

Neighbourhood

EPCs was the central driver in the creation of the Trinity Rooms Community Hub (TRCH), through which many partnerships have been developed and projects embarked upon. This partnership of local organisations (see <https://stroudtrinityrooms.org/>) is working on projects to benefit the local community, such as:

Local Food story: Cultivating a local network of Stroud town community hubs and

with the partnership of the Stroud farmers market making fresh local produce

available to those who can't afford it. The project has been very successful and presents a model of good practice for neighbouring and other towns.

The Base: Creating a Base for local environmental organisations facilitating information exchange and developing new partnerships and ways of working together.

Other Community Activities: Providing a space for connection, training, dance, celebration, grieving and other community activities. Developing an appropriate organisational structure to successfully run the TRCH.

A lot of work has gone into creating an independent vehicle that will ensure the hub is always used to serve the community as well as to raise funds for the renovation of the building so that it can house more activities such as cooking and food preparation workshops, health and wellbeing related services and more.

Town

Continuing the work initiated in 2019 as part of the Earth Protector Town pilot programme in Stroud, EPCs has been working in partnership with Stroud Town Council, Transition Stroud, Stroud Valleys Project, Stroud Nature and Landwise organisations to develop a core networking group - Stroud Town Community Action Network for Climate and Nature (STCAN).

Within this context we have been working to develop STCAN into a centre for promotion of local partnerships and projects and community engagement. So far this has led to the creation of issue specific task groups, inviting other organisations to cooperate on new and

	<p>existing projects to address the following areas:</p> <p>Nature & conservation: Protection of local ecosystems, education/awareness raising, Biodiversity</p> <p>Materials & waste: Repair, reuse, recycling, cyclical economy, waste swapping</p> <p>Energy & Transport: Solar panel schemes, training, cycle and other local distribution, car shares</p> <p>Local food: Grow your own support, seed bank, tool share, integrating local producers</p> <p>Communications: Public engagement and information sharing</p> <p>The project is ongoing and STCAN is evolving to find its place in the local scene of things.</p> <p>National/Wider</p> <p>EPCs has developed a theoretical model of an Earth Protector Town, stressing the need for a change in the legal environment to stop ongoing ecocide as well as the need for working together for regenerative community development.</p> <p>We are now working on a simplified EPT framework which can then be rolled out to other towns.
