(2) THE SECOND OBJECT OF THE CHARITY IS TO APPLY MONIES, INsofar AS THEY ARE IN THE OPINION OF THE TRUSTEES SURPLUS TO THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE PRIMARY OBJECTIVE, TO OTHER CHARITABLE PURPOSES FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE INHABITANTS OF THE AREA OF BENEFIT. (3) THE THIRD OBJECT OF THE CHARITY IS, IF AND IN SO FAR AS THE INCOME OF THE CHARITY CANNOT BE APPLIED TOWARDS THE OBJECTS SPECIFIED IN SUB-CLAUSES (1) AND (2) ABOVE, THE TRUSTEES MAY APPLY IT IN THE MAINTENANCE AND UPKEEP OF THE ALMSHOUSES. 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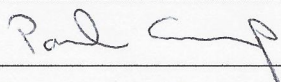
