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The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2023. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

## OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

### Objectives and aims

The charity's objectives are as follows:

1. To Help people of all ages from deprived areas by providing sporting programmes, in particular football, which include physical, educational, lifestyle, health and other activities.
2. Enabling people to develop their skills, awareness and capabilities to help them participate as healthy, independent, mature and responsible individuals.
3. To work with children from schools, particularly those within deprived areas, through contact with Bath City Football Club and its players.

In order to support these objectives the Charity runs a range of football related programmes within schools and the community that are available to all regardless of age, race, disability or gender. Incorporated within these programmes is coaching designed to encourage and accelerate the development of all those participating in the programmes. Bath City Football Club is a community club and the Foundation aims to work in close partnership with the club to maximise the benefits for both parties and the community and schools.

### Public benefit

We have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing our aims and objectives and in planning our future activities.

## ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

### Achievements and performance

This has been an exciting year for the Foundation that has seen the reach and impact of our work expand considerably. Our programmes are now organised into five themes covering Health and Wellbeing, Inclusion, Schools, Women and Girls and Premier League Primary Stars with a dedicated member of staff and funding allocated to each theme. With support from Quartet Community Foundation we produced our first impact report which evidenced our work supporting over 2,000 residents across BaNES each year.

Thanks to funding from the Clothworkers Foundation we have been able to refurbish the skittle alley at Twerton Park to establish a proper office for the charity which also provided a new community space for use by the club's media team and volunteers. We also strengthened our relationship with Bath City FC through a supporters vs Foundation charity match and working closely with the Community Director throughout the year on joint projects.

A major highlight this year was the launch of our Women and Girls programme in September 2022 which was made possible thanks to £15k of funding from the Medlock Charitable Trust. This has widened our reach considerably with our Wildcats, Squadgirls and adult women only sessions all proving popular with a new audience.

Our Primary Stars programme was once again awarded £15k by the Primary League Charitable Trust to continue our work in 8 primary and secondary schools around Twerton, Whiteway and the wider Bath area. The programme aims to create positive and lasting sporting, health and education outcomes for children, young people and the wider community and we will look to expand this next year.

Health and wellbeing was identified as a key area for us to develop this year and alongside existing partnerships with Man vs Fat, our regular walking football sessions we have been to generate new funding for a project called Fit & Fine that will launch next year.

We have also continued our successful Inclusion work with Bath Mind, SWALLOW, Young Bristol, and summer holiday sessions with Bath Area Play Project. We have also developed new partnerships with Bath Recreation, Livewest and Wesport that we will look to expand on in the next year.

Thanks to funding from Bath Spa University and Quartet Community Foundation we have been able to employ a Communications Coordinator for the first time which has seen a dramatic increase in the reach of our communications and marketing efforts, particularly on social media. Thanks to funding from Bath Rotary Club we have also been able to move to an electronic platform to handle session bookings which has made a significant impact in terms of freeing up our Operations Manager time. Care and attention has been spent on financial planning this year to ensure the long term security of the Foundation and improve our evidence gathering ability for funders and supporters.

In November we employed James Carlin BEM as our part time CEO with Geoff Stevens moving to a full time Operations Manager role. In January 2023 key staff were offered full and part time contracts for the first time which has resulted in a more settled staff team with work focused on the five key areas mentioned above.

Our Reconnecting Twerton project has developed considerably this year culminating in a premier of their "Tickets Please" film held in front of 100 people at Bath City FC which was run in partnership with BEMSCA, Bath Spa University, Age UK Banes and other stakeholders. Additional funding was secured for 2023 courtesy of GWR and the National Lottery with the group making a second film covering the theme of away days with trips to local football clubs such as Swindon Town and Cardiff City.

#### FINANCIAL REVIEW

The net incoming funds for the period were £13,293 (2022 - £1,147 deficit). The Trustees are grateful for the kind donations from our funders.

The Charity's reserves are sufficient to cover three months' operating costs.

The accounts comply with current statutory requirements, the charity's governing document and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice for Charities (SORP) applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) (effective 1 January 2015).

#### FUTURE PLANS

Our plans for the year ahead include:

Supporting more women and girls to play football by increasing the number of sessions we run.

Working closer in partnership with Bath Recreation Trust to support a joined up approach to sports provision in BaNES.

Working with the Public Health department at BaNES to support their focus on increasing physical activity in the area.

Enhancing our after school programme so that all pupils are able to access football regardless of their background

Working with Threeways School to run sessions to support children with a wide range of Special Educational Needs.

Increasing the general awareness of our work within the BaNES area.

Improving our marketing and communications to ensure that our support is well advertised and integrated with Bath City FC.

Building our team to employ a Health & Wellbeing Officer to support our Inclusion and Wellbeing work.

Improving the sustainability of the charity in the longer term by continuing to access new funding and partnership opportunities.

Enhancing the support we offer our Reconnecting Twerton group to include digital skills training and connections with other 3rd sector organisations in BaNES

Exploring partnership opportunities with Bath Spa University and the University of Bath

#### STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

##### Governing document

The organisation is a charitable company limited by guarantee, incorporated on 19th July 2011 and registered as a charity on 3rd August 2011. The company was established under a Memorandum of Association which established the objects and powers of the charitable company and is governed under its Articles of Association. In the event of the company being wound up members are required to contribute and amount not exceeding £1.

#### STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

##### Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

Four trustees were appointed during the year and additional trustees will be appointed in the future to provide skills and expertise on new projects as they occur.

##### Organisational structure

The charity operates solely through meetings of the Trustees. All decisions are taken by the Trustees. Responsibility for financial management is delegated to the Chair who draws on the support of other Trustees as necessary. Activities of the Trust are overseen by the Chair.

During the year formal meetings of the Trustees were held.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Fixtures and fittings	- 20% on reducing balance
Equipment	- 25% on reducing balance

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Funds

Restricted funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by the donor and all such funds are shown separately in the notes to the financial statements.

Unrestricted income funds comprise those funds which the trustees are free to use for any purpose in the furtherance of charitable objectives.
