Ministers' Report for the year 2024

I think that we can all agree that the year 2024 seemed to pass very quickly. Whether it was because we didn't have a nice long Spring, or a long dry sunny summer before the first lot of snow came in November. You will remember that it lasted just one day.

As you will read in the reports, we all engaged in our usual activities and special events, including our regular coffee mornings at which we raise fund for mainly Baptist organisations. And as you will see from the information given to us from our Treasurer, the amounts raised are substantial. But how many of us look beyond the name of the organisations and the amount raised and know what they do with the money?

As most of you know, Pudsey Baptist has always supported, 'Baptist Home Mission' (it used to be called Baptist Sustentation Fund) and Baptist World Mission' (it used to be called Baptist Missionary Society), and whereas the Baptist Union asks each church congregation to contribute a per capita subscription to both funds, we at Pudsey raise above the amount requested through our coffee morning with Cake sales and personal donations. Thereby helping those who administer the Home Mission Fund to help churches who can't afford a minister to have ministerial oversight, and/or help churches who have limited funds to hold outreach activities in their local communities. Plus helping to fund our Association and Union staff. Similarly, the monies we raise for BWM are used to train our missionaries who take the gospel to countries all over the world. To date there are over 300 missionaries in God's service. Many of our missionaries have everyday jobs in secular situations where their work and actions witness to Jesus, some are ministers, and teachers in Bible colleges, most are in the caring professions—doctors, nurses, first responders, health educators and the like. Some of us help to support the 'Medic's through the BMS Birthday Scheme.

Then there is Operation Agri (it used to be part of Baptist Men's Movement alongside Tools with a Mission) who are a different breed of missionaries as they are mainly agriculturist who teach women, men and young people how to tend the land and build irrigation systems so that they can grow crops and fruit to sustain their families and sell surplus to provide education for children. And, they teach animal husbandry too so that whole communities can share in the produce. And, they teach building skills, and other life skills to help families to become self-sufficient. Operation Agri isn't an organisation that gives handouts—it gives a hand up to those they serve as they tell all people about Jesus.

Spurgeon's Youth and Child Care is based in the UK and this organization's primary task is to care for children and young people who find themselves in homeless situations, be it temporary because of a family upset, or longer term because of physical harm or abuse. They work alongside local social services and police but stay in contact with the youngsters longer to ensure that they are cared for and receive opportunities to live loved and valued lives, be it with foster carers or in assisted living accommodation.

We support two local organisations too: REACH Project and Zephaniah Trust. Within the AGM handbook is Revd. Ernie Whalley's report on the REACH project and I was very pleased to be able to attend one of the baptismal services last year. Though John Froud has been a visitor to lead worship for us over the years and to play at our BBQ, Zephaniah Trust (which he founded 31 years ago) is a team of enthusiastic Christians that takes the gospel of Jesus into schools (mainly primary but some senior schools) in and around West Yorkshire. They lead Christian assemblies; teach RE, hold holiday clubs, and tell Bible stories that captivate the imagination of the youngest of listeners. John is also a singer/songwriter in his own right and together with his daughter, Cath they record their music and give concerts.

So, whilst our biggest celebration in 2024 was the baptism of Gareth, Rani and Krissy in our flat-pack baptistry that took an age to fill, we can celebrate the fact that each one of us has helped to provide the wherewithal for the gospel of Jesus Christ our Saviour to be made known in our town and beyond. So, thank you for your support of me and of the organisations mentioned here. Blessings,

Minister's Report

My first task as I write my summary of the past twelve months is to say thank you to all who have worked so hard to maintain our witness to Jesus Christ our Saviour within and without of our building situated at the bottom corner of the carpark. Without your commitment to worship each Sunday and to the roles many have undertaken my role as pastor would have been harder.

Within these pages are very comprehensive reports of the various services and activities we all participated in during the past year, so I'm not going to pre-empt what is written but mention some other significant but less noticeable activities....

You will not be surprised to know that I often receive emails and phone calls from people who are not part of our congregation but have come across our threshold to coffee mornings and jigsaw swaps; I am told time and again that we make the best coffee in town, (thanks Carol!) and we give everyone a warm welcome and remembering their names. A sure sign of acceptance. So thank you for your part in making people welcome.

You will have noticed too that during our intercessions, each Sunday we pray for people we don't know at all. Our coffee morning customers often add a prayer card to our Prayer Tree for members of their families and friends. This is another way we can serve our community and bring the needs of those who probably don't know God into his presence. I sometimes surprise some of our coffee morning friends with flowers from our communion table when I've learnt about their situations. Flowers are always gratefully received. I've been thinking about taking at least one bunch a week to our neighbours during the coming year. We did this about 10 years ago, perhaps it is time to do it again.

You may have also noticed that our small choir has not featured at festival times, as in the past. There are now less than a handful of us including Vivien, each of us has less time to rehearse. But, who knows, we may just meet, find a suitable piece of music so that we can sing at one of the festivals this year.

