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# REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2024

The trustees of Dabbagh Welfare Trust present their report along with the charity's financial statements for the year ending 31 March 2024. These statements have been prepared in accordance with the Charities Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) and the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK (FRS 102), effective from 1 January 2019.

## OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

### Purpose and Aims

Dabbagh Welfare Trust's charitable objectives, as defined in our governing document, include:

- Alleviating financial hardship and suffering among victims of natural or other disasters by providing funds or other forms of aid deemed suitable for individuals, communities, organisations, and countries in need, including medical assistance.
- Preventing or relieving poverty within the UK and globally through grants, goods, and services provided to individuals in need, as well as to other charities or organisations dedicated to poverty relief.

## SIGNIFICANT ACTIVITIES

We have provided essential support, including food, clean water, and medical supplies, to vulnerable individuals and communities in the UK, Yemen, Gaza, Syria, Turkey, Bangladesh, Afghanistan, Uganda, Sierra Leone, Morocco and Pakistan.

Our charity raises funds for these aims through public donation campaigns on platforms like Google and social media. These campaigns are inclusive and not directed towards any specific individual, organisation, or community, relying solely on voluntary donations from the public.

This report reflects our ongoing commitment to alleviate suffering and address the pressing needs of those most vulnerable.

## **Independent examiner's report to the Trustees of Dabbagh Welfare Trust**

I report on the Financial Statements of the Charity for the year ended 31 March 2024 which are set out on pages 6 to 13.

### **Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner**

The trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. ## Notes to the Accounts

### Note 1 Basis of preparation

These accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention with items recognised at cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant note(s) to these accounts.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with:

- the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) issued on 16 July 2014;
- the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102); and
- with the Charities Act 2011.

The charity constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS 102.

### Note 2 Accounting policies

#### 2.1 INCOME

<b>Recognition of income</b>	<p>These are included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SoFA) when:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• the charity becomes entitled to the resources;</li><li>• it is more likely than not that the trustees will receive the resources; and</li><li>• the monetary value can be measured with sufficient reliability.</li></ul>
<b>Grants and donations</b>	<p>Grants and donations are only included in the SoFA when the general income recognition criteria are met (5.10 to 5.12 FRS102 SORP).</p> <p>In the case of performance related grants, income must only be recognised to the extent that the charity has provided the specified goods or services as entitlement to the grant only occurs when the performance related conditions are met (5.16 FRS 102 SORP).</p>
<b>Tax reclaims on donations and gifts</b>	<p>Gift Aid receivable is included in income when there is a valid declaration from the donor. Any Gift Aid amount recovered on a donation is considered to be part of that gift and is treated as an addition to the same fund as the initial donation unless the donor or the terms of the appeal have specified otherwise.</p>
<b>Donated goods</b>	<p>Donated goods are measured at fair value (the amount for which the asset could be exchanged) unless impractical to do so.</p> <p>The cost of any stock of goods donated for distribution to beneficiaries is deemed to be the fair value of those gifts at the time of their receipt and they are recognised on receipt. In the reporting period in which the stocks are distributed, they are recognised as an expense at the carrying amount of the stocks at distribution.</p>

Donated goods for resale are measured at fair value on initial recognition, which is the expected proceeds from sale less the expected costs of sale, and recognised in 'Income from other trading activities' with the corresponding stock recognised in the balance sheet. On its sale the value of stock is charged against 'Income from other trading activities' and the proceeds from sale are also recognised as 'Income from other trading activities'.

Goods donated for on-going use by the charity are recognised as tangible fixed assets and included in the SoFA as incoming resources when receivable.

Gifts in kind for use by the charity are included in the SoFA as income from donations when receivable.

**Donated services and facilities** Donated services and facilities are included in the SOFA when received at the value of the gift to the charity provided the value of the gift can be measured reliably.

Donated services and facilities that are consumed immediately are recognised as income with an equivalent amount recognised as an expense under the appropriate heading in the SOFA.

**Support costs** The charity has incurred expenditure on support costs.

**Volunteer help** The value of any voluntary help received is not included in the accounts but is described in the trustees' annual report.

## 2.2 EXPENDITURE AND LIABILITIES

**Liability recognition** Liabilities are recognised where it is more likely than not that there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to pay out resources and the amount of the obligation can be measured with reasonable certainty.

**Governance and support costs** Support costs have been allocated between governance costs and other support. Governance costs comprise all costs involving public accountability of the charity and its compliance with regulation and good practice.

Support costs include central functions and have been allocated to activity cost categories on a basis consistent with the use of resources, e.g. allocating property costs by floor areas, or per capita, staff costs by the time spent and other costs by their usage.

**Deferred income** No material item of deferred income has been included in the accounts.

**Creditors** The charity has creditors which are measured at settlement amounts less any trade discounts

**Basic financial instruments** The charity accounts for basic financial instruments on initial recognition as per paragraph 10.7 FRS102 SORP. Subsequent measurement is as per paragraphs 11.17 to 11.19, FRS102 SORP.
