The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2024. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The charity's objects are:

- (i) To advance the education of the pupils at Pardes House Primary School by providing and assisting in the provision of facilities - not required by statute - for education at the school.
- (ii) To promote for the benefit of the pupils of Pardes House Primary School and others the provision of facilities for recreation or other leisure time occupation of young people who have need of such facilities by reason of their youth, age infirmity or disablement, financial hardship or social economic circumstances or for the public at large in the interests of social welfare and with the object of improving the condition of life of such persons.
- (iii) The promotion of any other exclusively charitable objects and purposes such as the trustees see fit, provided that they are regarded as charitable by the law of England and Wales.

Public benefit

The Trustees confirm that they have had due regard to the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit in reviewing the charity's aims and objectives and in planning its activities for the year.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

The PTA organised a range of events throughout the year for the children of Pardes House Primary School, all of which were well attended and positively received.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Financial position

During the year, the PTA received total donations of £53,762 (2023: £35,054), primarily from parents. The charity spent £51,735 on events for the children (2023: £32,140) and incurred £420 in governance costs (2023: £420), bringing total expenditure to £52,155 (2023: £32,560).

This resulted in a net surplus of £1,607 for the year (2023: £2,494). Total unrestricted funds carried forward at the balance sheet date were £4,838 (2023: £3,231), reflecting a continued improvement in the charity's financial position.

FUTURE PLANS

The trustees intend to continue organising events for the children of Pardes House Primary School in the year ahead.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

Expenditure

Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Taxation

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.