As usual I have spent most of my time reading in preparation of our weekly reflections. And though I didn't get many books at Christmas 2022 I did buy a number during the year that were resources for the series on The Epistles of John; Minor Prophets and the Apostle Paul's letter to the Galatians. I've said many times, I love reading and whilst I often turn to the lectionary in Baptist Patterns and Prayers for festivals and a good half of the year, reading for a particular series brings me much pleasure. That being said, I did put fingers to the keyboard to rewrite some of the Lent Study on Spirituality (that I first penned in 2018) for Lent 2023 and researched and wrote our Advent Study 2023 on the more interesting books of the Apocrypha.

I am always delighted when my friends lead our worship, in particular Revd. Ernie Whalley. He has always been an inspiration and still is. He alongside my Spiritual Director, Sr Pat, and my home church minister, Richard Lewis keep me on an even keel. I exchange emails with Ernie from time to time and chat with Richard on the phone. Sr Pat has moved from The Briery in Ilkley to a convent for older less mobile nuns in Lytham in Lancashire. I still visit her every six weeks. Since her move there I now have to give account for my days off. That task is harder to keep, because stuff encroaches on some Fridays. I do, do my best to keep an afternoon free of all church work so as to give my cat some attention. Barney has been sitting on my knee in recent days with his back to me, displaying his displeasure of being neglected. My Texas friend Paul played for us too allowing Vivien to sit in the congregation, though where to sit caused her consternation, as she doesn't always get the opportunity to do so. Another friend, Martin Butterworth was our guest speaker at our Harvest. I visited Martin and his wife Katrina in Nepal in 2004 when they were BMS missionaries there.

Although Churches together in Pudsey has had a very lean year, some of the ministers from the churches in our town have come together to pray. From those meetings there is hope that CTiP will be active again during 2024.

Again, thanks to you all for your prayers and generous support over the past year. May our God continue to bless each of us as we all live to love as he does and look to him to guard, guide, protect

and encourage us to be the people he would have us be. This is my prayer for you all. Every blessing.

Minister's Report for the year 2021

On the day we hold our AGM one year of Covid regulations will have passed. During that period of 12 months I prepared and delivered Worship@home Services to everyone in our congregation, plus a few extras. You will remember that on Sunday 22 March 2020 we covenanted together to worship in our homes at 10.30 each Sunday until we could return to worship in church. The 'Worship@home service' has also been uploaded on to our website so that anyone can participate, should they wish to do so. Restrictions meant that all our plans for Easter 2020 did not come to fruition. Instead I delivered a supply of fresh and chocolate eggs to everyone on the Wednesday of Holy Week. I opened the garden for Good Friday prayer and reflection and thereafter opened the church for 'Personal Prayer' on Mondays and Fridays. I also served 'do it yourself' communion to those who wished to take it. As most of our visitors were from the Anglican church, they were pleased that the Eucharist was available to them. After a time, I closed the Friday session as no one turned up.

We did return to worship in church for a brief period. We were very pleased that we could celebrate Vivien's 80th birthday on the 19 July with a service followed by a buffet lunch in the garden on a hot day. Paul Bright my friend from Dallas, Texas played the keyboard giving Vivien a day off. We were able to hold services and our Saturday Coffee Mornings over the summer/Autumn months, but then came the second lockdown and everything stopped again. We held Remembrance Sunday in our homes with worship services in church returning in December so that we could celebrate Christmas in church obeying the rules. Then, even though we had extra heat from the newly acquired oil-filled radiators, we decided that it was too cold with doors open so we went back to everyone 'worshipping at home'.

Throughout the year we managed to hold the required number of Church and Congregations meetings to meet the Charity Commissions rules and our Deacon's meetings too.

With the help of Stephen Miller, the Messenger was prepared and delivered each month. Thanks to all contributors. Although I didn't deliver to every one each week, I have telephoned those to whom Stephen delivered the services and the Messenger to those near to him or when he was out on his daily exercise. I baked a few times to cheer people up, and some people baked for me too. I'm grateful for the sustenance including Jean and a weekly supply of peanut brittle bars from Seau Yen and fruit scones from Rosemary T. (if the Postman arrived before me then he got the scone!) The Deacons also have a Pastoral List so that they too could keep in contact with everyone. A shared task is always best. Thank you

We did pray for God's protection at the beginning of the pandemic and I am convinced that as we have honoured God he has honoured us and kept us safe. During the year we recorded the death of Ronnie Limeburn in November and Arthur Bartlam in January 2021. Two men whose wives (Margaret and Mary) were longstanding members of our community.

As always I have spent a long time preparing for Sunday worship: we began the year reflecting on 'God's Promise', we then studied Colossians and then Romans. Due to Covid restrictions we were unable to receive visiting preachers, but Vivien and Rosemary did lead worship and I read a service prepared for us by Revd. Ernie Whalley. In December the Christmas Nativity and lights attracted a huge amount of attention and we did indeed display the real reason for the season.

It has been an odd year, busy but not with the usual stuff. I'm just thankful that we are able to meet in church and some day soon we will be able to welcome back all our Coffee Morning Friends. Till then, let's keep our eyes fixed on Jesus who has promised never to leave us. Thank you for your prayers and support.
