- Our work amongst the children with Challengers still remains 'furloughed' due to not enough workers to cover the meetings under our current safeguarding guidelines;
- the Ladies Meetings ran throughout the year;
- we were able to hold our Harvest service in the church building and our Christmas Eve gathering in the village Hall - both were very well attended;
- Sunday School continued to operate during the morning meetings;
- guest preachers and missionary organisations able to join us;
- we had fellowship with other churches;
- we continued to support Missionary organisations such as Asia Link, EMF;
- we are supporting two children in Uganda through the Just Care charity
- the pastor has been fully involved in the life of the village school
- we have completed our three-year support of Francis who is training for the ministry in Kenya
- we supported the Bibles for Children organisation

God in his mercy has left us with enough for another year. The reality is, our **God** has, and **shall, supply all** our needs **according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus** (Philippians 4:19).

We all know that money is not at the heart of who we are because as Solomon declares, **whoever loves money never has enough** (Ecclesiastes 5:10).

Nevertheless, we are mindful to use the monies we have for the extension of God's work in Cosheston and beyond. We are not foolish nor reckless with the money God gives so we must continue to be wise in how we put to good use the finances God has laid before us.

Our monies must fall behind our aims as a registered charity:

- a) to advance the Christian Faith in accordance with the Statement of Faith in such ways and in such parts of the United Kingdom or the world as the Trustees from time to time may think fit;
- b) relieve sickness and financial hardship and preserve good health by the provision of funds, goods or services of any kind, including through the

- provision of counselling and support in such parts of the United Kingdom or the world as the Trustees from time to time may think fit and
- c) advance education in such ways and in such parts of the United Kingdom or the world as the Trustees from time to time may think fit

At the moment the church only has one paid worker, the Pastor, Mr N Gilbert. Rev. N Gilbert is also a Trustee.

By the grace of God, the church has carried on. God is good. 2 Timothy 2:9 reminds us that **the word of God is not chained**. Over the year we have maintained the preaching of the word and certain aspects of outreach, such as the Ladies Meetings. Throughout the year we have also focused on understanding who God wants to lead the church forward.

Here are some financial facts to think about:

- missionary support came to £2,525.01, which amounted to 10% of the church's expenditure
- our water and electricity bills have increased
- our expenditure on the Village Hall amounted to £16
- we now pay HMRC by Bank Transfer, along with any visiting preachers or missionaries
- the Pastors pay is still on Direct Debit for the 6th of each month
- we decided not to change our Public Liability and Building Insurance brokers who charged £676.27.24 this year (£27.82 more than 2022)
- Pastor's expenses in averaged out at £210.27pm for the first 4 months of the year and then he took over his own expenses from May 2023
- we spent £145 on our annual fee for our DBS Certificates through 'Thirtyone:eight'
- our annual Stewardship offering amounted to £21,016.23, up from £20,593.49 in 2022
- we had a one-off donation of £7,400 which, in conjunction with the decrease in our Pastors salary, greatly inflated our figures
- We have put together a table showing our income/expenditure from the end of December 2022 through to end of December 2023

