Education - To provide free education to the local poor and needy children after school.

Healthcare – To manage the health centre on site.

To provide a quality life and education to those less privileged but equally valuable in our community. We hope to make them feel safe and positive in their environment, allowing them to develop and progress in all spheres of life.

- To provide free education, clothing, accommodation, food, healthcare and life skills to young orphan girls.
- To give vulnerable children the opportunities to reach their full potential in contributing to the world we live and interact in.
- To help local poor and needy families in the community and provide them with basic needs like food and access to clean water.

1 Basis of Preparation

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and comply with financial reporting standards of the Accounting Standards Board, The Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 and the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by charities 2005. The charity has taken advantage of the exemption in FRS 1 from the requirement to produce a cash flow statement because it is a small company.

Incoming Resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Resources Expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources. Grants offered subject to conditions which have not been met at the year-end date are noted as a commitment but not accrued as expenditure.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund Accounting

Unrestricted funds are donations and other incoming resources receivable or granted for the objects of the charity without further specified purpose and are as available as general funds.

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objectives of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.
