TO THE TRUSTEES OF
ENTERPRISING YOUTH EDUCATION**

I am reporting on the accounts for the charity for the year ended 31st August 2023.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

As the charity's trustee you are responsible for the preparation of the accounts, you consider that the audit requirement of Section 144(2) of the Charities Act 2011 (the Act) does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts under section 145 of the Act to follow the procedures specified in the General Directions given by the Charity Commissioners under section 145(b) of the 2011 Act, and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of Examiner's report

My examination was carried out in accordance with the General directions given by the Charity Commissioners. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeking explanations from you as trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.

Independent Examiner's Statement

In connection with my examination, no matter has come to my attention:

1. which gives me reasonable cause to believe that in any material respect the requirements have not been met, or
2. to which, in my opinion, attentions should be drawn in order to enable a proper understanding of the accounts to be reached.



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