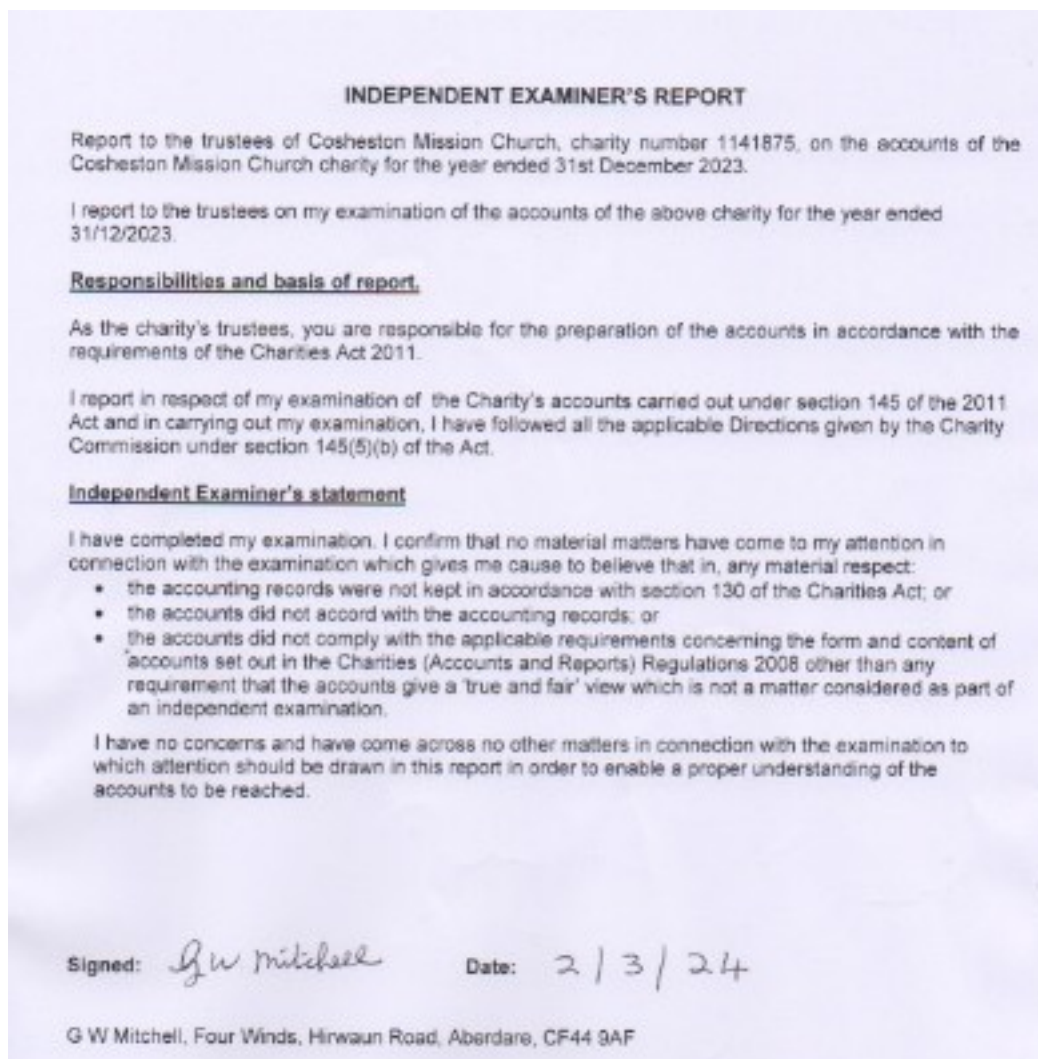

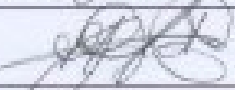

Sunday School was back in action; guest preachers and missionary organisations able to join us.

The Pastor has been paid every month, work has been carried out on the church, upgrades have been made to the outside of the building, missionary contributions have gone out and God in his mercy has left us with enough for another year. The reality is, our **God** has, and **shall, supply all** our needs **according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus** (Philippians 4:19).

We all know that money is not at the heart of who we are because as Solomon declares, **whoever loves money never has enough** (Ecclesiastes 5:10). Nevertheless, we are mindful to use the monies we have for the extension of God's work in Cosheston and beyond. We are not foolish nor reckless with the money God gives so we must continue to be wise in how we put to good use the finances God has laid before us.

Our monies must fall behind our aims as a registered charity:

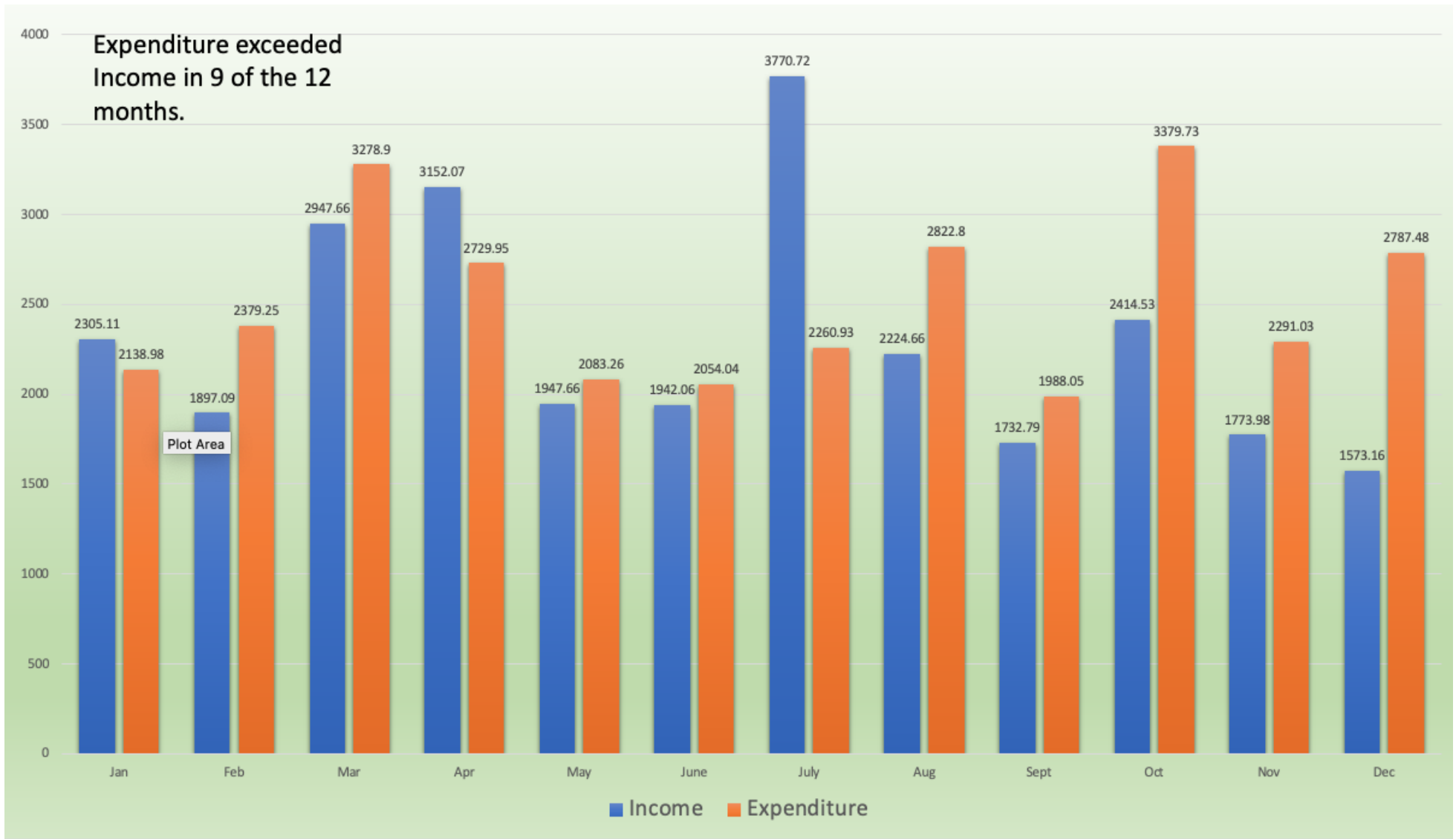

- missionary support came to £3121.80, which amounted to 11.3% of the church's expenditure
- our water and electricity bills are all now paid by Direct debit
- our expenditure on the Village Hall amounted to £0
- we now pay HMRC (Tax man) by Bank Transfer, along with any visiting preachers or missionaries
- the Pastors pay is still on Direct Debit for the 6th of each month
- we decided not to change our Public Liability and Building Insurance brokers who charge £644.45 this year (£70.78 more than 2021)
- we have minimised the use of cheques to pay bills/individuals and we are making full use of the Bank Transfer system. We now have online access to the accounts 24/7
- Pastor's expenses in averaged out at £164 pm
- we spent £986 on repainting the outside of the building
- we spent £254.75 setting up DBS Certificates through 'Thirtyone:eight' for all those who required them.
- our annual Stewardship offering amounted to £20,593.49 down from £21,032.29 in 2021
- We have put together a table showing our income/expenditure from the end of December 2021 through to end of December 2022

Last year remained a challenging one. Covid restrictions once again placed limitations on our ability to meet and worship together. Our work amongst the children with Challengers was 'furloughed'; the Ladies meetings were postponed; Harvest and Christmas gatherings like many Sunday meetings replaced by online services; Sunday School put on hold; guest preachers and missionary organisations unable to join us and any outreach was greatly affected by the guidelines placed upon us as a church because of Covid.

Despite these restrictions, which have had an impact on income, the Pastor has been paid every month, work has been carried out on the church, upgrades have been made to the building, missionary contributions have gone out and God in his mercy has left us with enough for another year. The reality is, our **God** has, and **shall, supply all** our needs **according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus** (Philippians 4:19).

We all know that money is not at the heart of who we are because as Solomon declares, **whoever loves money never has enough** (Ecclesiastes 5:10). Nevertheless, we are mindful to use the monies we have for the extension of God's work in Cosheton and beyond. We are not foolish nor reckless with the money God gives so we must continue to be wise in how we put to good use the finances God has laid before us.

Our monies must fall behind our aims as a registered charity:

As we have already been made aware, 2021 was another difficult year. However, the church has carried on. God is good. 2 Timothy 2:9 reminds us that **the word of God is not chained**. We have found the ways and means to maintain services to proclaim the word of God to our people and to those who listen on the edge of faith.

Here are some financial facts to think about:

- missionary support came to £2,750, which amounted to 9% of the church's expenditure
- our water and electricity bills are all now paid by Direct debit
- our expenditure on the Village Hall amounted to £204 and a further £96 which was a cashed cheque carried over from the previous year
- we now pay HMRC (Tax man) by Bank Transfer, along with any visiting preachers or missionaries
- the Pastors pay is still on Direct Debit for the 6th of each month
- we decided not to change our Public Liability and Building Insurance brokers who charge £573.67 this year (£40.86 more than 2020)
- we have minimised the use of cheques to pay bills/individuals and we are making full use of the Bank Transfer system. We now have online access to the accounts 24/7
- Pastor's expenses in February were larger than normal due to the purchasing of electrical equipment for our new IT infrastructure
- we spent £1,500 on new windows in the back room and office
- we spent £1,269.36 on TV's and cabling to support work in the main hall and transmission of meetings to the rear hall
- our annual Stewardship offering amounted to £21,032.29 up from £17,532.52 in 2020
- We have put together a table showing our income/expenditure from the end of December 2020 through to end of December 2021
